This vessel will exhibit a single *jaxed light*.

On the exhibition of the light the upper light on Shortland's Bluff will be darkened from N.E. by E. round northerly to W. by N., and the two chequered buoys now lying mid-channel above Swan Spit will be removed, and the position of the knowles they mark pointed out by beacons on shore.
