NOTICE TO MARINERS.—LIGHT-HOUSE ON TROUBRIDGE SHOALS, GULF ST. VINCENT.

Trinity House, Port Adelaide, South Australia, 17th December, 1855.

Light.—A bright flashing light, 80 feet above high water mark, visible from the deek of a moderate sized vessel at a distance of sixteen (16) miles, will be exhibited on and after the evening of the 1st of February, 1859.

Lig't-house position—Variation—Tides.—The Light-house is composed of iron, painted stone color, and is placed on the centre of the Troubridge Island in let. 35° 10° S., long. 137° 50′ 15° E., var. 5° E. High water, F. and C. 3,30; the flood sets E.N.E., and then N.N.E. into the gulf.

Bool sets E.N.E., and then N.N.E. into the gulf.

Sailing Directions.—Vessels bound through Investigator's Straits into the Gulf St. Vincent should make the Light bearing N.E., \( \frac{1}{2} \) N. by compass, and steer N.E. by E. \( \frac{1}{2} \) E to pass it at a distance of seven miles; having brought it to bear W. by N. \( \frac{1}{2} \) N. about eight miles, a course of N.E. by N. may be kept for the Light-ship off Port Adelaide, which bears N.E. \( \frac{1}{2} \) E., 36\( \frac{1}{2} \) miles from the centre of the Island Vessels from the westward and southward should not approach the Light within a less distance than four miles, where they will find soundings of 14 fathoms. of 14 fathoms.

Tides.—The flood tide, during westerly gales and at the springs, runs with considerable velocity—setting rather on the shoal until the Gulf is open.

Anchorage off the Light.—Vessels bound down the Gulf from the Port, meeting with westerly gales, will find excellent anchorage under the lee of Tronbridge Island, with the light bearing S.W., distant 1½ miles, in 8 fathoms, on a clean sandy

WARRNAMBOOL MUNICIPALITY.

REPORT of the Chairman and Assessors of the proceedings at a public meeting of the resident householders and landowners of "the Municipal District of Warrnambool," held at the Court House, at Twelve o'clock noon, on the 2nd day of January, 1856, and convened for the following purposes :-

1st. For deciding whether the Council for the Town shall consist of three, five, or seven members.

No. 10.—January 15th, 1856.—1.

2nd. For deciding whether the members of such Municipal Council shall or shall not receive any pecuniary remuneration, and if any, what shall be the amount thereof.

3rd. For electing the members of the Municipal Council.

Dr. Tierney having read the letter conveying his appointment as Chairman of the meeting, by the Honorable the Chief Secretary, and the necessary preliminaries having been gone through, it was decided by the meeting—

1st. That the Council shall consist of seven members.
2nd. That the members of the said Council shall not receive any pecuniary remuneration.

It was then decided that two assessors should be chosen by a show of hands, to assist the Chairman.

Several gentlemen were proposed, but upon a show of hands being taken, Messrs. L. Byass and W. O. Allan were declared duly elected, and took their seats accordingly.

The following gentlemen were then nominated as members of the Municipal Council, viz:—Messrs. Wm. Bateman, jun., John Elliott, John Macdonald, James Coulstock, William Plummer, James Hayes, Joseph Dobson, George Bostock, James Davidson, Sanuel Macgregor, James Dooley, James Cust, and Thomas Mickle.

It was then agreed to by the Chairman and Assessors that the election should be decided by a poll and the meeting was adjourned for that purpose until eight o'clock a.m. the follow-

adjourned for that purpose until eight o clock a.m. the following day.

On Thursday, 3rd January, the poll was opened by the Chairman and Assessors, in the Court House, at eight o'clock in the forenoon, and remained open till four o'clock in the afternoon, when the Chairman declared the poll finally closed. The meeting was then adjourned until six o'clock, to allow time to ascertain correctly the state of the poll.

#### MUNICIPALITY OF EAST COLLINGWOOD.

BYE-LAW TO REGULATE, BY MEANS OF STANDING ORDERS, THE PROCEEDINGS OF THE MUNICIPAL COUNCIL OF EAST COLLING-

WOOD.

WHEREAS by the Act of the Governor and Legislative Council of the Colony of Victoria, 18 Victoria, No. 15, initialed, "An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria," section 26, it is enacted, "That it shall be "competent for the Council of any Municipal District to make Bye." Laws for the regulation of their own proceedings, the collection of their rates, the conducting of elections and public meetings of the rateapyers, the determining the validity of disputed elections, the prevention and extinguishing of fires, the suppression of ruisances and houses of ill-fame, compelling residents to keep their premises free from offensive or unwholesome matters, "the regulation and licensing of porters, public carriers, carters, water drawers, and other public vehicles, regulating the killing and sale of butchers' meat, the establishment of slaughter-houses, the regulation of markets, market dues, fairs, and sales, the preservation of public decency and public health, the restraining noisome and offensive trades, and the general good rule and government of such Municipal District, such Bye-Laws to have force and effect under the 33rd section of the said Act, upon the assent of the Governor of the said Colony the said Act, upon the assent of the Governor of the said Colony having been obtained thereto under his hand.

Be it therefore enacted by the Council of the Municipal District of East Collingwood, That from and after the date of the Governor's assent hereto, the proceedings and business of the said Council shall be conducted according to the following Regulations only, which shall be deemed and called the "Standing Orders" of the said Council, until repealed or altered, that is to say:—

CHAP. I .- Order of proceeding.

- 1. That the sittings of this Council shall, on all ordinary occasions, be open to the public, but any Councillor may require the exclusion of strangers while the sense of the Council is taken as to whether the question proposed shall be discussed with closed doors.
- 2. At all meetings of the Council the business shall commence so soon as the legal quorum is present; but, should a quorum not be present at the expiration of twenty minutes, such circumstance shall be noted (with the names of the Members present) in the Minute Book, and such meeting shall lapse.
- 3. The first business at each meeting of the Council shall be confirm the Minutes of preceding meeting, and no discussion shall take place thereupon, except as to the accuracy thereof.
- 4. At all meetings, the reading of correspondence unconnected with the business of the meeting, the presentation of Petitions, and bringing up Reports, shall have the precedence of all Motions.
- 5. All communications addressed to the Council must be in the form of Petition or Memorial.
- 6. No Motion shall be decided on at any meeting of Council onless notice in writing, signed by the Council or proposing, shall have been given at the previous meeting of the Council, nor shall any Report of Committee be decided on unless similar notice be given, unless in Committee of the whole Council, or the whole Council be present.
- 7. The Orders of the Day shall include all business of which due notice has been given, and all matters arising out of former meetings of the Council.
- 8. No Motion shall be proceeded with unless the Councillor giving' notice be present when called on, unless by special permission of the Council.
- 9. No Bye-Law shall be decided on without due notice (as in cases of Motions), and copy of proposed Bye-Laws shall be open in the Council Chamber for inspection of all Ratepayers, free of charge, or of any person duly qualified to vote at Elections under the Act.
- 10. All business shall be considered in the order in which notice thereof was given.

## CHAP. II .- Order of Debate.

- 1. Any member, when proposing a motion or amendment, or 1. Any member, when proposing a motion or amenament, or discussing any matter, must rise and address the Chairman, and no member shall be interrupted unless by a call to order, when he shall sit down; the member calling to order shall then be heard, and the question decided before the subject is resumed, or any other business entered upon.
- 2. Any Councillor rising to propose an amendment or to make any proposition to the Council, must state the nature of the same before addressing the Council in support thereof.
- 3. No proposition once brought before the Council shall be withdrawn without leave of the Council; nor shall any proposition be entertained by the Council until the same be seconded.
- 4. Councillors moving a proposition shall be held to have spoken on that question, but Councillors merely seconding any motion shall not be held to have spoken upon it.
- 5. If more than one Councillor rise at the same time, the Chairman for the time being shall decide which is entitled to pre-audience. .....

- 6. No Councillor shall speak twice on the same question, unless by way of explanation merely, or in reply as the mover of an original motion, or upon any amendment; and after such explanation or reply the question shall be forthwith put to the
- 7. No Councillor shall digress from the subject under discussion, or impute motives, and all personal reflections shall be considered highly disorderly.
- 8. The presiding Chairman's decision shall be final on all questions of order or practice, and he shall state the same without comment or argument.
- 9. The presiding Chairman shall rise when addressing the Council.
- 10. Any Councillor who shall use expressions capable of being offensively applied to any other Councillor, shall, if required by the Chairman, withdraw such expressions, and make a satisfactory apology to the Council, under a penalty of not more than ten pounds.
- 11. Any Councillor may require the Clerk to the Council to take down any particular expressions immediately on their being used.
- 12. Any Councillor may of right demand the productions of any of the documents of the Council bearing on the question under discussion.
- 13. Only one amendment shall be discussed at one time, and upon the adoption of any amendment the original motion shall be deemed rejected, and the amendment so carried shall be acted upon as an original motion.
- 14. The Chairman shall, in taking the sense of the Council, put the question first in the affirmative, then in the negative; and the votes of all Councillors shall be entered in the minutes.
- 15. The Council shall vote by show of hands, except in cases of elections. (See chap. 3, par. 2.)

  16. No discussion shall be allowed on any motion for adjourn-
- ment; but if the question be decided in the negative, the next motion or order of the day shall be considered before the question of adjournment shall be again entertained, and any business left undecided shall take precedence at the next meeting of-the Council.
- 17. Any Councillor may record his protest against any decision of the Council, provided the same be made before the next meeting of the Council (in writing) and be conched in respectful language, and be consistent with truth; notice of such intention, however, must be given on the adoption of the resolution.

  18. No motion, the effect of which would be to rescribe any provious resolution of the Council shall be entertained during
- previous resolution of the Council, shall be entertained during the same municipal year, unless a call of the whole Council be duly made for the purpose.
- 19. The Chairman of the Council when appointed on committees shall be Chairman thereof, and the Standing Orders of the Council shall be observed in all committees except as to the number of times limited for speaking.
- 20. The Clerk to the Council shall have charge of the Common 20. The elers to the council shall be responsible for the same, and verify each impression by his signature, and shall not affix the same to any document without the order of a majority of the Council, and for using the same to verify documents not belonging to, or for the use of the Council, shall charge a fee of five shillings.

## CHAP. III .- Elections.

- Char. III.—Elections.

  1. No election to any office at the disposal of the Council shall take place until four clear days' notice shall have been given in one or more local daily newspapers, inviting applications for the same; and the salary of such office shall, in all cases, be fixed for the municipal year before proceeding to the election.

  2. At all such elections the voting shall be (except at that of Chairman of the Council) on cards to be provided for the purpose, on which the voter shall write the name of the candidate he supports, and sign his own; no others will be received, and the Town Clerk shall preserve the same as a record.

  3. No Councillor shall be received as surface for the same as a record.
- 3: No Councillor shall be received as surety for any officer, nor shall any auditor or other officer become surety for any other employe of the Council, or for any work to be done for the Council, and in all cases where security shall be required, the expense of preparing the same shall be borne by the party giving the same.
- 4. Any one or more of the Standing Orders may be suspended pro tem. in case of emergency, with the consent of a majority of the Council.
