WHEREAS by a Proclamation bearing date the twenty-seventh day of December, A.D. 1855, the times and place for holding the County Court of Buninyong were declared and appointed: And whereas it is expedient to appoint, in addition to the times named in such Proclamation, another time for holding such Court: Now therefore I, the Senior Military Officer and Officer administering the Government of the said Colony, by virtue of the powers vested in me in this behalf, do hereby appoint that the County Court of Buninyong shall be holden at Ballaarat, on the twenty-eighth day of April now next coming; and I do also hereby declare that the holding of such Court on the said twenty-eighth day of April shall not in any way interfere with or alter the holding of the said Court as set forth in the Proclamation aforesaid.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this ninth day of April, in the year of Our Lord One thousand eight hundred and fifty-six, and in the nineteenth year of Her Majesty's Reign.

IMMIGRANTS' FUND.

HIS Excellency the Officer administering the Government, with the advice of the Executive Council, has been pleased to approve of the following regulations in accordance with the provisions of the 18th section of the Act of Council, 18 Victoria, No. 5:—

Regulations for the Management and Distribution of the Immigrants' Fund, under the Passengers' Act, 18 Victoria, No. 5.

1. All monies levied and received under the authority of the Act 18 Victoria, No. 5, shall be paid (at such times and in such manner as may be from time to time prescribed) to the Treasurer; and shall form a separate fund in the Treasury, to be called "The Immigrants' Fund."

2. The interest, dividends, and accumulations on sums invested as hereinafter directed shall be paid into and form part of this fund.

3. The administration of this fund shall be entrusted to a Board, to be called the "Immigrants' Fund Board," consisting of the Commissioner of Trade and Customs (Chairman), the Immigration Agent, and the Principal Medical Officer for the time being.

4. No monies shall be paid out of this fund except upon the order of the Chairman and one member of the Board. But this rule shall not apply to repayments of over-entries at the Custom House, which shall be certified and paid in the usual manner.

5. The maintenance of the Sanatorium shall form the primary charge upon this fund; and the expense of such maintenance shall be ascertained and defrayed monthly.

6. The sum of £100 shall be placed monthly at the disposal of the Immigration Agent to defray the expense of the medical

attendance and relief of destitute passengers on arrival, for which sum he shall account in the usual manner.

7. On or before the 15th day of each of the following months, that is to say, January, April, July and October, it shall be competent for any public or charitable institution to transmit to the Chairman of the Board an account (duly vouched) of the expenses which may have been incurred by such institution in maintaining and supporting, during the preceding quarter, any passenger for whom immigrant's rate or passenger's rate has been paid within five years from the date of such transaction. No such account will be entertained unless—

(1.) The rules of the institution shall have been submitted for the information of the Board at least six months previously; or (with respect to existing institutions) shall have received the approval of Government.

(2.) The persons for whom the expense has been incurred shall be shown to come within the provisions of the Act. For this purpose the name of the ship by which the immigrant arrived, and the date of his arrival must be given.

8. After inspecting the claims transmitted to them, the Board will order the payment of such as may appear to them substantiated; making, however, in the case of institutions supported otherwise from the public funds, a reasonable and fair deduction on account of such support.

9. In the event of the funds at their disposal being insufficient to meet the whole of the claims substantiated, the Board will distribute them ratably.

10. Not more than the amount collected during the preceding quarter, together with the interest or dividends upon previous accumulations, but deducting the charges referred to in the 5th and 6th sections, will be deemed at the disposal of the Board, unless the Governor in Council shall have authorised the application of any portion of the sums invested.

11. With respect to expenses incurred before the issue of these regulations, it shall be competent for any public or charitable institution to make application for their payment in the manner prescribed in the 7th section, on or before the 15th day of May next; but not more than one-half of the amount at the credit of the fund on the 31st December last, will be available for distribution on this account.

12. The balance in the hands of the Treasurer, after paying the sums appropriated at the end of each quarter, shall be invested in Government securities.

13. The accounts of the fund shall be made up on the 31st of December in each year, and audited by the Auditor General, who shall have power to call for such vouchers as he may require.

We have the honor to transmit to you the following Report of the proceedings which took place at a meeting held on the 7th instant and on the 8th instant, in conformity with the Act of the 18th Victoria, No. 15, for the purpose of electing members of the Municipal Council for the district of Williamstown.

On the 7th instant at seven o'clock in the evening, pursuant to notice duly given, the meeting was duly opened by George Burrell, Esquire, reading his letter of appointment by His Excellency the Acting Governor, as Chairman.

The Chairman then announced to the meeting that the first duty of the electors was to appoint two gentlemen to act as Assessors, when Charles Ferguson, Esquire, and F. A. Stratford, Esquire, were unanimously elected as Assessors, and thereupon took their seats by the side of the Chairman. The Chairman then put it to the meeting whether the Council should consist of three, five, or seven members; which ended in the meeting deciding unanimously that the Council should consist of seven members.

The question was then put by the Chairman whether the Councillors should be paid or unpaid, which question was duly decided and carried in favor of unpaid Councillors.

The meeting next proceeded to the election of Councillors, and the following gentlemen being duly proposed and seconded, namely:—Mr. Mason, Mr. T. Stewart, Mr. Armstrong, Mr. Verdon, Mr. MacLean, Mr. Moxham, Mr. Langford, Mr. Taverner, Mr. Rufflo, Mr. Dalgarno, Mr. Freyer, Mr. La Roche, and Mr. Knight; the Chairman and Assessors were of opinion that the shew of hands in favor of each candidate was so nearly equal, that they decided that it was fit and proper that a poll should be taken; which was accordingly convened to take place

No. 39.—APRIL 11TH, 1856.—8.

(pursuant to the Act) on the following morning at eight o'clock, at Bryant's Store, Williamstown, and the meeting was adjourned accordingly.

On the following morning (being the 8th instant), at eight o'clock precisely, the poll was opened, and was kept open until four o'clock in the afternoon; during the continuance of the poll 412 persons gave in their votes. The voting was taken wholly by cards filled up and signed by the voter, with his own name, his qualification, and the names of the candidates (not being more than seven) for whom he voted; these cards were publicly handed by the voter to Capt. Ferguson, one of the Assessors, who declared the same aloud; the card was then numbered by the Chairman, and registered by Mr. Stratford, the other Assessor, and after registration duly initialled by the Chairman. In three or four instances objections were made to voters by the candidates present, which were settled by the Chairman and Assessors before any other votes were taken.

At four o'clock precisely the polling was formally declared closed by the Chairman, and the electors requested to retire for half an hour, when the electors being again admitted, the state of the poll was declared to be as follows, namely, for

WHEREAS by an Act of the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of Victoria, 18th Victoria, No. 15, intituled, "An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria," it is amongst other things enacted that every Municipal Council shall have the care and management of the roads, public street paths, and public thoroughfares; And whereas by a proclamation of His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, dated the 26th day of May, A.D. 1855, the district of Emerald Hill was duly established a Municipal District, under the provisions and within the meaning of the said Act; And whereas it is indispensable to the comfort and health of the inhabitants that the footways and water channels be kept clean and free from all obstructions: Be it therefore ordered and directed by the Municipal Council for the District of Emerald Hill that from and after the date of this bye-law receiving the assent of His Excellency the Officer administering the Government of Victoria, as required by the provisions of the said Act, the occupiers, or in cases where there are no occupiers, the owners of buildings and lands within or adjoining the streets, lanes, or other thoroughfares of the said municipality, shall cause to be regularly cleansed and kept free from all filth, rubbish, or obstruction of any sort, the footpaths and water channels in front, or at the side of their respective buildings and lands, and in those streets or thoroughfares where the footpaths have not yet been formed, this regulation shall apply to a distance of twelve feet from the front or side of the buildings, and land as aforesaid; and every such occupier or owner failing to comply with this regulation, or allowing any filth or rubbish to accumulate, or remain in or upon such footways, or water channels as aforesaid, shall upon conviction thereof before two or more Justices of the Peace, forfeit and pay for every such offence any sum not exceeding five pounds; and for the purpose of this bye-law, when any house shall be let in separate apartments, the person letting such apartments shall be deemed the occupier.
