PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

HEREAS Her Majesty has been graciously pleased, by Commission under the Great Seal of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, bearing date at Westminster the ninth day of October, One thousand eight hundred and fifty-six, to constitute and appoint me, Sir Henry Barkly, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, to be Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief in and over the Colony called Victoria: Now I, the Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief aforesaid, do hereby proclaim and declare that I have this day taken the prescribed oaths, before His Honor Sir William A'Beckett, Knight, the Chief Justice of the Supreme Court of the said Colony, and that I have assumed the said office of Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this twenty-sixth day of December, in the year of Our Lord One thousand eight hundred and fifty-six, and in the twentieth year of Her Majesty's Reign.

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS Her Majesty has been graciously pleased, by Commission, under the Great Seal of the High Court of Admiralty of England, bearing date at the High Court of Admiralty of England, in London, the fifteenth day of October, A.D. 1856, to appoint me, Sir Henry Barkly, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, to be Vice-Admiral, Commissary and Deputy in the Office of Vice-Admiralty in the said Colony: Now I, the Vice-Admiral, Commissary and Deputy aforesaid, do hereby proclaim and declare that I have this day taken the prescribed oaths before His Honor Sir William a'Beckett, Knight, Chief Justice of the said Colony, and that I have assumed the Office of Vice-Admiral, Commissary and Deputy, accordingly.
