PUBLIC HEALTH ACT EXTENDED TO CASTLEMAINE.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Major-General MACARTHUR, the Senior Military Officer in Command of Her Majesty's Land Forces in the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act passed by the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of the Colony of Victoria, in the eighteenth year of Her present Majesty's Reign, intituled, "An Act for promoting the Public Health in populous places in the Colony of Victoria," it was amongst other things enacted that the said Act, or any clause or section thereof, should apply to such city, town, district, or place in Victoria as the Lieutenant Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, might by Proclamation see fit to direct: Now I, the Senior Military Officer and Officer administering the Government of the said Colony, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this my Proclamation, in pursuance of the provisions of the said Act, declare and appoint that the said Act shall apply to, and be in force in, the Municipal District of Castlemaine, the boundaries whereof are set forth and defined in a Proclamation bearing date the first day of March now last past.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this eighteenth day of April, in the year of Our Lord One thousand eight hundred and fifty-six, and in the nineteenth year of Her Majesty's Reign.
