PETITION FOR MUNICIPAL INSTITUTIONS.

BELFAST.

IN pursuance of the Act of Council, 18 Victoria, No. 15, His Excellency the Officer administering the Government has, with the advice of the Executive Council, directed the publication of the substance and prayer of the petition to His Excellency hereinafter set forth, signed by one hundred and seventy householders resident in the town of Belfast, in the county of Villiers, together with the names of the petitioners.

The petitioners state that they are householders residing in the town of Belfast, in the county of Villiers, and are desirous of availing themselves of the provisions and advantages of the Act of Council, 18 Victoria, No. 15.

The petitioners further state that the proposed Municipal District does not contain more than nine square miles, and that no one point in such area is distant more than six miles from any other point thereof, and that more than three hundred householders reside within the proposed district.

And the petitioners pray as follows:—

"That your Excellency will take into favorable consideration the prayer of this their petition, and proclaim the said district of Belfast a Municipal District within the meaning of the Act of Council before mentioned."

GOLD FIELDS.
GENERAL REGULATION.

HIS Excellency the Officer administering the Government, with the advice of the Executive Council, has directed the following notification to be published in connection with the General Regulations of the Gold Fields, viz. :—

XI.—Penalty for the infraction of Regulations made by Local Courts.

"The Gold Fields Act, 18 Victoria, No. 37, section 23, provides, that every breach of the Local Court Rules, whether by omission or commission, subjects the party breaking the same to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds for the first offence, and not more than Twenty pounds for the second or any subsequent offence."

LOCAL COURT REGULATIONS.

Avoca.

REGULATIONS made by the Local Court of the District of Avoca.

i. *Former Regulations superseded.*—Whereas it has been deemed expedient for the better working of the Gold Fields in the district of the Avoca to cancel the former regulations framed by the Local Court of Avoca, and to substitute others in lieu thereof; the following rules are hereby enacted to supersede all former ones :—

ii. *Business Licenses.*—Each Business License shall entitle the holder to occupy an allotment of ground, having a frontage of 25 feet, by a depth of 70 feet; a space of 12 feet wide shall be left between each place of business available for mining purposes and the stores and premises may be undermined with the sanction of the Warden.

iii. *Water Privileges.*—Water privileges for puddling machines, sluice washing, &c., will only be granted under a written authority from the Warden, in order that care may be taken to guard against conferring such privileges in places where the permanent supply of water may be injured, or the natural water-courses obstructed by the operation.

iv. *Claims to be marked with pegs.*—Persons marking out claims, shall do so by firmly fixing in the ground four pegs, one at each corner of the claim, which must be kept visible during the working of the claim.

v. *Wall.*—In marking out claims, a two-foot wall shall be left between each claim which may be worked by either of the adjoining parties.

vi. *Wet and Dry Sinkings.*—Claims are to be divided into wet and dry sinkings—wet sinkings being understood to mean where slabbing is required.

No. 48.—MAY 2ND, 1856.—4.

vii. *Extent of Claim.*—The extent of claim shall be in dry sinkings for one miner, 12 by 24 feet; for two miners, 24 by 24 feet; and in wet sinkings, 36 by 36 feet; for two miners, or as many more as may be necessary to work the claim.

viii. *Extent of Claim on old ground.*—On ground previously worked or abandoned, the extent of claim shall be for one miner, 36 feet by 36 feet; and for two miners, 50 feet by 50 feet; beyond which no greater area shall be granted in one claim, unless where it can be proved satisfactorily that two or more parties of miners taking up claims in the usual manner can, by combining overcome any natural difficulties which may exist by means not detrimental to the interest of the public or other authorised miners; such combination may be authorised under the distinct condition that the ground must be worked by the same number of miners as would be required were it worked in separate claims: any such party of miners must be in possession of a written sanction from the Warden.

ix. *Wet Sinkings, how to be worked.*—All parties holding claims within six in any direction from the last hole bottomed on the lead shall sink their shaft without delay, and no excuse whatever, either for want of slabs or otherwise, shall be considered valid.

Beyond the limits mentioned, any two miners shall be allowed to hold a claim, provided that they are both present at the claim every lawful day for the space of two hours, which shall be from eight to ten o'clock in the morning.

x. *Night Baling.*—In wet sinkings all parties holding claims within six of the last hole bottomed on the lead, shall keep a sufficient force at their shafts, who shall bale the water every night, and all night if necessary.

xi. *Dry Sinkings.*—In dry sinkings all parties holding claims must be present at the same every lawful day between the hours of ten and twelve o'clock in the forenoon, and two and four o'clock in the afternoon, unless satisfactory reasons, such as sickness, or some other urgent cause, can be shewn.

xii. *Prospecting.*—Any party discovering a new gold field or workings shall have allotted to them, on application to the Warden, an area of ground 100 feet square, provided the discovery be not within one mile of any established gold workings, and also provided the discovery be made known without any unnecessary delay.

An area of ground 72 feet square shall be allowed under such like conditions and authority to any party discovering a lost lead or working, provided the same shall have been previously abandoned.

Any party of miners sinking a shaft and striking gold 250 yards beyond the last claim bottomed on the lead shall receive a double claim, upon application to the Warden, provided they made the same known without unnecessary delay, and have previously marked off the requisite ground.

xiii. *Quartz Mining.—Extent of Claim.*—Every miner shall be entitled to 12 feet along the supposed course of the vein, including all the dips and angles of the reef; but no one claim shall be more than 48 feet in length.

xiv. *Quartz Reefs running parallel.*—Where there are several reefs running parallel with one another, no party shall be allowed to sink within fifty feet from the centre of the nearest shaft on the next reef.

xv. *Disintegrated Quartz.*—Where the quartz veins are much disintegrated, or two or more veins worked by different parties lead into one reef, the party holding the first marked claim shall be entitled to the main reef.

xvi. *Wet Sinkings in Quartz.*—In quartz sinkings, when a run of water is struck, the party striking the same, and all parties holding claims within eight, must work every day and all day, or day and night as may be found necessary; but this rule shall only take effect after the application of six parties working in such locality to the Warden of the district.

xvii. *Prospecting Quartz Veins.*—Any party discovering an auriferous quartz vein shall receive a treble claim not exceeding in any case 72 feet, upon application to the Warden, provided the discovery be made known without delay.

xviii. *Encouraging search for Auriferous Quartz Veins.*—To encourage and facilitate the discovery of auriferous quartz veins the Warden of the district may on application grant permission to any number of miners not exceeding 28, to combine for the purpose of sinking a prospecting shaft in common. They shall take up claims in the usual manner and number them north and south from the said shaft, and give a list of the same, together with all the names of the party to the Warden at the time of application, after which they shall be allowed to keep these claims in reserve until the reef is proved.

xix. *Plurality of Claims.*—No miner or party of miners shall in any case be allowed to hold more claims than they are entitled to, and such proceeding shall be considered as a relinquishment of right to the claim disputed, however much previously worked.

xx. *Forcible Possession.*—No party shall be allowed to take forcible possession of any claim, but when a claim is disputed the party wishing to take possession of it shall first make application to any authorised person to enquire into and decide the case.
