COUNTY COURT DISTRICTS OF CASTLEMAINE AND CARISBROOK.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Major-General MACARTHUR, the Senior Military Officer in Command of Her Majesty's Land Forces in the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by a Proclamation bearing date the twenty-eighth day of December, in the year of Our Lord One thousand eight hundred and fifty-four, it was declared and appointed that certain County Courts should be established and holden in and for the respective portions of the said Colony, including counties and parts of counties thereafter described: And whereas it is expedient to alter certain of the said Courts as hereinafter mentioned, and the places and districts in and for which the same shall have jurisdiction, and the limits thereof, and to appoint that County Courts shall be holden in and for the places and districts hereinafter described and defined: Now therefore I, Major-General Macarthur, the Senior Military Officer and Officer administering the Government of Victoria, by virtue of the powers vested in me in that behalf, do hereby alter the County Courts of Castlemaine and Carisbrook, being certain of the said Courts mentioned in the said Proclamation, and the portions of the said Colony in and for which they shall have jurisdiction, and the limits thereof as hereinafter mentioned, that is to say:—

The County Court of CASTLEMAINE, having jurisdiction and to be holden in and for all that portion of the said Colony of which the boundaries are hereby defined as follows, that is to say:—Commencing at the source of the most western branch of the Deep Creek in the Great Dividing Range; thence by that range and the boundaries of the county of Talbot to the most northern part of the said county north of Mount Alexander; thence by a line bearing westerly to the junction of McNeil's Creek with the Loddon river at Thalack Thalack; thence by a line south-easterly and by the Dividing Range between the waters flowing to Joyce's Creek and the Deep Creek to a point due east of the junction of the Bullarook Creek and the Deep Creek; thence by the most western branch of that creek to the Great Dividing Range at the commencing point aforesaid.

The County Court of CARISBROOK, having jurisdiction and to be holden in and for all that portion of the said Colony of which the boundaries are hereby defined as follows, that is to say:—Commencing at the source of the River Avoca in the Great Dividing Range; thence by that range to the source of the most western branch of the Deep Creek; thence by the most western branch of that creek upwards to its junction with the Bullarook Creek; thence east to the Dividing Range between the waters flowing to Joyce's Creek and the Deep Creek; thence by that range and by a line north-westerly to the junction of McNeil's Creek with the River Loddon; thence by the rivers Loddon and Murray to the western boundary of the township reserve at Castle Donnington; thence by a line south-easterly to Lake Bael Bael and the River Avoca; and thence by the River Avoca to its source in the Great Dividing Range, the commencing point aforesaid.

MUNICIPALITY OF BALLAARAT.

BYE-LAW No. 7.—A BYE-LAW TO PROVIDE FOR THE NECESSARY SUPPLY OF WATER FOR DOMESTIC, SANITARY, AND OTHER PURPOSES, FROM YULLE'S SWAMP.

WHEREAS an Act of the Governor and Legislative Council of Victoria was passed in the eighteenth year of Her Majesty Queen Victoria, No. 15, intitled, "An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria," whereby it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be competent for the Council of any municipal district to make bye-laws for securing the necessary supply of water for domestic, sanitary, or irrigation purposes, and that no such bye-law should have any force or effect until the Lieutenant Governor should under his hand have signified his assent thereto, and when such bye-law should have been consented to, the Lieutenant Governor should cause publicity to be given thereto in such manner as he should see fit; And whereas it is expedient to make a bye-law to secure the necessary supply of water for domestic, sanitary, and other purposes; And whereas the said bye-law was approved of by His Excellency, and His Excellency has caused the same to be duly published in the *Government Gazette*: Be it therefore enacted by the Council of the Municipality of Ballarat in Council assembled, that from and after the date of this bye-law coming into operation, no person or persons shall erect or cause to be erected any tank or pump for the supplying of water from the said swamp, or shall cut any drain, or

lay down any pipe or pipes for extracting the water from the said swamp, or shall in any manner extract or foul such water without the consent and authority of the Municipal Council of the said district; and any person offending against this bye-law shall, on conviction before two justices, forfeit a sum not exceeding fifty pounds.

And be it further directed that the tanks and pumps now erected may be valued by valuers, one to be appointed by the Municipal Council and the other by the owners of such tanks and pumps, or by an umpire to be appointed by such valuers; and the Municipal Council shall purchase the said tanks and pumps at the value so fixed; and in case the owner or owners of the said tanks and pumps shall not agree to the valuation so affixed, they shall remove or cause to be removed such tanks or pumps within twenty days, on receipt of a notice signed by the Chairman of the said district, otherwise the said Council may remove the same.

The foregoing Bye-law, No. 7, made by the Municipal Council of Ballarat, has been assented to by His Excellency the Officer administering the Government, with the advice of the Executive Council.
