PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Major-General MACARTHUR, the Senior Military Officer in Command of Her Majesty's Land Forces in the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS the Legislative Council of the Colony of Victoria has been and now stands prorogued to Tuesday, the sixteenth day of the current month of September: And whereas it is deemed expedient further to prorogue the said Council: Now therefore I, Major-General MACARTHUR, the Senior Military Officer and Officer administering the Government of the said Colony, with the advice of the Executive Council, in pursuance of the power and authority in me vested, do by this my Proclamation further prorogue the said Legislative Council to Tuesday, the thirtieth day of the current month of September.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this ninth day of September, in the year of Our Lord One thousand eight hundred and fifty-six, and in the twentieth year of Her Majesty's Reign.

PORT OF PORT ALBERT TO BE A FREE WAREHOUSING SUB-PORT.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Major-General MACARTHUR, the Senior Military Officer in Command of Her Majesty's Land Forces in the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by a Proclamation of the Governor of New South Wales, dated the nineteenth day of October, in the year of Our Lord One thousand eight hundred and fifty, the Port of Port Albert, in the District of Port Phillip, was declared and established as a Port of Entry and Clearance within the limits of the Port of Melbourne: And whereas by an Act of the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of the Colony of Victoria, passed in the sixteenth year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled, "An Act for the general regulation of the Customs in the Colony of Victoria," the said Port of Port Albert was declared to be a Free Sub-Port, extending from Cape Howe, or the boundary line of the said Colony, on the east to Wilson's Promontory on the west: Now I, the Senior Military Officer and Officer administering the Government of the said Colony, by virtue of the authority in me vested by the said recited Act, do hereby declare the said Sub-Port of Port Albert to be a Free Warehousing Sub-Port.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this fifth day of September, in the year of Our Lord One thousand eight hundred and fifty-six, and in the twentieth year of Her Majesty's Reign.

LOCAL COURT REGULATIONS.

CHESWICK.

REGULATIONS made by the Local Court of the District of Cheswick.

The following rules are hereby enacted to supersede the regulations of the Local Court of Cheswick, gazetted on the 16th of April, 1856:—

i. *Wet and dry sinkings.*—Claims to be divided into wet and dry sinkings, wet sinkings being understood to mean where slabbing is required.

ii. *Wall.*—A wall of two (2) feet shall be left between each claim, to belong to the first party that can work it.

iii. *Claims to be marked by pegs.*—Persons marking out claims must do so by firmly fixing in the ground four pegs, two feet high from its surface, one at each corner of the claim, which must be kept visible during the working of the claim.

iv. *Parties not allowed to jump claims.*—No party shall be allowed to jump or take forcible possession of another party's claim, but when a claim may be disputed on any of the grounds mentioned in these rules, the party wishing to take possession of it must first make application to any authorised person to inquire into and decide the case.

v. *Situation of shaft.*—Shafts must in all cases be sunk in the centre of the claim, unless a satisfactory reason to the contrary can be shown (if the claim be disputed) to the Warden and Assessors.

vi. *Extent of claims.*—The extent of claims in dry sinking, when it does not exceed fifty (50) feet in depth, shall be—

For one (1) miner 12 feet by 12 feet
For two (2) " 12 " 24 "
For three (3) " 18 " 24 "
For four (4) " 24 " 24 "

When the sinking exceeds fifty (50) feet in depth—

For two (2) miners 18 feet by 24 feet
For three (3) " 24 " 24 "
For four (4) " 24 " 30 "

and in either case, no claim which is less than twelve (12) feet by twelve (12) feet shall be allowed.

The extent of claim in wet sinking, when the sinking does not exceed thirty (30) feet in depth, shall be—

For two (2) miners 18 feet by 24 feet
For three (3) " 24 " 24 "
For four (4) " 24 " 30 "

When the sinking exceeds thirty (30) feet, but does not exceed seventy (70) feet in depth—

For four (4) miners 30 feet by 30 feet
For five (5) " 30 " 35 "
For six (6) " 35 " 35 "
For seven (7) " 35 " 40 "
For eight (8) " or more, 40 feet by 40 feet.

When the sinking exceeds seventy (70) feet in depth—

For six (6) miners 35 feet by 40 feet
For seven (7) " 40 " 40 "
For eight (8) " or more, 40 feet by 45 feet

No. 112.—SEPTEMBER 12TH, 1856.—9.

In wet sinking no claim which is less than ten (10) feet by ten (10) feet shall be allowed.

In no case however will spare ground be allowed to be taken up, after any of the four (4) surrounding claims have touched the water.

vii. *Slabs.*—In any case where a claim having a slabbed shaft is legally forfeited, the slabs shall be paid for within forty-eight (48) hours, at the market value, or by the same number of slabs equal in value.

viii. *Shepherding.*—Shepherding will in no case be allowed.

In wet sinking, after marking out a claim, two (2) at least of the party to whom it belongs must be at work on the ground, and after the expiration of ten (10) days the whole of the persons forming the party; when the water is reached parties must work day and night, if considered necessary by the parties of three (3) of the adjoining claims.

ix. *Prospecting.*—Any party discovering new gold workings shall receive a treble claim under a written authority of the Warden of the district, and a double claim shall be granted on such like authority to any party recovering a lost lead or workings, provided it be made public without unnecessary delay.

x. *Prospecting.*—Any party of miners sinking a shaft and striking the lead of gold 250 yards beyond the last marked claim, if he make the same known without delay, shall receive a double claim, provided that the party shall have given notice to the Warden of the district before the commencing of their sinking, and have marked off the requisite ground.

xi. *Quartz mining, extent of claim.*—Every miner shall be entitled to twelve (12) feet along the supposed course of the vein, including all the dips and angles of the reef, but no one claim shall be more than forty-eight (48) feet in length.

xii. *Reefs running parallel.*—Where there are several reefs running parallel to one another, no party shall be allowed to sink within twenty-four (24) feet from the centre of the nearest shaft, on the line of the next reef.

xiii. *Disintegrated quartz.*—Where the quartz veins are much disintegrated, or two or more veins worked by different parties lead into one reef, the party first settled on the ground shall be entitled to the main reef.

xiv. *On discovery of an auriferous quartz vein.*—Any person discovering an auriferous quartz vein shall receive a double or treble claim, not exceeding in any case seventy-two (72) feet, on application to the Warden or any authorised person.

xv. *Puddling.*—No puddling machine shall be allowed in any place where it may be considered injurious to the supply of water or the interests of other miners, and none shall be erected without application having been made to, and granted by, the Local Court. The extent of ground allowed for the erection of each puddling machine shall be twenty-four (24) feet by twenty-four (24) feet, and for the depositing of washing stuff, eighteen (18) feet by twenty-four (24) feet.

xvi. *Water reserved.*—No washing nor puddling shall be allowed in holes which the Warden of the district or other proper authority may consider requisite to be reserved for drinking or culinary purposes, and notice of such reservation must be posted on the ground immediately adjoining.

xvii. *Sluice washing.*—Sluice washing or other water privileges will be allowed only by sanction of the Local Court, in order that care may be taken to guard against conferring the privilege in places where the permanent supply of water may be injured by the operation.

Where more than one race is cut from a creek, in case of a scarcity of water, the supply of water shall be reserved for the use of the party first on the creek, and so on in succession according to priority, and in all cases the tail water shall be the property of the person from whose race it runs.

xviii. *Extent of claim.*—The extent of claim at any one time shall be twenty-four (24) feet by two hundred (200) feet for one set of sluices of not less than one hundred (100) feet in length.

xix. *Right to races.*—All right to any race cut for conveying water, tail race, or privilege granted for using water in the creek or out of the creek, becomes forfeited when abandoned for the space of fourteen days, unless sickness or some other sufficient cause shall be shown for leaving it.

xx. *Extent to be occupied under business licenses.*—Each business license shall entitle the holder to occupy an area of ground not exceeding thirty (30) feet by seventy (70) feet, and for every such area or portion thereof in addition a similar license must be taken out; the first mentioned admeasurement being deemed the frontage, and to be protected from encroachment.

xxi. *Road frontages.*—Parties occupying road sites as storekeepers or otherwise will be required to keep such frontage clear in every respect, more particularly as regards the drains.

xxii. *Space between stores.*—In every case twenty (20) feet shall be left between each store, unless required for mining purposes, and no person shall be allowed to sink a shaft within six (6) feet of any store.

xxiii. *Store reserves not to be used for mining.*—Under no circumstances shall a storekeeper or person in business be allowed to sink for gold within the limits of the ground which he holds under his business license.

The foregoing Regulations, Nos. 1. to xxiii., have been assented to by His Excellency the Officer administering the Government, with the advice of the Executive Council. Gazetted on the 12th day of September, 1856, pursuant to 18 Victoria No. 37 sec. 17.

MUNICIPALITY OF WARRNAMBOOL.

FIRST HALF-YEARLY REPORT OF THE MUNICIPAL COUNCIL OF WARRNAMBOOL MADE PURSUANT TO THE PROVISIONS OF THE MUNICIPAL INSTITUTIONS' ACT, 18 VICTORIA, No. 15.—ADOPTED BY COUNCIL 13TH AUGUST, 1856.

ORGANISATION.

THE township of Warrnambool was constituted a municipal district by His late Excellency Sir Charles Hotham, by a Proclamation dated the 6th of December, 1855.

The following is the area of the municipal district.

A public meeting of the resident householders and of the landowners within the municipal district was held at the Court House, Warrnambool, on the 1st of January last, in pursuance of the provisions of the Municipal Institutions' Act, Daniel Joseph Tierney, Esq., M.D., having been duly appointed Chairman. The meeting elected Messrs. William Osborne Allan and Lovel Byass to act as assessors, and decided that the Council should consist of seven members who should not receive pecuniary consideration. A poll was held the next day, when the following resident ratepayers were elected members of the Council, namely: James Coulstock, William Bateman, junior, John Macdonald, Samuel MacGregor, John Elliott, George Bostock, and James Hayes.

The first meeting of Council was held on the 9th of January last, when Councillor Samuel MacGregor was elected Chairman for the current year.

The provisions of the management of Towns Act, 18 Victoria No. 14, sections 5 to 10 inclusive, had been extended to the town by a Proclamation dated the 4th of June, and gazetted on the 5th of June, 1855.

The Council accepted the tender of Mr. James Hider for the valuation of property within the municipality for assessment, and the preparation of the ratepayers' roll. The result was 606 assessments of the aggregate annual value of £20,774. A Court of Revision was held at the Council Chamber on the 23rd of April last, but the appeals against the assessment were few in number, and the reduction of the assessment was inconsiderable in amount.

The following officers were appointed at the dates affixed to their respective names.

Town Clerk—Mr. Alfred Meredith Jukes, 10th January, 1856.

Engineer—Mr. Hughbert Baker, 30th January, 1856.

Honorary Treasurer—Mr. Samuel Hannaford, manager of the Bank of Australasia, Warrnambool, 27th February, 1856.

Inspector of Slaughter Houses, Weights and Measures, and Nuisances—Mr. Alfred South, sergeant-major Mounted Police, 26th March, 1856.

Rate Collector—Mr. James Hider, 23rd April, 1856.

The Council not being satisfied with the engineer, passed a resolution on the 30th of April last, that his services should be dispensed with at the expiration of one month from that date, and called for applications for the office thus vacated. The Honorable the Commissioner of Public Works having courteously consented, at the request of the Council, to make a selection from the candidates for the office, selected Mr. Andrew Kerr, late of the City Surveyor's Office, Melbourne, whose appointment as town surveyor was formally confirmed by the Council on the 9th of July last.

The Council, on the 30th of January last, passed a Bye-law for regulating their proceedings by standing orders, which was assented to by His Excellency the Officer administering the Government on the 19th of February last, and gazetted the same day.

The Council at first met, through the courtesy of the Resident Magistrate, at the Court House, Warrnambool: they subsequently removed to offices in Liebig-street, and have lately taken more eligible premises in Timor-street.

The Council have procured a common seal, the design and motto of which were approved of by His Excellency the Officer administering the Government.

APPLICATIONS TO GOVERNMENT.

The Council have made the following applications to the Government, with the results mentioned:—

Control over Town Reserve: not granted, the Government having no power to give the control in question, but a modification of the laws contemplated resting such control in municipal authorities generally.

Copy of *Government Gazette* from commencement of present year: granted.

To set out breadth of carriage and footways: will be complied with as soon as streets proclaimed.

Grant of an acre of land in section 4, Warrnambool, as a site for a Town Hall: complied with.

Control and supervision of jetty: under consideration.

Map of Township: granted.

Additional police force: under consideration.

PUBLIC WORKS.

Before proceeding to the formation of the streets, the Council considered it advisable that the streets and roads within the township should be cleared of trees and stumps. This work is now nearly accomplished.

A great improvement has also been effected in Timor-street by levelling a portion of the street, a hill opposite the Court House having been cut down and a part of the street filled up which was previously under water during the rainy season.

No. 112.—SEPTEMBER 12TH, 1855.—10.

The Council decided, on the 11th of April last, that the rate on the assessment for the current year should be One shilling in the pound; the greater portion of which rate has now been collected.

The sum of £4000 was granted to the municipality by the legislature out of the general revenue for the year 1856, and a moiety of this sum has been received.

The Council were indebted to the Bank of Australasia for payment of their current liabilities until they were in funds; the bank having authorised them to open an account and to draw cheques to the amount of £500.

MUNICIPAL DISTRICT OF PORTLAND.

STATEMENT OF THE PROCEEDINGS OF THE MUNICIPAL COUNCIL FOR THE DISTRICT, FOR THE SIX MONTHS ENDING ON THE 5TH AUGUST, 1856.

THE Council held their first meeting on the 6th February, 1856, when Mr. Thomas Must was elected chairman. A convenient place for the meetings of the Council being necessary, application was made to the Government for the use of one of the unoccupied rooms in the building used for the Government Offices, which was granted, and a convenient set of rooms placed at the disposal of the Council. The attention of the Council was at an early period directed to the necessity of procuring from the general revenue an annual grant for the improvement of the municipality; the sum of £4000 was voted for this purpose, of which £2000 have been received. The assessment of all rateable property within the town, and the preparation of the Ratepayers' Roll, was proceeded with as early as practicable. The assessment shows a gross rateable value of about £30,000, and the number of ratepayers on the roll amounts to 458. To enable the Council to defray their current expenditure before the Government grant could be received and a rate collected, a cash credit was opened with the Bank of Australasia on the personal responsibility of the members of the Council. It being the opinion of the Council that the most important duty devolving upon them was the repairing the public streets of Portland, which had hitherto been almost totally neglected, contracts were entered into for the supply of a large quantity of road metal,

which was accordingly carted into town during the short interval of dry weather intervening between the appointment of the Council and the setting in of the wet season, and broken at leisure. This step was the means of furnishing employment to a considerable number of laborers who happened at that time to be out of employ, and has placed the Council in a position to take immediate advantage of the spring when it arrives by doing as much towards the improvement of the streets as the limited fund at the command of the Council will admit of. As the sanction of the Governor is required to the mode of expending all money obtained from the general revenue, a Bye-law was passed authorising the expenditure of the £4000 voted to the Council in repairing the principal streets in the town. In pursuance of the power vested in the Council for that purpose, the following officers were appointed, at the salaries specified, viz. :—

Clerk to the Council, salary	£200 per annum.
Surveyor	150 "
Rate Collector	150 "

The following are the improvements in the streets which have been made since the election of the Council, viz. :—

Levelling and metalling the road from the Jetty to Bentinck-street.

Repairing a portion of Bentinck-street which had been metalled about two years previously.

Laying down three inverts, and repairing dangerous portions of Percy-street.

Clearing the water-courses at the sides of several of the streets, so as to prevent the water from flowing across the streets.

Forming a temporary wooden bridge across a creek in Otway-street, so as to render it passable for drays.

Forming an embankment at the south end of Bentinck-street across a water-hole in the middle of the road, and cutting down the hill above preparatory to metalling.

On the 29th April a rate of one shilling in the pound was struck, and a Bye-law, authorising its collection, was subsequently passed, and approved by the Acting Governor, and the rate is now in the course of collection. There have been various communications with the Commissioner of Public Works, with reference to the expenditure of the sum of £12,000 voted for Public Works, not under the control of the municipality, and as to which the opinion of the Council was requested; they accordingly recommended that that sum should be expended in the erection of a new Jetty and Gauging Shed at the end of Julia-street, the erection of a Post Office on the Crown Reserve in Bentinck-street, adjoining the Custom House, the enlargement of the Gaol and Lock-up House; but none of these works have as yet been commenced.* The surveyor appointed by the Council, soon after their election, not having given satisfaction to the Council, he was, on the 15th July, suspended, and he subsequently tendered his resignation, which was accepted, and the office is now vacant. The question of a permanent endowment of the municipality, out of the general revenue of the Colony, and other questions mooted by the different Municipal Councils in the Colony, have been under the consideration of the Council, and Mr. Browning, one of the members of the Council, was appointed to represent them at a proposed meeting of delegates which was afterwards held at Melbourne on the 4th August, and which was attended by Mr. Browning. The following applications have been made to the Government, and complied with :—

The supply of the *Government Gazette* for the use of the Council.

The increase of the grant for an endowment for the current year.

The surveying and marking out the road leading from the jetty to Bentinck-street, and a road from the east end of Gawler-street along the cliff to Huddle-street.

The following applications have not been complied with :—

The supply of a copy of the Votes and Proceedings of the Legislative Council for the use of the Municipal Council.

The supply of a map of the Municipal District for the use of the Council.

An application that the reserved lands between Bentinck-street and the sea, north of Gawler-street, should be placed under the control of the Council, was met by a reply from the Surveyor General that the lands in question would be reserved for the present.

An application was also made that contractors for public works in Portland might be permitted to quarry stones on Crown lands without paying a license fee; this was not conceded, but it was intimated to the Council that if they wished it portions of land in the suburbs might be set apart for quarrying stones for public purposes, and the District Surveyor has been instructed to mark out such reserves.
