## REGULATIONS FOR THE CHINESE ON THE GOLD FIELDS.

**H**IS Excellency the Officer administering the Government, with the advice of the Executive Council, has made the following Regulations for the management and good government of the Chinese on the Gold Fields, in pursuance of the Act of Council, 18 Victoria, No. 39, sec. 6, viz. :—

i. *Chinese Camps.*—All Chinese immigrants residing on or near the gold fields shall erect their tents or dwelling places on such camping ground or site and in such a manner as shall be directed by the Protector of the District in which such immigrants shall be residing.

ii. *Occasional Removal of Camps.*—When the Protector of the District deems it necessary that any Chinese camp or camps should be removed or divided, for sanitary or other purposes, such Chinese immigrants shall remove their tents, on (7) seven days' notice to that effect being given to them by the Protector.

iii. *Appointment of Headmen.*—The Protectors in their respective districts may appoint such a number of headmen, and at such a rate of pay as His Excellency the Governor, in Council, may direct, to superintend the different Chinese encampments, and such headmen shall carry out and see duly enforced among the Chinese such orders and instructions as they may, from time to time, receive in writing from the Protector of the District.

iv. *Chinese not to use Water Reserved.*—No Chinese immigrants residing on any gold field shall use for the purpose of washing auriferous earth any water which may have been specially reserved, or its use forbidden by the Protector of the District.

v. *Relief of Chinese.*—The Chinese Protectors in their respective districts may recommend for the consideration of His Excellency the Governor in Council the case or cases of any Chinese immigrants who may become destitute from sickness or other causes, with a view to their relief.

vi. *Settlement of Disputes.*—All mining disputes which may arise on the gold fields between any Chinese immigrants shall be decided by the Protectors of the District, being Justices of the Peace according to the mining laws and regulations which shall or may be in future in force in their respective districts.

vii. When any dispute shall arise between any Chinese immigrants and miners of other nations, the former may apply to the Protector for advice and assistance, and it shall be the duty of the Protector to afford such advice and assistance.

## DEPARTURE LICENSES, 1856.

**H**IS Excellency the Senior Military Officer in Victoria directs it to be notified to the occupants of Crown Lands as follows :—

1. The License fees for the current year are payable at the Treasury, on or before the 31st March now next ensuing.

2. After the said 31st March License fees will not be received at the Treasury unless within sixty days thence next ensuing, and upon payment of an additional sum equal to one-fourth of the amount of the License fee.

3. Occupants who shall fail to make payment within sixty days as last aforesaid, will absolutely forfeit their right to further occupation of their Runs, according to the 5th section of chapter 2 of the Order in Council.

## ACCOUNTS FOR MEDICAL ATTENDANCE.

**T**HE following information is published with a view to facilitate the payment of medical practitioners' claims for incidental attendance on cases in watch-houses, &c., viz. :—

All charges should be in accordance with the annexed Scale of Fees, and accounts should in every instance be made out on the proper Form, J. 2. Vide *Gazette*, No. 1, of 1st January, 1856, page 15.

The accounts should be headed, "The Department of Medical," &c., and, after being signed respectively by the claimant and the officer at whose request the attendance was given, should be forwarded to the Chief Medical Officer.

The amount may be paid either at the Treasury in Melbourne, or at one of the Sub-Treasuries, as the claimant may desire.

### SCALE OF FEES.

For medical or surgical attendance within any city or township, per visit, 10s. 6d. At night, double this fee.

Travelling expenses, per mile, 10s. 6d.

For minor surgical operations, £2 2s.

The scale of payment for capital operations to be submitted to the Chief Medical Officer.

### QUARTERLY SURVEY FOR HIGH PRESSURE STEAM VESSELS.

**N**OTICE is hereby given that under the fifth clause of the above cited Act the owner of every Steam Vessel employed as stated is bound to have the vessel and the whole of her machinery surveyed by the Engineer and Shipwright Surveyors appointed for that purpose by the Victoria Steam Navigation Board, in the manner and at the times following :—

#### MUNICIPALITY OF EMERALD HILL.

BYELAW, No. IV.

A Byelaw for the Suppression of Nuisances arising from the Burning of Bones and other offensive substances.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of Victoria, 18th Victoria, No. 15, intituled, "An Act for the Establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria," it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be competent for the Council of any Municipal District established under the provisions of the said Act, to make by-laws for the suppression of nuisances within such District; And whereas by a proclamation of His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, dated the 22nd day of May, 1855, the District of Emerald Hill was duly established a Municipal District under the provisions and within the meaning of the said Act; And whereas serious nuisances have arisen from persons burning bones, ordure, and other offensive substances within said District, and it is necessary that such nuisances be suppressed: Be it therefore ordered and directed by the Municipal Council for the District of Emerald Hill, that from and after the date of this by-law receiving the assent of His Excellency the Officer administering the Government of Victoria, as required by the provisions of the said Act, any person burning bones, ordure, or other offensive substances, so as to be a nuisance to his neighbours or to the public, shall, on conviction thereof before two or more Justices of the Peace, forfeit and pay for every such offence a sum of not more than Ten pounds.

## MUNICIPALITY OF SANDHURST.

BYE LAW TO REGULATE BY MEANS OF STANDING ORDERS, THE PROCEEDINGS OF THE MUNICIPAL COUNCIL OF SANDHURST.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Governor and Legislative Council of the Colony of Victoria, 18 Victoria, No. 15, intituled, "An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria," section 26, it is enacted, "That it shall be competent for the Council of any Municipal District to make Bye-Laws for the regulation of their own proceedings, the collections of their rates, the conducting of elections and public meetings of the ratepayers, the determining the validity of disputed elections, the prevention and extinguishing of fires, the suppression of nuisances and houses of ill fame, compelling residents to keep their premises free from offensive or unwholesome matters, the regulation and licensing of porters, public carriers, carters, water-drawers, and other public vehicles, regulating the killing and sale of butchers' meat, the establishment of slaughter houses, the regulation of markets, market dues, fairs and sales, the preservation of public decency and public health, the restraining of noisome and offensive trades and the general good rule and government of such Municipal District."

Such Bye-laws to have force and effect under the 33rd section of the said Act, upon the assent of the Governor of the said Colony having been obtained thereto under his hand.

Be it therefore enacted by the Council of the Municipal District of Sandhurst, that from and after the date of the Governor's assent hereto, the proceedings and business of the said Council shall be conducted according to the following regulations only, which shall be deemed and called the "Standing Orders" of the said Council, until repealed or altered, that is to say—

## CHAP. I.—Order of Proceedings.

1. That the sittings of this Council shall on all ordinary occasions be open to the public, but a majority of the Council may require the exclusion of strangers while the sense of the Council is taken whether the question shall be discussed with closed doors.

2. At all meetings of the Council business shall commence as soon as the legal quorum is present, but should a quorum not be present at the expiration of twenty minutes, such circumstance shall be noted, with the names of the members present in the minute book, and such meeting shall lapse.

3. The first business at each meeting of the Council shall be to confirm the Minutes of preceding meeting, and no discussion shall take place thereupon, except as to the accuracy thereof.

4. At all meetings, the reading of correspondence unconnected with the business of the meeting, the presentation of Petitions, and bringing up of Reports, shall have the precedence of all motions.

5. All communications to the Council must be in writing, addressed to the Chairman.

6. No motion shall be decided on at any meeting of Council, unless notice in writing, signed by the Councillor proposing, shall have been given at the previous meeting of Council; nor shall any Report of Committee be decided on unless similar notice be given, unless in Committee of the whole Council, or the whole Council be present.

7. The Order of the Day shall include all business of which due notice has been given, and all matters arising out of former meetings of Council.

8. No notice entered on the Notice Paper shall be proceeded with unless the member who has given such notice, or some one authorised by him, be present when the business is called on in order.

9. No Bye-law shall be decided on without due notice (as in cases of motions), and copy of proposed Bye-laws shall be open in the Council Chamber for inspection of all rate payers, free of charge, or of any person duly qualified to vote at elections under the Act.

10. All business shall be considered in the order in which notice thereof was given.

## CHAP. II.—Order of Debate.

1. Any member upon proposing a motion or amendment, or discussing any matter, must rise and address the Chairman; and no member shall be interrupted unless by a call to order, when he shall sit down; the member calling to order shall then be heard, and the question decided before the subject is resumed, or any other business entered upon.

2. Any councillor rising to propose an amendment, or to make any proposition to the Council, must state the nature of the same before addressing the Council in support thereof; and any member may withdraw a resolution proposed by him previous to its being put to the vote.

3. No proposition shall be entertained unless in writing, and when seconded, handed to the clerk.

4. Any member moving or seconding any motion or amendment, shall be held to have spoken on that question.

5. If more than one Councillor rise at the same time, the Chairman for the time being shall decide which is entitled to pre-audience.

6. No Councillor shall speak twice on the same question unless by way of explanation merely, or in reply, as the mover of an original motion, or upon any amendment after such explanation or reply the question shall be forthwith put to the vote.

7. No Councillor shall digress from the subject under discussion, or impute motives; and all personal reflections shall be deemed highly disorderly.

8. The presiding Chairman's decision shall be final on all questions of order or practice, and he shall state the same without comment or argument.

9. The presiding Chairman shall rise when addressing the Council.

10. Any Councillor who shall use expressions capable of being offensively applied to any other Councillor, shall, if required by the Council, withdraw such expressions, and make a satisfactory apology to the Council, under a penalty of not more than ten pounds.

11. Any Councillor may require the Clerk of the Council to take down any particular expressions immediately on their being used.

12. Any Councillor may, of right, demand the production of any of the documents of the Council bearing on the question under consideration.

13. One amendment shall be discussed at one time, and if lost another shall be moved before the original question shall be put to the vote, but upon any amendment being carried it shall be competent to any member to move one other amendment thereon, but no more.

14. The Chairman shall, in taking the sense of the Council, put the question first in the affirmative and then in the negative, and the votes of all Councillors shall be entered in the minutes.

15. The Council shall vote by ayes and nays, except in cases of elections, see chap. 3rd par. 2.

16. No discussion shall be allowed on any motion for adjournment, but if the question be decided in the negative the next motion or order of the day shall be considered before the question of adjournment shall be again entertained.

17. Any Councillor may record his protest against any decision of the Council, provided the same be made before the next meeting of the Council, in writing; notice of such intention however, must be given on the adoption of the resolution.

18. No motion, the effect of which would be to rescind any previous resolution of Council, shall be entertained during the same municipal year, unless a call of the whole Council shall be made for the purpose.

19. Any Member of Council voting in the majority on any motion, after the same being carried, may move a re-consideration of the vote, provided no other business has been gone into.

20. The Chairman of the Council when appointed on committee shall be chairman thereof, and the standing orders of the Council shall be observed in all committees, except as to the number of times limited for speaking or rising to address the Chairman.

21. The clerk of the Council shall have charge of the common seal of the Corporation, and shall be responsible for the same, and verify each impression by his signature, and shall not affix the same to any document without the order of a majority of the Council; and for using the same to verify documents not belonging to or for the use of the Council, shall charge a fee of five shillings.

## CHAP. III.—Elections.

1. No election to any office at the disposal of the Council shall take place until five days' notice shall have been given in one or more local newspapers, inviting applications for the same, and the salary of such office shall in all cases be fixed for the municipal year preceding the election.

2. At all such elections the voting shall be, except at that of Chairman of the Council, on cards provided for the purpose, on which the voter shall write the name of the candidate he supports, and sign his own. No other will be received, and the Town Clerk shall preserve the same as a record.

3. No Councillor shall be received as surety for any officer, nor shall any Auditor or other officer become surety for any other employé of the Council, or for any work to be done for the Council; and in all cases when security shall be required the expense of preparing the same shall be borne by the party giving the same.

4. Any one or more of the Standing Orders may be suspended *pro tem.*, in case of emergency, with the consent of a majority of two-thirds of the Council.
