RICHMOND MUNICIPALITY.

HIS Excellency the Governor has directed the following report of the several matters and questions decided at meetings of the resident householders and of the landowners within the Municipal District of Richmond, held on the 21st and 22nd days of May last, to be published in accordance with the Act of Council 18 Victoria, No. 15, sec. 15.

Richmond, May 22, 1855.

SIR—

In compliance with the 15th section of the Act of Council, 18 Vict., No. 15, I have the honor to transmit a report of the several matters and questions decided at a meeting of the landholders and resident householders of Richmond, held in Stephen's Schoolhouse, at half after six o'clock, on Monday, the 21st instant, together with the list of the votes taken at a poll held on this day, in accordance with the provisions of the said Act.

In pursuance of His Excellency the Lieutenant Governor's appointment, notified in the *Gazette Extraordinary* of the 21st inst., I took the chair, and the meeting proceeded to elect Assessors. Several gentlemen were proposed, all of whom having withdrawn, with the exception of MR. MONTGOMERY MARTIN and MR. WM. BUST BURNLEY, these gentlemen were declared by me duly elected as Assessors.

MR. BURNLEY then declined to give me his assistance, and I proceeded with the remainder of the business without the benefit of his advice.

A motion was then made to adjourn the proceedings for nine months, which, as I thought it one which the meeting was not competent to entertain, I declined putting from the chair.

It was then proposed that the number of Councillors should be seven.

Upon which an amendment was moved that the number should be thirteen.

The amendment was put and lost, and the original motion carried.

It was then proposed that the Councillors should not be paid, which was carried.

The following candidates were then proposed for the office of Councillor:—

Messrs. Eneas McKenzie, Joseph Bosisto, Daniel Stothard Campbell, Richard Connebee, John Henderson, William Hull, Edward James Wilson, Septimus Martin, Joseph Masters, Charles Britten, Thomas Stephenson, Edward Daish, William Bust Burnley, Charles Joseph La Trobe, William Lonsdale, John Dane, William Francis Splatt, Frederick Gonnerman Dalgety, and the Right Honorable John Russell, commonly called Lord John Russell.

I adjourned the meeting until eight o'clock in the forenoon of this day, at the school-room aforesaid, in order that the votes should be taken by a poll, and decided that the mode of voting should be *visa voce*.

At the commencement of the poll a general protest against the proceedings was made by a resident householder, but as no grounds were stated, I declined to take any notice of it.

During the poll four women, resident householders and landowners, tendered their votes, which, under the provisions of the Act, I felt bound to receive, and they were recorded accordingly for the seven last candidates. As the point is raised for the first time, I think it right briefly to state the reasons for my decision:—

1. By the 15th section it is competent for any person claiming to be qualified to vote to object to another person tendering *his* vote before *he* has voted, on the ground that such a person was not a landholder or householder resident in the district. This seems to limit the objections which may be made to a voter to the want of qualification.

2. The words *his* and *he* do not exclude female voters, as by the Interpretation Act, 15 Vic., No. 1, it is enacted that in all Acts of Council in Victoria words importing the masculine be understood to include feminine.

3. By the 20th section of 18 Vic., No. 15, when making provision for future elections, it is enacted that *every male person of full age* who shall be liable to be rated, &c., shall be deemed a ratepayer for the purpose of such election—thus making it appear that if it had been intended by the framer of this Act to exclude females, it would have been done by express words or necessary inference, as it is in the section last quoted; and as this is not done, the conclusion is that in this part of the proceeding women are entitled to vote.
