CAUTION.

NOTICE TO MARINERS.

MASTERS of Vessels, Pilots, and others navigating the West Channel are hereby informed that a vessel lies sunk in 22 feet water about a cable's length N.N.E. from the Swan Spit Light-ship.

The sunken vessel lies on her port broadside, heading to the eastward; topgallant masts, starboard yard-arms of topsails and lower yards above water.

A small vessel has been moored close to the northward of the wreck, which will exhibit at her masthead a red flag by day, and two lights, one over the other, by night, until the sunken vessel has been removed.
