MUNICIPALITY OF BALLAARAT.

BYE-LAW No. 8.—A BYE-LAW TO PROVIDE FOR THE FORMATION OF CROSSINGS OVER FOOTWAYS.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of the Colony of Victoria, made and passed in the eighteenth year of the Reign of Her Majesty Queen Victoria, No. 15, intituled, "An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria," it is amongst other things enacted that the Council of any Municipal District established under the provisions of the said Act, "shall have the care and management of the roads, public streets, paths and public thoroughfares," and shall and may make such bye-laws for carrying out these objects as shall to such Council seem fit: Be it therefore ordered and directed that from and after the date of this bye-law coming into operation, all such crossing places shall be made and maintained in the form, manner, and of the materials described in the several schedules, marked A, B and C respectively, to this bye-law annexed.

2. And be it further ordered, all persons crossing any formed water channel or footpath, or causing such to be crossed with or by any cart, dray or other wheeled vehicle, excepting the channels in the carriage-ways at the intersections of the public streets, unless over and by means of a crossing place formed in one or other of the manners hereinafter stated, and any persons neglecting or refusing to comply with any other provisions of this bye-law, on conviction before two or more Justices of the Peace shall forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Fifty pounds, as enacted by the 35th section of the 18th Victoria No. 15.

It shall be lawful for the said Municipal Council also whenever it appears that carts or other wheeled vehicles habitually and frequently cross any formed channel and footpath to any right-of-way, yard, or other premises, without a crossing place having been made as hereinbefore stated, to form such a crossing place and recover the expense and cost of its construction from the owner or occupier of the premises entered by its use; and in case of common right-of-way from the several owners and occupiers of the premises forming the boundaries thereof, or to which it is appurtenant; and any person refusing or neglecting to pay the amount owing for such construction in the manner aforesaid, shall be liable to the penalty hereinbefore stated for a breach of this bye-law.

SCHEDULE A.

Crossings of footways in streets where a stone kerb is now laid or hereafter shall be laid.—The crossing shall be paved the whole width of the footpath, commencing from the exterior of the side channel, with a slope to run out at four feet or less in the wide streets, and two feet six inches or less in the narrow streets from the outer edge of the kerb, from which

line the paving shall follow the slope of the footpath and be level therewith until it meets the outer edge of the footpath, and the length of the crossing measured longitudinally with respect to the street shall not be less than seven feet, nor more than twenty feet. The paving shall be laid in regular courses of an uniform width, each stone being not less than eight inches square on the surface and not less than nine inches deep, squared and laid on a good and solid bed of gravel, broken metal or concrete, and properly rammed. The paving shall be enclosed on each side for the width of the footpath and returned for its entire length by a properly axed kerb, uniform and corresponding with the kerb of the street, which kerb at its junction with the kerb of the street shall terminate continuously with it on each side in the segment of a circle, turned or described from a radius of the length of one-third of the breadth of the footpath. The whole paving and kerb shall be composed of granite, bluestone, ironstone, or of such other durable stone as the Town Surveyor for the time being shall approve. The kerbing shall be neatly squared on the exposed portions, and be in lengths of not less than one foot six inches by two feet in depth, and finished at least eight inches thick.

SCHEDULE B.

Crossings of footways in streets where a stone kerb has not been laid down.—The crossings to be in every respect the same as the crossings in the foregoing Schedule A, with the exception that no kerb stone need be laid down; provided, however, that so soon as the stone kerb is laid down in the usual line of the street by the Municipal Council, the said crossing places shall forthwith be constructed in strict accordance with the foregoing Schedule A; and provided further, that the paving shall be continued from the edge of the footwalk towards the centre of the street in the proper form of the side channel thereof for the space of four feet; provided nevertheless that where the street is not formed according to the level fixed from time to time by the said Council, such crossing shall be made of properly macadamised stone.

SCHEDULE C.

In streets not formed where drains are or may hereafter be cut along the line of the water channel, suitable timber crossings or bridges shall be laid over such drain, leaving sufficient water-way underneath, and the footpath from the end of the bridge to the building line must be laid with timber or macadamised stone. The person or persons using such crossing shall at his, her or their own expense, when the street is formed, remove the said bridge and substitute a crossing, in accordance with the foregoing schedules.

The foregoing Bye-law, No. 8, made by the Municipal Council of Ballarat, has been assented to by His Excellency the Officer administering the Government, with the advice of the Executive Council.

MUNICIPALITY OF CASTLEMAINE.

BYE-LAW, No. 9.—FOR REMOVING THE BODIES FROM THE OLD CEMETERY, IN TEMPLETON-STREET, TO THE NEW CEMETERY, CAMPBELL'S CREEK.

WHEREAS by the Act of Council, 18 Victoria No. 15, intituled, "An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria," the Council of any Municipal District has the care and management of public streets and cemeteries, &c.; And whereas a cemetery formerly existed on land in the bush, which now occupies a large space in the centre of Templeton-street, one of the principal streets in the centre of this township, which cemetery was formed before the township was laid out, and no bodies having been therein interred for about four years, and it being now necessary that said street should be opened up, and it being highly inexpedient that said cemetery should remain and the bodies therein interred be subject to rude removal or disturbance by reason of the roadway or any future excavations, such as laying foundations, levelling, cutting drains, or laying down sewers, water pipes, gas pipes, or other needful works consequent on the rapid advancement of this township: Be it therefore ordered and enacted by the Municipal Council of Castlemaine that a contract be taken forthwith for the removal of all bodies or remains of bodies to be found in the Old Cemetery, in Templeton-street, to the New Cemetery, Campbell's Creek, together with any palings, head boards or other marks about the same; that separate graves be prepared for such as be found separately interred; that all remains found without coffins be placed in new coffins; and that the whole thereof be conveyed to, and interred in, the New Cemetery, with all proper decency and order, under the superintendence and with the attendance of this Municipal Council.

The foregoing Bye-law, No. 9, made by the Municipal Council of Castlemaine, has been assented to by His Excellency the Officer administering the Government, with the advice of the Executive Council.

The petitioners state that the district of St. Kilda, without the city of Melbourne, was, by Proclamation bearing date the 23rd of April, 1855, constituted a municipal district by the name of the Municipality of St. Kilda.

That it has been found that the limits and boundaries of the said municipal district, as defined in the said Proclamation, are not suited for the successful establishment of a municipality therein, and it is desired that they may be altered so as to render them more suitable and at the same time to include the portion of St. Kilda at present comprised within the city of Melbourne, the majority of the householders resident in that locality desiring such inclusion.

And the petitioners pray as follows:—
"Your Excellency's petitioners therefore pray that Your Excellency will be pleased, with the advice of the Honorable the Executive Council, to vary and alter the limits and boundaries of the said municipal district, and to proclaim the limits and boundaries of the land described in the schedule marked A hereunto annexed as the limits and boundaries of the municipal district constituting the Municipality of St. Kilda."

Schedule A above referred to.

"Commencing at the boundary post at Hobson's Bay where the boundary of the Municipality of Emerald Hill terminates; thence in an easterly direction following the boundary line of the said municipal district to its junction with the Brighton road; thence across the Brighton road through the centre of the High Holborn road to the centre of the Punt road; thence in a southerly direction along the centre of the same road to Wellington-street, or known as the Great Dandenong road; thence easterly along the centre of the Dandenong road to the north-east angle of allotment 154 B; thence south along the centre of a road unnamed to its junction with the Western Port road; thence in a line along the centre of the same road to the Glen Huntley road; thence westward along the centre of the same road to its junction with the Punt road; thence southerly along the centre of the same road to Hobson's Bay; thence northerly along the high water mark to the commencing point."

TOWN AND COUNTRY POLICE ACT, SECTIONS V. TO IX., EXTENDED TO KYNETON.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Major-General MACARTHUR, the Senior Military Officer in Command of Her Majesty's Land Forces in the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by a Proclamation under the Hand of the Lieutenant Governor and the Seal of the Colony, bearing date the twenty-eighth day of December, in the year One thousand eight hundred and fifty-four, the sections numbered V., VI., VII., VIII. and IX. of a certain Act of the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of the Colony of Victoria, passed in the eighteenth year of the Reign of Her present Majesty, intituled, "*An Act to provide for the Management of Towns and other places in Victoria,*" were extended to the township of Kyneton: And whereas the boundaries of the said township of Kyneton have been enlarged since the date of the said Proclamation: Now therefore I, Major-General Macarthur, the Senior Military Officer and Officer administering the Government of Victoria, in pursuance of the authority of the said Act, do by this my Proclamation declare and appoint that the sections of the said Act numbered V., VI., VII., VIII. and IX. shall extend to and operate within the township of Kyneton (including therein East Kyneton), the boundaries whereof are as follow, that is to say:—Commencing at the north-east angle of suburban portion XVIII., parish of Lauriston; thence south by the west side of a Government road to the River Campaspe; thence following the course of the Campaspe westward and northward to the north-west angle of the township Reserve of Kyneton; and thence by a line bearing east to the commencing point aforesaid.

WHEREAS by a Proclamation bearing date the twenty-seventh day of December, in the year One thousand eight hundred and fifty-five, the Governor of Victoria did order, direct and appoint that Circuit Courts should be holden at the town of Geelong, in the Geelong Circuit District; at the town of Portland, in the Portland Circuit District; and at Castlemaine, within the Northern Circuit District, on the days therein named and appointed, until otherwise ordered: And whereas by a Proclamation bearing date the third day of November instant, the said Circuit Districts were altered, and new Circuit Districts were appointed; and it was directed and appointed that Circuit Courts should be holden within the districts therein described; And whereas it is expedient to appoint times for holding such Circuit Courts:

Now, therefore, I, Major General Macarthur, the Senior Military Officer and Officer administering the Government of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby order, direct and appoint that the Circuit Courts appointed to be holden by the last-mentioned Proclamation shall be holden at the times hereinafter stated during the year One thousand eight hundred and fifty-seven, and every following year until otherwise ordered, that is to say:—

The Circuit Court in the Geelong Circuit District shall be holden at Geelong on the 2nd day of February, the 15th day of April, the 10th day of July, and the 10th day of October.

The Circuit Court in the Ballarat Circuit District shall be holden at Ballarat on the 12th day of February, the 25th day of April, the 20th day of July, and the 20th day of October.

The Circuit Court in the Castlemaine Circuit District shall be holden at Castlemaine on the 20th day of February, the 4th day of May, the 28th day of July, and the 28th day of October.

The Circuit Court in the Sandhurst Circuit District shall be holden at Sandhurst on the 27th day of February, the 14th day of May, the 4th day of August, and the 4th day of November.

The Circuit Court in the Beechworth Circuit District shall be holden at Beechworth on the 6th day of April and the 4th day of November.

The Circuit Court in the Portland Circuit District shall be holden at Portland on the 16th day of April and the 15th day of October.

And with the advice aforesaid, I do order and direct that if any of the several days aforesaid shall happen to fall on a Sunday or Good Friday, the Court or Courts appointed to be holden on that day shall commence and be holden on the day next following. And I do also order and direct that if the Judge or Judges appointed to hold such Courts respectively as aforesaid shall not arrive at any of the said places in time to open any of such Courts on the days so appointed respectively as aforesaid, such Court or Courts may be opened and held on any day or days following such day so appointed as aforesaid.

Printed forms of tender may be obtained from the Colonial Storekeeper, Melbourne, or the officer in charge of the police at each station, by whom also any information or explanation will be afforded to persons tendering.

The tenders for each station must be separate, and will be accepted or rejected separately.

At stations where oats and bran cannot readily be procured, the tenders may be for hay or straw only. When all the supplies are included in one tender, it will, if advisable, be accepted for hay and not for the other articles.

The price must be per ton for hay and straw, and per bushel for oats and bran, including delivery at the stations and all charges.

The net weight only, after deducting the tare, is to be charged.

No tender will be entertained unless accompanied by a certificate from two responsible persons that they are willing to become bound as sureties for the due fulfilment of the contract in one-third the estimated cost of the entire supply at the station tendered for; and in the event of the tender being accepted, the bond must be executed within twenty days, failing which, the contract will be again advertised or another tender accepted.

The names and addresses of the tenderers and of their proposed sureties must be stated at full length.

All tenders must be enclosed in a separate envelope, marked "Tender for —" (as the case may be), and be deposited in the Tender Box at the Colonial Stores, Great Bourke-street west, or if sent by post, they must be addressed to the Colonial Storekeeper, Melbourne.

The Government will not necessarily accept the lowest or any tender.

The decision of the Government will be made known on the 1st December, 1856.

CONDITIONS.

1. The hay to be eaten, good, sound and sweet; straw to be wheat, and both to be in all respects of the best quality; oats and bran to be also of the best description, sound and sweet.

2. The delivery to be made at such times, and in such quantities, as may be required by the officer of police in charge of the station. The quantity stated in the schedule must be considered as approximative only, and it must be understood that the Government will draw either more or less than is there given. The excess over the estimate will however in no case exceed 50 per cent.

3. The contracts entered into under this notice are not to be considered as being infringed or vitiated by any contracts made by the Military Commissariat.

4. The forage when delivered must be accompanied by an invoice of quantity, shewing the gross weight, the tare, and

the net weight. The invoice must be left with the officer in charge of the station, and without it no forage will be received.

5. Whenever forage shall be delivered at a station, a receipt is to be taken from the officer in charge for the net quantity, and the receipt must be rendered in support of the contractor's account.

6. Each contractor will be required to prepare his own account monthly, in the prescribed form, and on presentation thereof in a complete state to the Colonial Storekeeper for examination, it will be forwarded through the proper channel for payment at the Treasury, or the Sub-Treasury of the District.

7. Should forage duly ordered under these contracts not be delivered within forty-eight hours from a reasonable time to be fixed by the officer in charge of the station, it will be competent for the Head of the Department, or officer in charge, should circumstances require it, to purchase the same at the risk of the contractor, from whose account any expense over and above the contract price is to be deducted.

8. In the event of a difference of opinion between the contractor and the officer receiving the forage as to the quality of the same, it is to be decided by a Board of Survey, composed of persons named by the Head of a Department, and the decision of the Board is to be considered final.

9. If the Board shall decide that the forage is not of proper quality it must be immediately replaced by the contractor, failing which, it will be procured elsewhere, and the expense, if any, will be charged as in clause 7.

10. When a Board of Survey cannot be conveniently assembled, or when from some other cause injury would accrue either to the public service or to the contractor by waiting for a Board of Survey, the officer in charge will have the power to reject such supplies as are obviously of inferior quality, it being understood that he will be responsible to the Government for so doing, and the contractor must take back the rejected forage and supply good in its stead, failing which, it will be obtained by the officer requiring it, and the expense will be charged as in clause 7.

11.
