LOCAL COURT REGULATIONS.

CRESWICK.

REGULATIONS made by the Local Court of the District of
Creswick:—

No. i. *Wet and Dry Sinkings.*—Claims to be divided into wet and dry sinkings; wet sinkings being understood to mean where slabbing is required.

No. ii. *Wall.*—A wall of two (2) feet shall be left between each claim, to belong to the first party that can work it.

No. iii. *Claims to be marked by Pegs.*—Persons marking out claims must do so by firmly fixing in the ground four pegs, one at each corner of the claim, which must be kept visible during the working of the claims.

No. iv. *Parties not allowed to jump Claims.*—No party shall be allowed to jump or take forcible possession of another party's claim; but when a claim may be disputed on any of the grounds mentioned in these Rules, the party wishing to take possession of it, must first make application to any authorised person to inquire into and decide the case.

No. v. *Situation of Shaft.*—Shafts must, in all cases, be sunk in the centre of the claim, unless the party obtain a special authority, in writing, from the Warden of the District.

No. vi. *Shallow and Deep Sinkings.*—Sinkings in alluvial ground shall be divided into shallow and deep; deep sinking being understood to mean when the sinking exceeds forty (40) feet in depth.

No. vii. *Extent of Claims.*—The extent of claims in shallow sinking shall be—

- For one (1) miner, 12 feet by 12 feet,
- For two (2) miners, 12 feet by 24 feet,
- For three (3) miners, 18 feet by 24 feet,
- For four (4) miners, 24 feet by 24 feet,

and no claim which is less than twelve feet by twelve feet shall be allowed.

The extent of claim in deep sinking shall be—

- For six (6) miners, 30 feet by 30 feet,
- For eight (8) or more miners, 34 feet by 34 feet,

and no claim which is less than 18 feet by 24 feet shall be allowed.

The extent of claim where there is rock and blasting is necessary shall be—

- For two (2) miners, 15 feet by 30 feet,
- For four (4) miners or more, 30 feet by 30 feet,

and no claim which is less than 12 feet by 18 feet shall be allowed.

No. viii. *Worked Ground.*—Any application for a grant of an extended claim on land already worked, must be posted up on the ground for a period of not less than two (2) clear days before such application will be entertained.

No. ix. *Slabs.*—In any case where a claim having a slabbed shaft is legally forfeited, the slabs shall be paid for within twenty-four hours, at the market value, or by the same number of slabs equal in value.

Slabs left in a shaft for fourteen (14) days without the claim being worked, shall be considered absolutely forfeited to any person taking possession of the claim.

No. x. *Abolition of "Shepherding."*—Shepherding will in no case be allowed.

In wet sinking, after marking out a claim, two (2) at least of the party to whom it belongs must be at work on the ground, and, after the expiration of ten days, the whole of the persons forming the party; when the water is reached, parties must work day and night, if considered necessary by the parties of three (3) of the adjoining claims.

No. xi. *Prospecting.*—Any party discovering new gold workings shall receive a treble claim under a written authority of the Warden of the district; and a double claim shall be granted, on such like authority, to any party recovering a "lost lead" or workings, provided it be made public without unnecessary delay.

No. xii. *Prospecting.*—Any party of miners sinking a shaft and striking the lead of gold 250 yards beyond the last marked claim, if he make the same known without delay, shall receive a double claim, provided that the party shall have given notice to the Warden of the District before the commencing of their sinking, and have marked off the requisite ground.

No. xiii. *Quartz Mining, extent of Claim.*—Every miner shall be entitled to twelve feet along the supposed course of the vein, including all the dips and angles of the reef, but no one claim shall be more than forty-eight (48) feet in length.

No. xiv. *Reefs running parallel.*—Where there are several reefs running parallel with one another no party shall be allowed to sink within twenty-four (24) feet from the centre of the nearest shaft on the line of the next reef.

No. xv. *Disintegrated Quartz.*—Where the quartz veins are much disintegrated, or two or more veins worked by different parties lead into one reef, the party first settled on the ground shall be entitled to the main reef.

No. xvi. *On discovery of an Auriferous Quartz Vein.*—Any person discovering an auriferous quartz vein shall receive a double or treble claim, not exceeding in any case seventy-two (72) feet, on application to the Warden or any authorised person.

No. xvii. *Puddling.*—No puddling machine shall be allowed in any place where it may be considered injurious to the supply

of water or the interests of other miners; the extent of ground allowed for the erection of each puddling machine shall be twenty-four feet by twenty-four feet, and for the depositing of washing stuff eighteen feet by twenty-four feet.

No. xviii. *Water Reserved.*—No washing nor puddling shall be allowed in holes which the Warden of the district or other proper authority may consider requisite to be reserved for drinking or culinary purposes.

No. xix. *Sluice Washing, &c.*—Sluice washing or other water privilege will be allowed only by special sanction, in order that care may be taken to guard against conferring the privilege in places where the permanent supply of water may be injured by the operation.

Where more than one race is cut from a creek, in case of a scarcity of water, the supply of water shall be reserved for the use of the party first on the creek, and so on in succession, according to priority.

No. xx. *Extent of Claim.*—The extent of claim granted at any one time shall be 15 feet by 150 feet for each set of sluices of not less than one hundred (100) feet in length.

No. xxi. *Right to Races.*—All right to any race, cut for conveying water, tail race, or privilege granted for using water in the creek or out of the creek, becomes forfeited when abandoned for the space of fourteen days, unless sickness or some other sufficient cause shall be shown for leaving it.

No. xxii. *Extent to be occupied under Business Licenses.*—Each Business License shall entitle the holder to occupy an area of ground not exceeding thirty feet by seventy feet, and for every such area or portion thereof in addition a similar license must be taken out; the first mentioned admeasurement being deemed the frontage, and to be protected from encroachment.

No. xxiii. *Storekeepers Frontages.*—Parties occupying road sites as storekeepers or otherwise will be required to keep such frontage clear in every respect, more particularly as regards the drains.

No. xxiv. *Space between Stores.*—In every case twenty (20) feet shall be left between each store, unless required for mining purposes; and no person shall be allowed to sink a shaft within six (6) feet of any store.

No. xxv. *Store reserves not to be used for mining.*—Under no circumstances shall a storekeeper or person in business be allowed to sink for gold within the limits of the ground which he holds under his Business License without a special authority in writing from the Warden of the district.
