PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Major-General Macanthum, the Senior Military Officer in Command of Her Majesty's Land Forces in the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c., &c.

In pursuance of an Act of the Governor and Legislative Council of the Colony of Victoria, passed in the nineteenth year of Hor Majesty's Reign, intituled, "An Act to provide for the Election of Members to serve in the Legislative Council and "Legislative Assembly of Victoria respectively:" I Major-General Macanthum, the Senior Military Officer and Officer administering the Government of the said Colony, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this my Proclamation abolish the several polling places (already appointed) for the several divisions mentioned in the first column of the Schedules hereunto annexed; and, with the advice aforesaid, I do hereby appoint that the several places mentioned in the last column of the Schedules hereunto annexed; and, with the advice aforesaid, I do hereby appoint that the several places mentioned in the last column of the Schedules hereunto annexed shall be respectively polling places for the purpose of taking the poll at any contested election for the province within the limits whereof such places are respectively situate, and that all votes in respect of qualifications within the boundaries and limits mentioned or referred to in the second column of the same Schedule shall be taken at any election for such provinces respectively at the polling places set opposite thereto in the said last column, that is to say:—
