### COMMUTATION FOR FORAGE.

HIS Excellency the Senior Military Officer in Victoria directs it to be notified, for the information of persons entitled to receive a money allowance in lieu of forage, that the rate of commutation for the quarter ending 31st March, 1856, has been fixed, on the recommendation of the Board appointed for that purpose, as follows, viz. :—

In Melbourne, Geelong, Portland, Belfast, Warrnambool, Alberton, and the sea board generally, 4s. per diem.  
In Inland Townships, and the interior generally, 6s. 6d. per diem.

To persons having the occasional use of paddocks, one-half of the above scale.

To persons required to keep two horses, one-half more than the above scale.
