LOCAL COURT REGULATIONS.

STEIGLITZ.

REGULATIONS made by the Local Court of the District of Steiglitz:—

i. *Claims on quartz reefs.*—The length of claim along the reef shall be

For one man 20 feet.
For two men 40 feet.
For three men 60 feet.
For four men 80 feet.

A greater area than the last mentioned shall not be held in one claim, and the boundaries of each claim shall be a line running east and west through the end pegs.

ii. *Width of quartz claims, &c.*—The width of claim shall be thirty yards on both sides of the reef, with all its dips and angles; the measurement to be made from the centre of the reef: Provided that where the reef diverges much from its general course, and it is struck upon by parties sinking beyond the said width of thirty yards, the claim on the reef shall in such case be given to the party which first commenced to sink for the reef, upon its satisfactorily proving that the search for it had been all along efficiently prosecuted: Provided also, when a dispute arises in such case, that each select a person to inspect the ground with the surveyor: Provided further, that the double banking of claims on the known course of the reef shall not be allowed.

iii. *Registration of claims.*—The claims which have been worked previously to these rules being passed must be registered in the names of the *bona fide* owners within fourteen days after they are posted at the several reefs, and other claims must be registered when occupation of them takes place.

iv. *Claims to be marked by pegs.*—The divisions and boundaries of claims must be marked by strong pegs kept constantly in their places; and the southern peg of each claim on the reef must have the number of it, in figures, not less than six inches, attached to it in a conspicuous manner.

v. *Plurality of shares in claims obtained by purchase allowed.* Persons who obtain shares by *bona fide* purchase shall be allowed to hold any number of them in one claim or in several claims, on one reef or on several reefs, provided that each share be efficiently worked by a substitute in conformity with the regulations.

vi. *Transfers of shares to be registered.*—When the purchase of a share or shares, or portion of a share has been effected, the purchaser shall at once proceed with the seller, or with his written authority for transfer, to the Registrar, and have his name, the date of sale, and particular share, entered by the latter on his records, and placed upon the registration ticket at an early date.

vii. *Wet sinkings.*—When a flow of water is struck upon in a particular claim, the holders of that claim and of the eight adjacent claims, either from one end or from both ends of such claims, shall work every day (Sundays excepted), and all day or day and night, as may be necessary to keep the water down, provided that the holders may unite to work the said claims upon obtaining the sanction of the Local Court.

viii. *Allowance to discoverers of new reefs.*—A hundred feet shall be allowed along a new reef to the discoverer, provided that the discovery be made known to the acting warden without delay.

ix. *Claims on alluvial dry sinkings.*—The extent of ground allowed on alluvial dry sinkings shall be for one man twelve feet by twenty-four feet, and for two men twenty-four feet by twenty-four feet, the maximum size of each said claim.

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x. *Claims on alluvial wet sinkings.*—The extent of claim on alluvial wet sinkings shall be thirty-six feet by thirty-six feet for two men or more, the maximum size of each said claim.

xi. *Rules applicable to quartz and alluvial workings equally.*—Rules 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, and 13, shall be in force on alluvial sinkings.

xii. *Reward for discovery of new lead.*—A hundred feet square shall be given to the discoverer of a new lead in alluvial sinkings, upon making known the discovery at once to the acting warden.

xiii. *Forcible seizure of claims prohibited.*—To prohibit the forcible occupation of claims which have been at all worked, it shall be held necessary as a preliminary step without which possession will not be given, that where a claim or share is supposed to have become forfeited or abandoned, the former holders, if on the gold fields and in the habit of frequenting it, be served with written notice of intention to occupy; and on proof of service of notice, or of posting of it at the claim for twenty-four hours when the holders are not known, the acting Warden shall, either with assessors or without them, as may be required by the Act 18 Victoria No. 37, decide the possession of it.

xiv. *Applications for erection of quartz crushing machines.*—The sanction of the acting Warden must be obtained for the erection of crushing machines in the first instance, upon application being made in writing, describing accurately the proposed site.

xv. *Plurality of quartz claims.*—The holding by original occupation of more than one claim on the same reef by the same party shall not be allowed.

xvi. *Claims on abandoned ground.*—On abandoned ground the claims on reefs and on alluvial sinkings shall be double the area and extent allowed to each claim respectively under these Regulations in new ground.

xvii. *Reservation of water holes for domestic uses.*—A sufficient number of the best water holes shall be reserved by the Acting Warden for the use of the inhabitants of these gold fields, and any person found guilty of bathing in, or of washing soil or disintegrated quartz, or clothing at or near to, or of in any way injuring the purity of the water so reserved, or of suffering animals, his property, to injure its purity, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding five pounds.

The foregoing Regulations, Nos. i. to xvii., have been assented to by His Excellency the Officer administering the Government, with the advice of the Executive Council.

EAST COLLINGWOOD MUNICIPALITY.

PETITION FOR ALTERATION OF BOUNDARIES.

IN pursuance of the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, His Excellency the Officer administering the Government, with the advice of the Executive Council, has directed the publication of the substance and prayer of a petition to His Excellency, as hereinafter set forth, signed by Five hundred and forty-one householders residing within the municipal district of East Collingwood.

The petitioners state that they are desirous of maintaining in proper repair the foot and carriage ways of streets and roads in front of the dwellings and property of the ratepayers along the municipal boundaries, which are at present limited to the front line of houses or land in Victoria-street, Victoria Parade, Smith-street, and Heidelberg-road, but are unable legally to effect such objects without the extension of the municipal boundaries so as to include therein such footways and the half of such carriage ways, excepting as regards Victoria Parade, of which thirty-three feet from the outer line of the foot-way on the north side will suffice.

That, deeply impressed with the necessity for spacious areas for the health and recreation of the residents of the municipality, a portion of which is densely populated, and anticipating a large accession of population, they desire to bring under notice that the Municipal Council have petitioned for a grant of Studley Park reserve as a place of recreation.

That they consider Studley Park reserve eminently adapted for a place of public recreation from the beauty of its site and its facility of access.

And the petitioners pray as follows:—

"Your petitioners therefore pray that your Excellency will be pleased to extend the municipal boundaries of East Collingwood so as to include therein the line of streets and roads and the Studley Park reserve, as petitioned for by the said Municipal Council; the latter, the Studley Park reserve, by a conveyance to such Council in trust for the purposes of health and recreation to the inhabitants of East Collingwood Municipality in particular, and the people of Victoria in general."

MUNICIPALITY OF KILMORE.

BYE-LAW No. 1.—A BYE-LAW TO REGULATE BY MEANS OF STANDING ORDERS THE PROCEEDINGS OF THE COUNCIL FOR THE MUNICIPAL DISTRICT OF KILMORE.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of Victoria, 18 Victoria No. 15, intituled, "An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria," it is amongst other things enacted,

"that it shall be competent for the Council of any municipal district established under the provisions of the said Act, to make bye-laws for the regulation of their own proceedings;" And whereas by a Proclamation of His Excellency the Officer administering the Government, dated 14th July, A.D. 1856, the district of Kilmore was duly established a municipal district under the provisions and within the meaning of the said Act; And whereas it is expedient to make divers regulations for conducting the proceedings and business of the Municipal Council for the district of Kilmore: Be it therefore ordered and directed by the Municipal Council for the district of Kilmore, that from and after the date of this bye-law receiving the assent of His Excellency the Officer administering the Government, as required by the provision of the said Act, the proceedings and business of the said Council shall be conducted by the following regulations only, which shall be and be called the "Standing Orders" of the said Council, that is to say:—

CHAP. I.—Order of Proceedings.

1. That the business of the Council shall be conducted on all ordinary occasions with open doors, but any one member present may require the exclusion of strangers until it shall have been decided by the Council whether the question proposed to be introduced shall be discussed with open doors.

2. The Council shall commence business at each meeting so soon as the legal quorum is present; but if, at the expiration of thirty minutes after the appointed hour of meeting, there is not a quorum present, no business shall be transacted by the Council at that meeting.

3. The minutes of any preceding meeting, not previously confirmed, shall be read as the first business at all meetings of the Council in order to their confirmation, and no discussion shall be permitted thereupon, except as to their accuracy as a record of the proceedings.

4. At all meetings of the Council the reading of the correspondence unconnected with the orders of the day, the presentation of petitions by members of the Council, and the bringing up of reports of committees, shall have precedence of the regular business.

5. On the presentation of a petition, no debate shall take place thereon until notice has been given in the usual manner, and the only questions that shall be entertained on the occasion of its presentation shall be that the petition be received, and, if necessary, that it be referred to a committee.

6. The Orders of the Day shall include all matters arising out of the proceedings of former meetings of the Council and any business which the chairman may think fit to bring under consideration. Any member of the Council may, however, bring forward such business as he may consider advisable in the form of a notice of motion, such notice to be given in writing to the town clerk three (3) clear days previous to the meeting at which the same is to be taken into consideration; all such notices of motion to be considered in the order in which they were given.

7. No motion entered on the notice paper shall be proceeded with unless the member who has given such notice, or some one authorised by him, be present when the business is called in order. Notices not so proceeded with shall be struck out of the paper.

8. No bye-law shall be finally passed or adopted at the meeting at which it shall have been first proposed, nor until the next meeting of the Council, and every such bye-law shall in the interim remain open for the inspection of any of the rate-payers, in the town clerk's office, free of charge.

9. The mover of any motion which may be referred to any Committee, shall be a member of such committee.

CHAP. II.—Order of Debate.

1. Any member desirous of proposing a motion or an amendment or of discussing any matter under consideration must rise and address the chairman or the presiding chairman, and no member when speaking shall be interrupted unless called to order, when he shall sit down, in which case the member calling to order shall be heard thereon in preference to any other speaker, and the question of order shall be disposed of before the subject is resumed or any other subject entered upon.

2. Any member making a motion or an amendment, shall put it in form, sign and deliver it to the town clerk, who shall add thereto the name of the seconder, and no motion or amendment so made shall be withdrawn without leave of the Council.

3. No motion or amendment shall be entertained or discussed unless it be seconded. Any member may, however, require the enforcement of any standing order of the Council by simply noticing that such order is disobeyed.

4. The members in speaking shall designate each other by their respective titles of chairman or councillor, as the case may be.

5. If two or more members rise to speak at the same time, the chairman or the then presiding chairman shall decide which is entitled to pre-audience.

6. Any member who shall use any expression capable of being applied offensively to any other member or person, shall, if required by the Council, withdraw such expression and make satisfactory apology to the Council, under a penalty, in case he refuse or neglect to do so before the rising of the Council, of not more than ten pounds.

7. The chairman or the then presiding chairman shall, in taking the votes on any motion or amendment, put the question first in the affirmative and then in the negative, and he may do so as often as is necessary to enable him to form and declare his opinion from the show of hands as to which party has the majority.

8. The Council shall vote by show of hands, excepting in cases of election, when the vote shall be by ballot. Any member of the Council may, however, call for a division upon any question, in which case the members voting in the affirmative shall first stand up, and afterwards those in the negative, until their votes are recorded.

9. No motion, the effect of which if carried would be to rescind any motion which has already passed the Council, shall be entertained during the same municipal year, unless a call of the whole Council has been duly made for that purpose, and no such motion for rescinding any resolution of the Council which shall have been negatived by the Council shall be again entertained during the same municipal year.

CHAP. III.—Elections.

1. No election to any office at the disposal of the Council shall take place until seven clear days notice shall have been given in one or more local newspapers, inviting applications for the same, and the salary of such office shall in all cases be fixed for the municipal year before proceeding to the election.

2. No councillor or officer belonging to the Council shall be received as surety for any officer appointed by the Council, or for any work to be done for the Council, and in all cases in which security for the due and faithful performance of any duty or contract is required, the expense of preparing such surety shall be borne by the person or persons giving the same.

3. At all such elections the voting shall be (except at that of chairman of the Council) on cards or paper to be provided for the purpose, on which the voter shall write the name of the candidate he supports, and sign his own. No others will be received, and the town clerk shall preserve the same as a record.

4. Any one or more of the standing orders of the Council may be suspended *pro tempore* in case of emergency, provided that a majority of the Council shall deem such suspension necessary, always excepting No. 9 chap. 2, and No. 2 chap. 3.

MUNICIPALITY OF CASTLEMAINE.

BYE-LAW No. 11.—FOR LICENSING AND REGULATING THE SLAUGHTER OF SMALL CATTLE WITHIN THE TOWNSHIP.

WHEREAS by the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, intitled, "An Act for the Establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria," the Council of any municipal district is empowered to pass bye-laws for the suppression of nuisances and the regulation of slaughter-houses, &c.; And whereas it is necessary and expedient for the preservation of the public health to prevent the nuisances arising from improperly conducted slaughter-houses and butchers' yards: Be it therefore ordered and enacted by the Municipal Council of Castlemaine, that all butchers or other persons whose premises shall have been suitably prepared and properly paved for the purposes of slaughtering, so that in the judgment of the Council after the report of the inspector or other officer the said premises are found to be in a fit and proper state, shall, upon payment of an annual license fee of twenty shillings to the town clerk in aid of the municipal fund, be granted a license,

and permitted to kill sheep and lambs, swine and goats, provided that all such persons shall receive or cause to be received the blood into tubs, together with all offal or other offensive matter, and remove the same or cause it to be removed from such premises at least once in every twenty-four hours; and for the purpose of better carrying out the provisions of this by-law, such premises shall be registered at the municipal or town clerk's offices, and shall at all times be open to the inspection of the Council, or their duly appointed inspector or other officer; and any person who shall kill any sheep or lamb, swine or goat, without being duly licensed, except the *bona fide* servants of a butcher, or other duly licensed person, on registered premises as aforesaid, or whose premises shall not be kept and maintained inoffensive and in order as above required, or who shall neglect or refuse to comply with any other regulations as herein made, shall upon conviction thereof before any two or more justices of the peace forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding twenty pounds: And be it further ordered and enacted that it shall not be lawful for any licensed butcher or other person to kill or cause to be killed any sheep or lamb, swine or goat, on premises situate distinct and apart, except all such premises are severally registered, and a license be taken out to slaughter on each of such premises, as though they belonged to different owners and persons: And be it also ordered and enacted, that written notice of application for such license and registration shall be given to the town clerk at least eight days before the same be granted, made and entered, and be exhibited at his offices or the town hall, and that the said licenses and registrations shall issue and be made on the first Monday of any month, or upon such other day as the Council may hereafter appoint.

THE FIRST HALF-YEARLY REPORT OR STATEMENT OF THE PROCEEDINGS OF THE MUNICIPAL COUNCIL OF RICHMOND, FOR SIX MONTHS, FROM 2ND DAY OF MAY TO 2ND DAY OF NOVEMBER, 1856, MADE PURSUANT TO THE 43RD SECTION OF THE MUNICIPAL INSTITUTIONS ACT.

THE district having been duly proclaimed a Municipality, a public meeting of the resident house and land owners was convened on the 14th day of April, 1856, Wm. Highett, Esq., chairman.

The meeting elected Messrs. J. F. Matthews and J. Henderson as Assessors, and decided that the Council should consist of Seven members, and that they should not receive pecuniary remuneration.

At an election held on the 21st day of April, for members of Council, D. S. Campbell, Wm. Little, Wm. B. Burnley, Henry Miller, Henry Johnson, and Philip Johnson, were declared duly elected.

Henry Miller, Esq., M.L.C., was elected Chairman at the first meeting of the Council, held on the 2nd day of May, 1856.

The following officers were appointed at the dates affixed to their names:—

The Council passed a Bye-law for regulating their proceedings by Standing Orders, which received the sanction of His Excellency the Officer administering the Government on the 22nd day of July, 1856.

The following Bye-laws are now under the consideration of His Excellency:—

Bye-law—For the appropriation of the sum of £5000 granted by the Legislative Council to the Municipality of Richmond, out of the revenue of the year 1856.

Bye-law—For the prevention of accidents from fires in chimney flues, and to cause water carriers to give prompt aid at fires.

Bye-law—For prohibiting damage to the public footpaths and water courses, and regulating the formation of private drains and crossings.
