**BALLAARAT.**

IN pursuance of the Act of Council, 18 Victoria, No. 15, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has been pleased to direct the publication of the substance and prayer of a Petition to His Excellency, signed by Two hundred and ninety-two house-holders, resident in the township of Ballaarat, as follows:—

The Petitioners state that they are resident within the township of Ballaarat, which contains a population of more than three hundred house-holders, within an area not exceeding nine square miles, no point of which is distant more than six miles from any other point.

They further state that they are desirous of availing themselves of the operation of the said Act of Council, and that the township of Ballaarat may be proclaimed a Municipal District by the name of "The Municipality of Ballaarat," and that the boundaries may be regulated in accordance with the said Act of Council.

And the Petitioners pray as follows:—  
"Your Petitioners therefore humbly pray that Your Excellency may be pleased to cause the said township of Ballaarat to be proclaimed in due form a Municipal District, and also that the boundaries of the said Municipal District may be regulated pursuant to the provisions of the said Act of Council."

REGULATION.

WHEREAS the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty was pleased, on the 23th day of February, in the present year, to make the Order in Council appended hereto, empowering the Governor of the Colony of Victoria to regulate the amount of rent payable by holders of Pastoral Leases, and with the advice of the Executive Council to make regulations respecting the mode of tendering and receiving tenders for Pastoral Leases in the said Colony, the said Order in Council to take effect from a day to be fixed by Proclamation of the Governor; And whereas the said Order in Council was laid before Parliament on the second day of March last, agreeably to the terms of an Act of Parliament passed in the ninth and

tenth year of Her Majesty's Reign, chapter 104, intituled, "An Act to amend an Act for regulating the Sale of Waste Land belonging to the Crown in the Australian Colonies, and to make further provision for the management thereof." Now I, the Governor of the said Colony, do by this my Proclamation notify and declare that the said Order in Council has been transmitted to me by the Right Honorable the Secretary of State, and in pursuance of the authority vested in me as aforesaid, I do hereby fix and appoint that the said Order in Council shall come into operation upon the fifteenth day of this present month of September.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the Session of Parliament held in the ninth and tenth year of the Reign of Her present Majesty, intituled, "An Act to amend an Act for regulating the Sale of Waste Land belonging to the Crown in the Australian Colonies, and to make further provision for the management thereof," it was enacted that it should be lawful for Her Majesty, by Order in Council, amongst other things, to establish regulations respecting the more effectually making demises or licenses of such Waste Land, and respecting the reservation on such demises or licenses of rents; And whereas by an Order in Council, dated the 9th day of March, 1847, provisions were made respecting the mode of tendering and receiving tenders for leases of runs, thereafter called Pastoral Leases, and respecting the amount of rent to be paid for such runs, during the currency and after the renewal of such leases; And whereas it may be expedient that the provisions of the said Order in Council should be altered in the above respects: It is hereby ordered, by The Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, that it shall be lawful for the



Governor of Victoria to cause a provision to be inserted in or endorsed on any Pastoral Lease, declaring what rate of rent (not being less than £10 per annum) shall be payable by the holder or holders of such lease during the currency and after any renewal thereof, and how such rent shall be calculated or assessed, and such rent shall be in lieu of the rent payable under the said Order in Council, and all the provisions of the said Order in Council respecting the payment and recovery of the said last-mentioned rent, and respecting the forfeiture of any lease for nonpayment thereof, shall apply to the rent declared by such provision so inserted in any lease as aforesaid;

Provided always that no such provision shall be inserted in or endorsed upon any lease which shall have been executed or promised before this Order in Council shall take effect, without the consent in writing of the person or persons holding or entitled to such lease:

And it is further ordered that it shall be lawful for the Governor, with the advice of his Executive Council, notwithstanding anything contained in the said Order in Council, to make such regulations as to him shall seem fit respecting the mode of tendering and receiving tenders for pastoral leases, provided that no such regulations shall take effect till they shall have been published in the *Government Gazette*:

And it is further ordered that in the construction of this Order in Council, the term Governor shall mean the Officer for the time being lawfully administering the Government of the Colony:

And it is further ordered that this Order in Council shall take effect from a day to be fixed by Proclamation of the Governor.

And the Right Honorable Sir George Grey, Bart., one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, is to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

SECTION X. OF THE TOWN AND COUNTRY POLICE ACT EXTENDED TO EMERALD HILL.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir CHARLES HOTHAM, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Military Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of the Colony of Victoria, passed in the eighteenth year of the Reign of Her present Majesty, intituled, "*An Act to provide for the Management of Towns and other places in Victoria*," it is amongst other things enacted that certain provisions of the said Act relating to the good order of towns and other populous places, being sections V., VI., VII., VIII., IX. and X. in the said Act, should extend to and be in force in such cities, towns, districts, and places as the Lieutenant Governor might, by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette*, declare to come under the operation of the same respectively, or any of them, and that it should be lawful for the Lieutenant Governor to define the limits of such places; And whereas by a Proclamation dated the twenty-eighth day of December, in the year One thou-

sand eight hundred and fifty-four, the sections of the said Act, numbered V., VI., VII., VIII. and IX. were extended to the City of Melbourne, (then comprising the district since constituted the Municipal District of Emerald Hill), and the country surrounding the corporate boundaries of the said City, and extending a distance of five miles from those boundaries, and all towns and places within the limits so described, as the same were in the said Proclamation more particularly described; And whereas it is deemed expedient to extend the section of the said Act, numbered X., to the said Municipal District of Emerald Hill: Now therefore I, the Governor of the said Colony, do, by this my Proclamation, in pursuance of the provisions of the said Act, declare and appoint that the section of the said Act, being numbered X., shall extend to and be in force within the Municipal District of Emerald Hill, in the County of Bourke, the boundaries whereof are defined in a Proclamation under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, dated the twenty-sixth day of May in this present year.
