PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Major-General MACARTHUR, the Senior Military Officer in Command of Her Majesty's Land Forces in the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by a Proclamation bearing date the twenty-seventh day of December, in the year One thousand eight hundred and fifty-five, the times and places for holding the Courts of General Sessions in Victoria were declared and appointed; And whereas by another Proclamation bearing date the twelfth day of July, in the year One thousand eight hundred and fifty-six, a Court of General Sessions for the District of Kyneton was established, and the times for holding the same appointed; And whereas it is expedient to appoint other times for holding all the said Courts of General Sessions: Now therefore I, Major-General Macarthur, the Senior Military Officer and Officer administering the Government of Victoria, by virtue of the powers vested in me in this behalf, do hereby appoint that the several Courts of General Sessions hereinafter mentioned shall, during the year One thousand eight hundred and fifty-seven, and all subsequent years, until otherwise ordered, be holden respectively at the several places and times following, that is to say:—

The Court of General Sessions for Bourke, at Melbourne, on the second day of the respective months of February and March, the first day of the respective months of April, May, June, July, August, September and October, the second day of November, and the first day of December.

The Court of General Sessions for Grant, at Geelong, on the twentieth day of March, the twentieth day of June, the twenty-first day of September, and the twentieth day of November.

The Court of General Sessions for Buninyong and Ballarat, at Ballarat, on the seventeenth day of March, the twenty-fourth day of June, the twenty-fourth day of September, and the tenth day of December.

The Court of General Sessions for Warrnambool, at Warrnambool, on the twentieth day of February, the seventh day of May, the seventh day of August, and the second day of November.

The Court of General Sessions for Belfast, at Belfast, on the seventeenth day of February, the twelfth day of May, the twelfth day of August, and the seventh day of November.

The Court of General Sessions for the Grange, at Hamilton, on the twentieth day of May, and the thirteenth day of November.

The Court of General Sessions for Portland, at Portland, on the twelfth day of February, the twenty-fifth day of May, the seventeenth day of August, and the eleventh day of November.

The Court of General Sessions for Kilmore, at Kilmore, on the twelfth day of January, the thirtieth day of March, the twentieth day of June, and the fifth day of September.

The Court of General Sessions for Kyneton, at Kyneton, on the seventeenth day of January, the third day of April, the twenty-sixth day of June, and the twelfth day of September.

The Court of General Sessions for Castlemaine, at Castlemaine, on the twenty-first day of January, the sixth day of April, the thirtieth day of June, and the sixteenth day of September.

The Court of General Sessions for Chrisbrook, at Chrisbrook, on the twenty-sixth day of January, the sixteenth day of April, the tenth day of July, and the twenty-fifth day of September.

The Court of General Sessions for Sandhurst, at Sandhurst, on the fourth day of February, the twenty-seventh day of April, the sixteenth day of July, and the sixth day of October.

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The Court of General Sessions for Beechworth, at Beechworth, on the sixteenth day of February, the ninth day of May, the thirtieth day of July, and the nineteenth day of October.

The Court of General Sessions for Gipps' Land, at Alberton, on the fourteenth day of March, the twentieth day of August, and the sixteenth day of November.

And I do hereby further declare and appoint that if any of the aforesaid days shall happen to fall on a Sunday or on Good Friday, any of the said Courts appointed to be held on such day, shall commence and be held on the day next following.

And I do also declare and appoint that if the Chairman of any of the said Courts of General Sessions shall not arrive at any of the said places in time to open any of such Courts on the days so appointed respectively as aforesaid, such Court may be opened and held on any day or days following such day so appointed as aforesaid.

The County Court of Warrnambool, at Warrnambool, on the twentieth day of February, the seventh day of May, the seventh day of August, and the second day of November.

The County Court of Villiers, at Belfast, on the seventeenth day of February, the twelfth day of May, the twelfth day of August, and the seventh day of November.

The County Court of Dundas, at Hamilton, on the twentieth day of May, and the thirteenth day of November.

The County Court of Portland, at Portland, on the twelfth day of February, the twenty-fifth day of May, the seventeenth day of August, and the eleventh day of November.

—, IN THE PARISH OF TALLAROOK.

NOTICE is hereby given that a map and survey plan, describing exact course and bearings of, and the measurements required for, a road through portion 18, section —, in the parish of Tallarook, proposed to be made by the Central Road Board, together with a description of the lands through which the same is proposed to pass, and the names of the owners and occupiers thereof, so far as known, and also an estimate of the expense of the said work have been deposited in the Office of the Honorable the Surveyor General, Melbourne, the particulars of which are as follow:—

PETITION FOR ALTERATION OF BOUNDARIES.

IN pursuance of the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, His Excellency the Officer administering the Government, with the advice of the Executive Council, has directed the publication of the substance and prayer of a petition to His Excellency, as hereinafter set forth, signed by three hundred and one householders residing within the municipal district of St. Kilda, and in the portion of St. Kilda at present included within the limits of the city of Melbourne.

By His Excellency's Command,
WILLIAM C. HAINES.

The petitioners state that the district of St. Kilda, without the city of Melbourne, was, by Proclamation bearing date the 23rd of April, 1855, constituted a municipal district by the name of the Municipality of St. Kilda.

That it has been found that the limits and boundaries of the said municipal district, as defined in the said Proclamation, are not suited for the successful establishment of a municipality therein, and it is desired that they may be altered so as to render them more suitable and at the same time to include the portion of St. Kilda at present comprised within the city of Melbourne, the majority of the householders resident in that locality desiring such inclusion.

And the petitioners pray as follows:—

"Your Excellency's petitioners therefore pray that Your Excellency will be pleased, with the advice of the Honorable the Executive Council, to vary and alter the limits and boundaries of the said municipal district, and to proclaim the limits and boundaries of the land described in the schedule marked A hereunto annexed as the limits and boundaries of the municipal district constituting the Municipality of St. Kilda."

Schedule A above referred to.

"Commencing at the boundary post at Hobson's Bay where the boundary of the Municipality of Emerald Hill terminates; thence in an easterly direction following the boundary line of the said municipal district to its junction with the Brighton road; thence across the Brighton road through the centre of the High Holborn road to the centre of the Punt road; thence in a southerly direction along the centre of the same road to Wellington-street, or known as the Great Dandenong road; thence easterly along the centre of the Dandenong road to the north-east angle of allotment 154 B; thence south along the centre of a road unnamed to its junction with the Western Port road; thence in a line along the centre of the same road to the Glen Huntley road; thence westward along the centre of the same road to its junction with the Punt road; thence southerly along the centre of the same road to Hobson's Bay; thence northerly along the high water mark to the commencing point."

The petitioners state that they are desirous of maintaining in proper repair the foot and carriage ways of streets and roads in front of the dwellings and property of the ratepayers along the municipal boundaries, which are at present limited to the front line of houses or land in Victoria-street, Victoria Parade, Smith-street, and Heidelberg-road, but are unable legally to effect such objects without the extension of the municipal boundaries so as to include therein such footways and the half of such carriage ways, excepting as regards Victoria Parade, of which thirty-three feet from the outer line of the foot-way on the north side will suffice.

That, deeply impressed with the necessity for spacious areas for the health and recreation of the residents of the municipality, a portion of which is densely populated, and anticipating a large accession of population, they desire to bring under notice that the Municipal Council have petitioned for a grant of Studley Park reserve as a place of recreation.
