PETITION FOR MUNICIPAL INSTITUTIONS.
 BRUNSWICK.

IN pursuance of the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, His
 Excellency the Officer administering the Government of
 Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, has directed
 the publication of the substance and prayer of the petition to
 His Excellency, hereinafter set forth, signed by two hundred
 and eleven householders resident within the district of Brun-
 swick, in the county of Bourke, as defined in the said petition.
 By His Excellency's Command,
 Y. 10031. WILLIAM C. HAINES.

The petitioners state that the inhabitants of the district of
 Brunswick, as hereinafter defined, will be greatly benefited by
 its being instituted a municipal district, and propose the follow-
 ing boundaries for the same, viz.—Commencing at the bridge
 on the Merri Creek, at the village of Northcote, and bounded on
 the south by a line bearing west to the eastern boundary of
 the Prince's Park reserve; by the said reserve northerly and
 westerly to the Sydney-road; thence westerly along the
 northern boundary of the Royal Park reserve to the Moonee
 Ponds; by the said ponds north-westerly to the north-western
 corner of Section 126, parish of Jika Jika; thence easterly
 along the northern boundary of the said section and northern
 boundary of Section 127, parish of Jika Jika, to the Merri
 Creek, and by the said creek south-easterly to the point of com-
 mencement.

They further state the area of such proposed district does
 not exceed nine square miles, and contains a population of
 householders exceeding five hundred, and that no one point in
 the area of such district is distant more than six miles from
 any other point.

And the petitioners pray as follows:—

"Your petitioners therefore pray that the said district may
 be declared by your Excellency's Proclamation a municipal
 district, pursuant to the provisions of the said Act, by the name of
 'The Municipal District of Brunswick,' and that the
 limits and boundaries of such district may be declared by such
 Proclamation."

EAST COLLINGWOOD MUNICIPALITY.
 PETITION FOR ALTERATION OF BOUNDARIES.

IN pursuance of the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, His
 Excellency the Officer administering the Government,
 with the advice of the Executive Council, has directed the
 publication of the substance and prayer of a petition to His
 Excellency, as hereinafter set forth, signed by Five hundred
 and forty-one householders residing within the municipal
 district of East Collingwood.

The petitioners state that they are desirous of maintaining
 in proper repair the foot and carriage ways of streets and roads
 in front of the dwellings and property of the ratepayers along

the municipal boundaries, which are at present limited to the front line of houses or land in Victoria-street, Victoria Parade, Smith-street, and Heidelberg-road, but are unable legally to effect such objects without the extension of the municipal boundaries so as to include therein such footways and the half of such carriage ways, excepting as regards Victoria Parade, of which thirty-three feet from the outer line of the foot-way on the north side will suffice.

That, deeply impressed with the necessity for spacious areas for the health and recreation of the residents of the municipality, a portion of which is densely populated, and anticipating a large accession of population, they desire to bring under notice that the Municipal Council have petitioned for a grant of Studley Park reserve as a place of recreation.

That they consider Studley Park reserve eminently adapted for a place of public recreation from the beauty of its site and its facility of access.

And the petitioners pray as follows:—

"Your petitioners therefore pray that your Excellency will be pleased to extend the municipal boundaries of East Collingwood so as to include therein the line of streets and roads and the Studley Park reserve, as petitioned for by the said Municipal Council; the latter, the Studley Park reserve, by a conveyance to such Council in trust for the purposes of health and recreation to the inhabitants of East Collingwood Municipality in particular, and the people of Victoria in general."

MUNICIPALITY OF BELFAST.

BYE-LAW No. 3.—TO REGULATE BY MEANS OF STANDING ORDERS THE PROCEEDINGS OF THE MUNICIPAL COUNCIL OF BELFAST.

CHAP. I.—Order of Proceedings.

THE ordinary meetings of the Council shall be held on Wednesday in each week at Eleven o'clock a.m., except otherwise ordered, and shall be open to the public.

2. The Council to have power to adjourn such meeting from time to time, not being more than fourteen days from the last day of meeting.

3. Minutes of the proceedings of all meetings of the Council shall be drawn up and fairly entered into a book for that purpose, and shall be signed by the councillor presiding at the meeting, and the said minutes shall be open to the inspection of all persons on the ratepayers roll at all reasonable times, free of charge, by application to the Town Clerk.

4. Any councillor present may require the exclusion of strangers, until it shall have been decided by the Council whether the question proposed to be introduced shall be discussed with closed doors.

5. The business of the Council shall commence so soon as the legal quorum are present; but if at the expiration of thirty minutes from the time of meeting there is no quorum, then the names of the councillors present shall be recorded in the minutes, and the business of such meeting shall lapse.

6. The first business at each meeting of the Council shall be to confirm the minutes of the preceding meeting, and no discussion shall take place thereupon except as to the accuracy thereof.

7. At all meetings, the reading of correspondence unconnected with the business of the meeting, the presentation of petitions, notices of motion, and bringing up of reports, shall have the precedence of all motions or orders of the day.

8. All communications by letter intended for the Council shall be made and addressed to the Town Clerk; other communications shall be in the form of a memorial or petition addressed to the Chairman and Council, under cover, to the Town Clerk, and shall be presented by a councillor, who shall be responsible for the same being couched in respectful language.

9. On the presentation of a petition no debate shall take place thereon until notice has been given in the usual manner, and the only questions that shall be entertained on the occasion of its presentation shall be that the petition be received, and, if necessary, that it be referred to a committee.

10. No motion shall be discussed or decided on at any meeting of Council unless notice in writing, signed by the councillor proposing, shall have been given at a previous meeting of the Council, nor shall any report of committee be decided on unless similar notice be given, and the Clerk to the Council shall furnish each councillor with a copy of each notice of motion three clear days before the meeting for which the same is given.

11. The orders of the day shall include all matters arising out of the proceedings of former meetings of the Council, and any business which the chairman may think fit to bring under consideration. Any member of the Council may, however, bring forward such business as he may consider advisable in the form of a notice of motion—such notice to be given at the previous meeting to that at which the same is to be taken into consideration, and all such notices of motion shall be considered in the order in which they were given.

12. No motion entered on the notice paper shall be proceeded with unless the member who has given such notice, or some one authorised by him, be present when the business is called in order. Notices not so proceeded with shall be struck out of the paper.

13. No bye-law shall be finally framed or adopted at the meeting at which it shall have been first proposed, nor until the next meeting of the Council regularly convened; and every such bye-law shall, in the interim, remain open for the inspection of any of the ratepayers in the clerk's office, free of charge.

14. No motion proposing any petition, address, bye-law or standing order shall be entertained, unless the mover shall submit therewith a draft of such petition, address, bye-law or standing order, and such draft shall not be taken into consideration until the following meeting of the Council.

15. The mover of any motion which may be referred to any committee shall be (*pro hac vice*) a member of such committee.

CHAP. II.—Order of Debate.

16. Any member desirous of proposing a motion or amendment, or of discussing any matter under consideration, must address the chairman, and no member when speaking shall be interrupted, unless called to order, in which case the member calling to order shall be heard thereon in preference to any other speaker, and the question of order shall be disposed of before the subject is resumed, or any other subject entered upon.

17. Any member desirous of proposing either an original motion or amendment must state the nature of such motion or amendment before addressing the Council in support thereof.

18. Any member making a motion or amendment shall put it in form, sign and deliver it to the clerk, who shall add thereto the name of the seconder, and no motion or amendment so made shall be withdrawn without leave of the Council.

19. No motion or amendment shall be entertained or discussed unless it be seconded; any member may, however, require the enforcement of any standing order of the Council, by simply noticing that each order is disobeyed.

20. The members in speaking shall designate each other by their respective titles of chairman or councillor, as the case may be.

21. If more than one member speak at the same time, the presiding chairman shall decide which is entitled to precedence.

22. No member shall speak twice on the same motion or amendment, except by way of explanation, or in reply upon any original motion of which he may have been the mover, or as the mover of the amendment last proposed, unless by permission of the majority of the Council, and the presiding chairman shall, without waiting for the interposition of the Council, call to order any member proceeding to speak a second time on the same motion or amendment after the reply; no right of reply to be allowed the seconder of any motion or amendment. The amendment or the original motion, as the case may be, shall be immediately put to the vote.

23. No member shall digress from the subject matter of question under discussion, or impute improper motives to others; and all personal reflections upon any member shall be considered highly disorderly.

24. The presiding chairman, when called upon to decide a point of order or practice, shall state the rule or precedent applicable to the case, without argument or comment; and his decision as to what is order or explanation shall be final (*pro hac vice*) in each case.

25. Any member may require the clerk to take down any particular words used by a member immediately upon the same being used.

26. Any member may of right require the production of any of the documents of the Corporation relating to the question or matter in discussion.

27. One amendment only shall be discussed at one time, but if lost, another may be moved before the original question is put to the vote; but upon any amendment being carried, it shall be competent for any member to move one other amendment, but not more.

28. The chairman shall, in taking the sense of the Council, put the question first in the affirmative, then in the negative, and the votes of all councillors shall be entered upon the minutes.

29. The Council shall vote by show of hands, except in cases of elections.

30. No discussion shall be allowed on any motion for adjournment of the Council; but if on the question being put the motion be negatived, the subject then under consideration or the next on the notice paper shall be discussed, or any other that may be allowed precedence, before any subsequent motion for adjournment shall be entertained; but if the motion for adjournment be carried, the business then undisposed of shall have precedence at the next meeting of the Council.

31. Any member of the Council may enter his protest against any resolution of the Council, provided that such protest is not inconsistent with truth or disrespectful to the Council. Notice of intention to protest must, however, in every case be given on the adoption of the resolution protested against, and the protest signed by the member or members protesting and specifying the reasons for protesting, must be entered before the next general meeting of the Council by the protesting member or members, in a book to be kept for that purpose in the clerk's office and duly referred to the minutes of Council, the same to be considered also a part of such minutes.

32. No motion, the effect of which (if carried) would be to rescind any motion which has already passed the Council, shall be entertained during the same municipal year, until a call of the whole Council has been duly made for that purpose; and no such motion for rescinding any resolution of the Council which shall have been negatived by the Council, shall be again entertained during the same municipal year.

33. The chairman of the Council, when appointed on committees, shall be chairman thereof, and the standing orders of the Council shall be observed in all committees, except as to the number of times limited for speaking.

CHAP. III.—Elections.

34. No election to any office at the disposal of the Council shall take place until six clear days notice shall have been given in one or more of the local newspapers, inviting applications for the same, and the salary of such office shall in all cases be fixed for the municipal year, before proceeding to the election.

35. No member of the Council, nor any auditor of the town, nor any officer of the Council, holding office under the Council, shall be received as surety for any officer appointed by the Council or for any work done for the Council, and in all cases in which security for the due and faithful performance of any duty or contract is required, the expense of preparing such security shall be borne by the party giving the same.

36. At all such elections the voting shall be (except at that of chairman of the Council) on cards or paper, to be provided for the purpose, on which the voter shall write the name of the candidate he supports, and sign his own. No others will be received, and the town clerk shall preserve the same as a record.

37. No councillor shall have, directly or indirectly, by himself or his partner, any share or interest in any contract or employment with or by the Council.

CHAP. IV.—Miscellaneous Regulations.

38. For the consideration of any bye-law, or for the raising or appropriating of money, or for the objects contemplated in Standing Order No. 35, it shall be competent for any member, without previous notice, to move for a call of the whole Council for the consideration of any such subject at the next or any subsequent meeting, and, upon such motion being carried, due notice thereof shall be given in the notice paper for the day when the order of the day or notice of motion for which such call is made is set down for consideration; and the clerk to the Council shall give, in writing, three clear days notice of such call of the Council to every member not then present. Any member not in attendance when such order of the day or notice of motion comes under consideration, or not in attendance at the voting upon such question, or any amendment thereof, whether of adjournment or otherwise, shall be liable to a penalty of not more than five pounds, unless reasonable cause for such absence be shewn to the satisfaction of the Council.

39. The town clerk shall have charge of the common seal of the municipality, and shall be responsible for the safe custody and proper use of the same, each impression thereof being duly verified with the signature of that officer.

40. The town clerk shall not affix the common seal to any corporate document without the express order of the Council, nor unless such document bears the signature of the chairman; but, in the case of powers of attorney and other legal instruments not relating to the municipality, the signatures to which require to be verified by declaration before the chairman, the said seal may and shall be affixed by the town clerk to the chairman's certificate accompanying the same on the receipt of a fee of half a guinea for each attestation.

41. Any one or more of the Standing Orders of the Council may be suspended, *pro tempore*, in case of emergency, provided that a majority of the members present shall deem such suspension necessary, but not otherwise, except Nos. 33 and 39.

42. In case of death, absence, or other lawful impediment, preventing the chairman from calling meetings of the Council, any three members of council shall, in such circumstances, have power to call a meeting of the Council.

The foregoing Bye-law, No. 3, made by the Municipal Council of Belfast, has been assented to by His Excellency the Officer administering the Government, with the advice of the Executive Council.

xxx. *Prospecting in wet sinkings.*—All parties intending to prospect for new leads of gold, on making such intentions known to the warden, shall be allowed 100 feet along the supposed lead, irrespective of width, with the provision that as soon as they have succeeded in striking the lead or gutter such information shall be immediately communicated to the warden, who shall have power to proclaim such lead, subject to the special regulations at present in force for the better working of the wet or deep sinkings on the Avoca lead.
