GOLD FIELDS LOCAL COURTS DISTRICTS.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR CHARLES HOOTHAM, Knight
Commander of the Most Honorable Military
Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-
in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-
Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Governor and
Legislative Council of the Colony of Victoria,
passed in the eighteenth year of the Reign of Her
present Majesty, intituled, "*An Act to amend the
Laws relating to the Gold Fields*," it was amongst
other things enacted that it should be lawful for the
Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council,
by Proclamation, from time to time, to declare any
Gold Field to be a district for the purpose of forming
a Local Court, with the powers and authoritise
thereinafter described, and to declare the name of
such district, and define the limits thereof; and
after the publication of any such Proclamation, the
locality so described should be and become a district
for the purposes of the said Act: Now therefore I,
the Governor of the said Colony, do by this my Procla-
mation, in pursuance of the provisions of the said
Act, with the advice of the Executive Council, de-
clare that the several districts hereinafter described
and named shall be Districts for the purpose of
forming Local Courts within the meaning of the
said Act: that is to say—

DISTRICT OF BALLAARAT.—Commencing at a point
on the northern shores of Lake Boloke; thence by a
line bearing north to the range dividing the waters
of the River Hopkins and the Fiery Creek; thence
by that range to the Great Dividing Range; thence
by the Great Dividing Range to the source of the
Mount Greenock Creek; thence by the Mount
Greenock Creek northerly to its junction with the Dry
Creek; thence by a line bearing east to the junction
of the Tullaroop and Bullarook Creeks; thence by
the Bullarook Creek to its source in the Great
Dividing Range; thence by the Great Dividing Range
to the most eastern source of the River Moorabool;
thence southward by the main range dividing the
waters of the Rivers Moorabool and Werribee to a
point due east from the junction of the Woody
Yaloak Creek with the Narringhil Creek; thence
west by that line to the said junction; thence by a

line north-westerly to the southern shores of Lake
Boloke; and thence by the eastern and northern
shores of that lake to commencing point. And the
said District shall be called "The Local Court Dis-
trict of Ballaarat."

DISTRICT OF AVOCA.—Commencing at the source
of Mount Greenock Creek, on the Great Dividing
Range; thence by that creek northwards to the
southern boundary of the Parish of Carisbrook;
thence by the southern, eastern, and northern
boundary lines of the said parish, and the Deep
Creek to the River Loddon; thence by the River
Loddon to the Parish of Tarnagulla; thence by the
southern, eastern, and northern boundary lines of
the Parish of Tarnagulla, and the said River Loddon
to a point twelve miles above its junction with Ser-
pentine Creek; thence by a line bearing west to the
River Avon, crossing the River Avoca; thence by
the River Avon southwards to the River Richardson;
thence by the River Richardson southwards to that
point where its two main branches unite; thence by
a line south-westerly, crossing the River Wimmera,
to Briggs' Bluff on the Grampians; thence by the
Grampians and the Serra Range to Mount Abrupt;
thence by the northern boundary of the County of
Villiers and a line bearing east to the range dividing
the waters of the River Hopkins and the Fiery Creek;
thence by that range to the Great Dividing Range;
thence by the Great Dividing Range to the source of
Mount Greenock Creek, the commencing point. And
the said District shall be called "The Local Court
District of Avoca."

DISTRICT OF THE OVENS.—Commencing at the
junction of the River Ovens with the River Murray,
thence by a line westerly to the range dividing the
waters of the River Ovens and Broken Creek;
thence by that range southwards to the source of the
Fifteen Mile Creek; thence by a line south-easterly,
crossing the River King, to the dividing range at
the source of the River Whorouly; thence by that
range to the Great Dividing Range; thence by the
Great Dividing Range to the source of the Indi or
Limestone River; and thence by part of the eastern
and northern boundaries of the Province of Victoria
to the commencing point. And the said District
shall be called "The Local Court District of the
Ovens."

DISTRICT OF CASTLEMAINE.—Commencing at a point on the River Loddon, six miles north of the northern boundary of the parish of Tarnagulla; thence by a line south-easterly to the south-western angle of the Parish of Ravenswood; thence by the southern boundary of the said parish to the Parish of Harcourt; thence by the western and northern boundaries of the said parish of Harcourt and a line south-easterly to Mount Alexander; thence by the Mount Alexander Range to the source of the Myrtle Creek; thence by the Myrtle Creek to its junction with the River Coliban; thence by the River Coliban to its source in the Great Dividing Range; thence by the Great Dividing Range to the source of the River Campaspe; thence by a line southwards to Mount Bullancrook; thence easterly by the Bullancrook Range to the source of the Djerriwarrh Creek; thence by the Djerriwarrh Creek to its junction with the River Werribee; thence by a line bearing west to the main Range between the waters of the Rivers Moorabool and Werribee; thence by that range or water shed to the Great Dividing Range; thence by the Great Dividing Range to the source of the Bullarook Creek; thence by the Bullarook Creek to its junction with the Tullaroop Creek; thence by a line bearing west to Mount Greenock Creek; thence by the Mount Greenock Creek to the Parish of Carisbrook; thence by the southern, eastern, and northern boundary lines of the said Parish of Carisbrook and the Deep Creek to the River Loddon; thence by the River Loddon to the Parish of Tarnagulla; thence by the southern, eastern, and northern boundary lines of the said parish of Tarnagulla and the River Loddon to commencing point. And the said District shall be called "The Local Court District of Castlemaine."

DISTRICT OF SANDHURST.—Commencing at the junction of the Myrtle Creek with the River Coliban; thence by a line south-easterly to the source of the McIvor Creek; thence by a line north-easterly to the junction of the Deegay Ponds with the River Goulburn; thence by the River Goulburn northwards to a point eight miles, more or less, north of the Protectorate Station; thence by a line westerly to the junction of the River Loddon with the Serpentine Creek; thence by the River Loddon southwards to a point six miles, more or less, north of the Parish of Tarnagulla; thence by a line south-easterly to the south-western angle of the Parish of Ravenswood; thence by the southern boundary of the said Parish of Ravenswood to the Parish of Harcourt; thence by the western and northern boundary lines of the said Parish of Harcourt and a line south-easterly to Mount Alexander; and thence by the Mount Alexander Range and the Myrtle Creek to the commencing point. And the said District shall be called "The Local Court District of Sandhurst."

GOLD FIELDS REGULATION.

HIS Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has been pleased to authorise the promulgation of the following amended Regulation under the Act of Council 18 Victoria, No. 37, in lieu of the Regulation on the subject promulgated on the 12th June, 1855:—

II.—BUSINESS LICENSES.

Licenses to carry on business will be issued and be in force for the respective periods, and on payment as follows:—

For three months	£2 10s.
For six months	5 0
For twelve months	10 0

The above License will entitle the holder to occupy an area of ground not exceeding sixteen feet six inches by sixty-six feet ($16\frac{1}{2} \times 66$), and for every such area or portion thereof occupied in addition, a similar license must be taken out. The firstmentioned admeasurement being deemed the frontage, and to be protected from encroachment.

The Business Licenses will be dated on the day of issue, and will have effect for three, six, or twelve months, from the 1st day of the month in which it is taken out, if issued prior to the 15th day of such month, and from the 1st day of the following month, if taken out after the 15th of the month.

Business Licenses, at whatever place issued, will be available on any Gold Field throughout the Colony, but no sub-letting will be permitted.

In districts in which authorised occupants have erected premises in terms of any preceding Regulations, on areas not recognised by this notice, the maximum payment will be limited to £20 per annum, or at that rate half yearly or quarterly, each case of the kind being recorded in the office of the Warden of the District.
