FORAGE.

REGULATION.

HIS Excellency the Governor directs it to be notified for the information of persons authorised to draw Forage at the expense of Government, that from and after the 1st day of October next, the issue of Forage for Saddle Horses, except for the Police and Mounted Escort, will be discontinued; and that a commutation in money will be given in lieu thereof.

The scale of allowance will be fixed by a Board, consisting of:—

- The Colonial Storekeeper;
 - The Inspector General of Penal Establishments; and
 - The Clerk of the Executive Council;
- who will assemble on the first day of each quarter for that purpose.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Governor and Legislative Council of New South Wales passed in the fourteenth year of the Reign of Her present Majesty called "The Victoria Electoral Act of 1851," it was amongst other things enacted that such other Polling Places should be Polling Places for the several Electoral Districts in the said Act more particularly mentioned as should be appointed for that purpose by the Governor by Proclamation to be issued by him and published in the *Government Gazette* of the Colony: And whereas Melbourne, Bacchus Marsh, Heidelberg, and Richmond were by the said Act appointed to be Polling Places for the Electoral District of North Bourke: And whereas by three several Proclamations bearing date respectively the twelfth and twenty-second days of August and the first day of September, in the year 1851, certain additional Polling Places were appointed for the said Electoral District: Now I, the Governor of the said Colony, do hereby revoke the said three several Proclamations so far as the same relate to the Electoral District of North Bourke, and in pursuance of the power and authority so vested in me by the said Act, I do by this my Proclamation appoint that the following shall be Polling Places for the said Electoral District in addition to the Polling Places appointed by the said Act, that is to say:

WHEREAS Her Majesty the Queen was pleased, on the 28th day of February, in the present year, to make the Order in Council appended hereto, authorizing the issue of Leases No. 86.—SEPTEMBER 4TH, 1855.—6.

and Licenses of Lands to promote the working of Mines (not being mines of gold or silver) in the Colony of Victoria; And whereas the said Order in Council was laid before both Houses of Parliament on the eighth day of March last, and will take effect upon the expiration of six months, commencing from the said eighth day of March, agreeably to the terms of an Act of Parliament passed in the ninth and tenth year of Her Majesty's Reign, chapter 104, intituled, "An Act to amend an Act for regulating the Sale of Waste Land belonging to the Crown in the Australian Colonies, and to make further provision for the management thereof." Now I, the Governor of the said Colony, do by this my Proclamation notify and declare that the said Order in Council has been transmitted to me by the Right Honorable the Secretary of State, and that the same will come into operation upon the eighth day of this present month of September.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the tenth year of Her present Majesty, intituled, "An Act to amend an Act for regulating the Sale of Waste Land belonging to the Crown in the Australian Colonies, and to make further provision for the management thereof," Her Majesty was empowered to grant Leases or Licenses for the occupation of any Waste Lands of the Crown in the Colony of New South Wales (then including the present Colony of Victoria) for any term of years not exceeding Fourteen, and to make rules respecting the issue of such Leases and Licenses, and respecting the reservation of any rents thereon, and the insertion therein of any conditions and clauses of forfeiture, and respecting any other matters and things which might be requisite for carrying into complete effect the occupation of such Waste Lands; And whereas it is expedient to authorise the issue of such Leases and Licenses as may

promote the working of mines (not being mines of gold or silver) on such Waste Land within the Colony of Victoria:

It is hereby ordered, by The Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice of Her Majesty's Privy Council, as follows:

1. It shall be competent for the Governor of Victoria to license any person or persons to search for mines (not being mines of gold or silver) on such Waste Lands of the Crown and for such period not exceeding Twelve months, as may be specified in such License.

2. It shall be competent to the said Governor to grant to the holder of any such License as aforesaid a Lease for mining purposes of the whole or any part of the land specified in such License.

3. Every such Lease shall be for a term not exceeding Fourteen years, and shall be subject to a rent of not less than Ten shillings per acre per annum to be paid in advance, and shall be assignable under such rules as shall be prescribed by the Governor, and shall be *ipso facto* forfeited if the rent shall not be paid when due; Provided that it shall be competent to the Governor to remit such forfeiture on such terms as he shall think fit.

4. The Governor may insert in such Leases such conditions and clauses of forfeiture as he may think fit, and especially such as may seem to him necessary to secure the *bona fide* application of the land to mining purposes.

5. The extent of land to be comprised in such Leases or Licenses, and the amount of rent to be reserved thereon, shall be regulated from time to time by the Governor, with the advice of his Executive Council.

6. At the expiration of every such Lease, the land comprised therein shall be open to sale by public auction under such Government regulations as shall be then in force respecting such sales.

7. Every such Lease shall declare whether, and under what circumstances, the lessee shall be entitled to compensation for improvements effected by him, and shall also declare the mode of estimating and paying such compensation.

8. In this Order in Council the word Governor shall include the Lieutenant Governor or Officer for the time being administering the Government of Victoria.

And the Right Honorable Sir George Grey, Bart., one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, is to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.
