PASSAGE OF BAGGAGE AND GOLD ACROSS THE
ISTHMUS OF SUEZ.

additional facilities granted by the Transit Administration to
the passage of Baggage and Gold across the Isthmus of Suez,
is published for general information.

My Lord,—As a proof of the Viceroy's wish to consult
the convenience of passengers proceeding to and from India
through Egypt, I may mention two alterations to which he
has readily consented on my proposing them.

Hitherto the amount of baggage conveyed gratis by the
Transit Administration across the Isthmus was smaller than
that allowed to passengers by the Peninsular and Oriental
Company.

On representing to His Highness the inconvenience to which
this arrangement subjected the passengers, he at once ordered
the rates to be equalized, though this measure is attended with
a diminution of the transit revenue.

I also stated to him that Her Majesty's Government was
about to establish a monthly line of steamers from Australia to
Suez, and that a considerable portion of the Australian gold
might be expected to pass through Egypt if the charge for
specie were reduced from 7s. 6d. per £100 to 5s. The Viceroy
has adopted this proposal, thereby affording a considerable ad-
vantage to whatever company obtain the contract for the
above service.

I may also state to your Lordship, that His Highness has
promoted Mr. Luquin, Director of the Transit and Railway
Administration, to the rank of Bey, thus placing a Christian
and an Englishman to the head of the Turkish Administration.

REGULATIONS FOR PASSENGER VESSELS BOUND
TO CHINESE PORTS.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Major-General MACARTHUR, the Senior
Military Officer in Command of Her Majesty's Land Forces
in the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by a Proclamation dated the twelfth day of
February in the present year, it was amongst other
things declared that the scale of diet for the use of passengers
during the voyages from any port or place in Victoria, together
with the Medicines, Medical Comforts, Medical Instruments,
and other matters which should be deemed necessary for the
medical treatment of the passengers during such voyages,
should be those set forth in the schedule thereunto annexed;
And whereas it is expedient that an amended scale of diet,
should be appointed for ships carrying passengers to any port
in China, including the British and Portuguese possessions in
the Chinese seas, from any port or place in Victoria: Now
therefore I, Major-General Macarthur, the Senior Military
Officer and Officer administering the Government of Victoria,
by this my Proclamation, and by virtue of the powers in me
vested by the ninety-seventh section of an Act of the Imperial
Parliament of Great Britain and Ireland, passed in the session
held in the eighteenth and nineteenth years of Her Majesty's
Reign, intituled, "*An Act to amend the Law relating to the
carriage of Passengers by Sea*," do hereby declare that the
Master of every vessel carrying passengers from any port or
place in Victoria to any port or place in China, including the
British and Portuguese possessions in the Chinese seas, on any
voyage deemed to be of more than fourteen days duration,
shall, during such voyage (including the time of detention, if
any, at any port or place before the termination of such
voyage) supply the passengers on board with provisions, fuel
and water, according to the following scale:—

DIETARY SCALE.

exclusive of the quantity specified in the 31st section of the

ment of the passengers during the voyage shall be as follows,

PETITION FOR ALTERATION OF BOUNDARIES.

IN pursuance of the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, His Excellency the Officer administering the Government, with the advice of the Executive Council, has directed the publication of the substance and prayer of a petition to His Excellency, as hereinafter set forth, signed by three hundred and one householders residing within the municipal district of St. Kilda, and in the portion of St. Kilda at present included within the limits of the city of Melbourne.

The petitioners state that the district of St. Kilda, without the city of Melbourne, was, by Proclamation bearing date the 23rd of April, 1855, constituted a municipal district by the name of the Municipality of St. Kilda.

That it has been found that the limits and boundaries of the said municipal district, as defined in the said Proclamation, are not suited for the successful establishment of a municipality therein, and it is desired that they may be altered so as to render them more suitable and at the same time to include the portion of St. Kilda at present comprised within the city of Melbourne, the majority of the householders resident in that locality desiring such inclusion.
