## ST. KILDA CEMETERY.

**R**EGULATIONS made by the Trustees of the Public Cemetery established at St. Kilda:—

1. All charges must be paid when orders are given, or before the ground or vault is opened.

2. By the 8th section of the Act, "Any persons making a vault, or erecting and placing a monument in the Cemetery, by and with the permission of the Trustees, under these Rules, and upon the payment of the charges therein mentioned, is entitled to have, maintain, and keep a vault, monument or tombstone, according to the tenor of such permission, to and for the sole and separate use of such person or persons, and his or their representatives, for ever."

3. Application for such permission to be made to Trustees. A certificate of permission in the form set out in the schedule will be granted to the party applying for such permission, on payment of the charges in the schedule.

4. The charges will be remitted on the burial of any poor person in such Cemetery, on the certificate of a minister of religion or other evidence proving to the satisfaction of the Trustees that such person was a pauper, or that the relatives and friends of the deceased are unable to pay the costs and charges.

5. The Trustees will cause all common graves to be dug; but parties wanting brick graves or vaults will be required to construct them under the direction of the Trustees: and, in case interment is to be made in any private grave or vault, the consent (in writing) of the party entitled thereto must be left with the order.

6. The time fixed for the funeral to be the time when the procession is to be at the Cemetery, and the same must be punctually observed.

7. Until otherwise ordered, the usual hours fixed for the performance of funerals will be from 10 a.m. to 6 o'clock p.m. in the months of September to April inclusive, and from 10 a.m. to 4 o'clock p.m. in the other four months, except on Sundays, when the usual and only hours for funerals will be from 9 to 5 o'clock p.m. throughout the year.

8. All monuments, vaults, graves and grave-stones, to be kept in repair and proper condition at the expense of the owners.

9. Every coffin in a vault or brick grave to be bricked in, cemented, and covered by a slab of freestone, slate or iron.

10. A drawing of every stone, tomb, pedestal, and plan of every monument or tablet proposed to be erected, to be submitted to the Trustees for approval, who are required by the 7th section of the Act to determine and fix the position of any objectionable monument according to the description, size and character thereof, having reference to the general plan for ornamenting the said Cemetery in an appropriate manner. In the erection of tablets copper cramps must be used.

11. The plans of all fences to be submitted to the Trustees: all wooden fencing must be after a mode to be seen on application.

12. No servant or other person employed by, or engaged in any duty on behalf of the Trustees, will be permitted to receive any gratuity for the discharge thereof.

13. The ground will be open daily to the public from sunrise to sunset.

14. A plan of the Cemetery, shewing the situation of the purchased and other graves, is kept at the office, and may be inspected at the charge set out in the Schedule.

15. Any person who shall wantonly or wilfully destroy, or do or cause to be done any damage to any monument, vault, tombstone, building, erection, railing, fence, shrubbery, tree, or plant, will be proceeded against, as directed by the 14th section of the Act of Council.

16. The Trustees reserve the right to make any alterations from time to time in these charges and regulations.

17. No dogs will be allowed to enter the Cemetery.

# PRAHRAN MUNICIPALITY.

THE following Report of the several matters and questions decided at a meeting of the resident householders and of the landholders within the Municipal District of Prahran, held on Thursday, the 21st instant, together with the list of votes taken at a poll on the following day, is published pursuant to 18 Victoria, No. 15, s. 15.

SIR,

In pursuance of the terms of the 15th section of the Act 18 Victoria, No. 15, we have the honor to transmit to you the following Report of the proceedings which took place at the adjourned meeting held on the 21st instant, for the purpose of electing members of the Municipal Council for the District of Prahran.

The meeting was opened by the Chairman reading his letter of appointment, and the resolution of adjournment which was passed at the previous meeting.

It was moved by Mr. Crews and seconded by Mr. Easton, "That Captain Parker be one of the Assessors." The question was put and passed.

It was then moved by Mr. Dickson and seconded by Mr. Campbell, "That Mr. Alexander Walker be one of the Assessors." Put and carried.

Both these gentlemen having consented to act, the business of the meeting proceeded by Mr. Sargood moving and Mr. Mason seconding a resolution that the number of Councillors be fixed at seven; on which Mr. Goodman moved and Dr. Thomson seconded the following amendment: "That in order that the inhabitants of Prahran may have an opportunity of petitioning the Legislature to amend the present Municipal Act, it is expedient that the appointment of Councillors be adjourned for six months."

After a lengthened debate, Mr. Goodman's amendment was put to the meeting and negatived, upon which Mr. Sargood's original motion was put and carried by a large majority.

It was then proposed and carried unanimously that the Municipal Councillors should receive no salary.

The meeting then proceeded to the election of Councillors, when the following gentlemen were proposed, and their names severally put to the meeting, viz.:—Messrs. Sargood, Berry, Crews, R. Chomley, Mortimer, Foster, Foxton, Oliver, Palmer, Izett, Cooke, Pye, W. Smith, H. Parker, Craven, Snodgrass, Mason, F. Stephen, Skinner, Moyle, and Dr. Thomson.

The result of a show of hands, in each case, was that the following were declared duly elected, viz.:—Messrs. Sargood, Berry, Snodgrass, Crews, Cooke, Chomley, and Foster.

On a poll being demanded, we determined that the meeting should decide by show of hands whether it should be taken or not.

The question was then put and decided by a large majority in favour of a poll, and the meeting adjourned until 8 a.m. on the following day, at which hour the poll was opened, and closed at 4 p.m., during which time 561 persons (12 of whom were females) gave in their votes.

The votes were taken partly by voting papers on which were written the names of seven or less candidates, and partly by printed cards in which the voter struck off the names of those for whom he did not intend to vote.

In every case the card or paper was signed by the voter.

On the poll being closed, the Chairman sealed up the box containing the voting papers and cards, which were then transported to his residence, where the seals were broken in the presence of the Assessors, and the votes counted. Nine cards were rejected on account of votes being given for more than seven candidates. Early in the forenoon Mr. Foster announced his intention of not acting if elected, and posted a notice to that effect at the door of the polling place. His name is therefore struck off the list of candidates, although twenty-two votes were polled for him. The result of the poll was as follows, the number of votes given for each candidate being placed opposite to his name:—
