## LOCAL COURT REGULATION.

SANDHURST.

REGULATION made by the Local Court of the District of Sandhurst.

LXXIII. *Period of absence from claim.*—Any miner or miners may hold any claim unworked for the period of twenty-four (24) hours, and for a further period of three (3) days: Provided that after the first twenty-four hours the claim is visited daily during the ordinary working hours by the owner, or one of the owners, or by some other person authorised by him or them, for the purpose of warning any miner or miners who may have gone into it that such claim is not abandoned; and, with the same proviso, any miner or miners may hold his or their claim unworked whilst engaged in extracting, by any process whatever, the gold from the washing stuff or other substance in which it may be embedded, taken from his or their claim only: Provided further, that if after the first twenty-four (24) hours have elapsed the owner or owners of any such claim so left unworked is or are engaged in mining in any other place, or employed in any other work for which consideration shall be received (not being necessary domestic work), then in such case the claim may be held to have been relinquished by him or them.

The Regulation of the Sandhurst Local Court, No. IX., gazetted on the 27th of August, 1856, is hereby annulled.
