## VACCINATION DISTRICTS.

## PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Major-General MACARTHUR, the Senior Military Officer in Command of Her Majesty's Land Forces in the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of the Colony of Victoria, passed in the eighteenth year of Her present Majesty's Reign, intitled, "An Act to make compulsory the practice of Vaccination," it was amongst other things enacted that it should be lawful for His Excellency the Lieutenant Governor, by Proclamation in the Government Gazette, to divide the Colony of Victoria into convenient districts for the purpose of affording facilities for vaccination; And whereas by three several Proclamations, bearing date respectively the twenty-second day of December, A.D. 1854, and the twenty-sixth day of February, and sixteenth day of April, A.D. 1855, the districts of Portland, Balmoral, Harrow, and Casterton, were proclaimed to be Vaccination Districts; And whereas it is expedient to define the said districts, and to constitute other districts in addition thereto to be Vaccination Districts: Now therefore I, Major-General Macarthur, the Senior Military Officer and Officer administering the Government of Victoria, do hereby revoke so much of the said Proclamations as relates to the districts hereinbefore named. And I do by this my Proclamation appoint the districts hereinafter named to be districts for the purpose of affording facilities for vaccination, in accordance with the said Act, that is to say:—

**BALMORAL.**—Bounded on the west by the range between Mather's Creek and the Pigeon Ponds; on the north by the River Glenelg to the Serra Range; on the east by the Serra Range; and on the south by a line west, the Dundas Range, and the range at the source of Mather's Creek.

**CASTERTON.**—Bounded on the north-west and north by the River Wando and a road bearing west to the western frontier; on the west by the western frontier; on the south and south-east by the Glenelg River to Dartmoor; thence eastward by a creek unnamed to Hotspur; on the east by the main road through Hotspur, Digby, and Merino, to the River Wannon; thence by the River Wannon to the Koroite River; thence by the western branch of that river to its source; and thence by the dividing range to the source of the River Wando.

**COLERAINE.**—Bounded on the north by the dividing range at the sources of the River Dundas and a line easterly to the Serra Range; on the south-east by a line bearing south-west to the junction of the Grange Burn with the River Wannon; on the south by the River Wannon; and on the west by the Koroite River.

**HAMILTON.**—Bounded on the west by the main road passing through Hotspur, Digby, and Merino, to the River Wannon; thence by the River Wannon to its junction with the Grange Burn; thence by a line north-easterly to the Serra Range;

thence on the east by the Serra Range and the dividing range between the waters flowing to the Grange Burn and the River Hopkins to Mount Rouse; thence on the south by a line west to the Eumeralla River; and thence by that river and a line west to Hotspur.

**HARROW.**—Bounded on the south-east by the River Wando; on the south from the junction of the River Wando with the River Glenelg by a road bearing west to the western frontier; on the west by the western frontier; on the north by the northern boundary of the county of Follett, and by part of the northern boundary of the county of Dundas; and on the east by the dividing range between the Pigeon Ponds and Mather's Creek.

**PORTLAND.**—Bounded on the north by the River Glenelg and by a creek unnamed to Hotspur; thence by a line east to the Eumeralla River; on the east by the Eumeralla River to the sea coast; and on the south by the sea coast to the mouth of the River Glenelg.

## MAURITIUS—QUARANTINE FOR CHOLERA DISCONTINUED.

## PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Major-General MACARTHUR, the Senior Military Officer in Command of Her Majesty's Land Forces in the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by a Proclamation bearing date the twelfth day of June, in the present year, it was directed that all ships and vessels arriving in this Colony from the Island of Mauritius, on board of which the disease called Cholera should be at, or should have appeared previously to, the arrival thereof in this Colony from the said Island, and the crews and passengers of such ships and vessels should in every case perform Quarantine for a period of not less than thirty clear days from the convalescence of the last case of Cholera; and if no case of Cholera should have appeared on board of such ships and vessels, nevertheless such ships and vessels, and the crews and passengers on board thereof, should perform Quarantine for a period of three clear days: And whereas it has become unnecessary to subject such vessels and persons to the performance of Quarantine: Now therefore I, Major General

Macarthur, the Senior Military Officer and Officer administering the Government of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby revoke the said Proclamation.

WARANGA.

REGULATIONS made by the Local Court of the District of Waranga:—

i. *Quartz mining, extent of claim.*—The extent of quartz claim to which each Miner's Right shall entitle the holder shall be

For one miner, twenty (20) feet } along the vein,  
" two miners, thirty-five (35) feet } with the dip,  
" three miners, fifty (50) feet }  
" four miners, sixty (60) feet }

ii. *Breadth of claim in quartz mining.*—For the purpose of depositing the refuse and ore produced from the claim, in all cases (where practicable) a space of ten (10) yards on each side of the claim opened will be allowed.

iii. *Extent of alluvial claim.*—The extent of claim in alluvial workings shall be:—For one miner, twenty (20) feet by twenty (20) feet.

iv. *Protection to cart tracks.*—No cart track shall be interfered with without the permission of the Local Court or Warden.

v. *Thorough working of claims compulsory.*—After the date hereof it shall be imperative for every miner or party of miners to thoroughly work his or their claims.

The foregoing Regulations, Nos. i. to v., have been assented to by His Excellency the Officer administering the Government, with the advice of the Executive Council.
