By His Excellency SIR CHARLES HOTHAM, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Military Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by a Proclamation under the hand of the Lieutenant Governor and Seal of the said Colony, bearing date the twelfth day of October, in the Year of Our Lord 1852, the Lieutenant Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, did order, direct, and appoint that a Circuit Court should be holden at the Town of Geelong, in the Geelong Circuit District, on the twenty-first day of December, 1852, and on the first day of February, the twenty-sixth day of April, the twenty-sixth day of July, and the twenty-sixth day of October in every following year, until otherwise ordered; and that a Circuit Court within the Portland Circuit district should be holden at the Town of Portland in the said Circuit District, on the twentieth day of April and the first day of November, A.D. 1853, and every following year until otherwise ordered; And whereas it is expedient to alter the times for holding the said Circuit Court in each of the said Districts: Now therefore I, the Governor of the said Colony, with the advice of the Executive Council of the said Colony, do hereby order, direct and appoint that the aforesaid Circuit Court in the Geelong Circuit District, shall be holden at the Town of Geelong in the said Circuit District, on the first day of February, the twentieth day of April, the twentieth day of July, and the twentieth day of October, in every year until otherwise ordered; And I do with the advice aforesaid order and direct that if any of the days aforesaid shall happen to fall on a Sunday, the said Court shall commence and be held on the Monday following; And I do order that the said Circuit Court at Portland, in the said Portland Circuit District, be holden on the twenty-third day of January, A.D. 1856, instead of the first of November, A.D. 1855.

SCHEDULE B. REFERRED TO IN THIS ORDER.

Specification of manner in which the Streets, Courts and Alleys enumerated in Schedule A, referred to in this Order, are ordered to be freed from obstruction, paved, flagged, macadamized, levelled, drained, and sewered, in the Town of Geelong.

THE natural soil is to be reduced or made up, as the case may require, so that the longitudinal section of the whole right-of-way shall in no part have an inclination of less than one foot in one hundred and thirty-two feet; and, where practicable, the entire length is to form one incline. The transverse section of the right-of-way is to show a roadway whose crown shall not be more than three inches above the kerbs of the footway, and the fall from the crown to the water channels is to be at the rate of one foot in twenty-four feet. On either side of the roadway there is to be a water channel two feet wide, consisting of three rows of bluestone pitchers eight inches deep and eight inches wide, made square on the ends with upright sides, set in sand and well rammed; so as to subside two inches; the bottom of such channel is to be six inches below the top of the kerbs. On either side of the roadway there is also to be a footway not more than four feet wide, which is to be separated from the roadway by a hardwood plank, ten inches by three inches, set on edge, and fastened with five-inch spikes to piles four inches by four inches, three feet long, driven into the ground not more than eight feet apart. These footways are to receive a coat of gravel three inches thick, having a slope towards the kerb of one foot in twelve feet. The roadway is to be covered with a coat of metal broken to two and a half inches in size, laid on six inches thick at the channels and nine inches thick at the crown; and this, when necessary, is to be covered with a binding of loam or sand, one and a half inches thick. Wherever private entrances lead from the rights-of-way, they are to be paved the full width with bluestone pitchers in the same manner as the channels; the paving and kerb are to extend from the channel towards the line of houses or fences, so as to cross the entire footway. The whole work must be done to the satisfaction of the Town Surveyor, who is authorised to order any deviation from these general principles which the peculiarities of any case may require.
