MURDERS.

FORTY POUNDS REWARD.

WHEREAS it has been represented to the Government that two men named **SAMPSON WOOLSTEAD** and **HENRY**, late servants of Mr. Wheildon, of the Carriers' Arms, Sale, Gipps' Land, are reported to have been murdered by some aborigines of the Gipps' Land tribe, on Sunday, the 10th June, at Mr. Jones's crossing place, Thompson River, about four and a half miles from Sale, and their bodies thrown into the said river: Notice is hereby given that a reward of Ten pounds will be given for the discovery of each body, and a further reward of Twenty pounds for such information as will lead to the apprehension and conviction of the murderers.

The foregoing rewards are in addition to the rewards offered by the inhabitants of Sale aforesaid.

HIS Excellency the Governor has directed the following report of the several matters and questions, decided at a meeting of the resident householders and of the landowners within the Municipal District of Emerald Hill, held on the 28th of June last, together with the list of the votes taken at a poll on the 29th ultimo, to be published in accordance with the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, sec. 15.

Emerald Hill, 29th June, 1855.

SIR,—I have the honor to inform you, in conformity with the fifteenth section of the Act of Council, 18 Victoria, No. 15, that I presided at a meeting of the resident householders and landowners of the Municipal District of Emerald Hill, convened in pursuance of that Act, on the 28th instant, and transmit herewith a brief report of the proceedings of that meeting. Having formally explained the objects for which the meeting was held, Mr. Russell (a gentleman who was subsequently a candidate for election as a Municipal Councillor for the District of Emerald Hill), urged his right to protest against the legality of the meeting.

I declined to receive his protest.

In accordance with the 12th section of the Municipal Act, the meeting next considered the question of the appointment of two persons to act as Assessors. The following gentlemen were duly proposed:—Messrs. Robert Dix, Benjamin Mawson, George Bulman, Roderick McKenzie, Hector McCauley, John Sullivan, and after a shew of hands the election fell upon Robert Dix, and George Bulman, Esq., who then accepted and performed the duties of office as Assessors.

The meeting having fully considered under the 10th section of the Act, the number of members which should compose their Municipal Council, unanimously resolved that it should consist of seven, and under the same section they also unanimously resolved, that such members should not receive any pecuniary remuneration.

The nomination of candidates was then proceeded with, when the following gentlemen were duly proposed for the office of Municipal Councillor:—

In the 52nd or interpretation clause the word "Householder" is stated shall mean the "Occupant of any house, warehouse, counting-house, office, or other building of the value of One hundred pounds.

Upon this, a question was raised at this election, whether the house alone would be valued for the purpose of enabling the occupant to vote, or the house and land combined? The Chairman and Assessors decided to consider both the building and land attached in estimating the value, conceiving, under this Act, that its spirit is, and the intention of the Legislature was, to confer the franchise on persons possessing £100 worth of *real* property in any Municipal District.

Twenty-four females exercised their right to vote at this election.
