TOWN AND COUNTRY POLICE ACT, SECTIONS V. TO X., EXTENDED TO SANDHURST MUNICIPALITY.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Major-General MACARTHUR, the Senior Military Officer in Command of Her Majesty's Land Forces in the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by a Proclamation under the Hand of the Governor and the Seal of the Colony, bearing date the nineteenth day of March, in the year One thousand eight hundred and fifty-five, the sections numbered consecutively from V. to X. (both inclusively) of a certain Act of the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of the Colony of Victoria, passed in the eighteenth year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled, "An Act to provide for the Management of Towns and other places in Victoria," were extended to the township of Sandhurst, the provisional boundaries whereof were set forth in the said Proclamation; And whereas it is deemed expedient to extend the operation of the said sections of the Act aforesaid to the Municipal District of Sandhurst: Now therefore I, the Senior Military Officer and Officer administering the Government of the said Colony, in pursuance of the authority of the said Act, do hereby revoke the said Proclamation; And I do by this my Proclamation declare and appoint that the sections of the said Act numbered V., VI., VII., VIII., IX and X. shall extend to and operate within the Municipal District of Sandhurst, the boundaries whereof are set forth in a certain Proclamation bearing date the twenty-third day of April, in the year One thousand eight hundred and fifty-five.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this twenty-ninth day of May, in the year of Our Lord One thousand eight hundred and fifty-six, and in the nineteenth year of Her Majesty's Reign.

ROAD THROUGH ALLOTMENT NO. 1, SECTION XVII. IN THE PARISH OF KORKUPERRIMUL.

NOTICE is hereby given that a map and survey plan, describing the exact course and bearings of, and the admeasurements required for a road through allotment No. 1, section 17, in the parish of Korkuperrimul, proposed to be made by the Central Road Board, together with a description of the lands through which the same is proposed to pass, and the names of the owners and occupiers thereof, so far as known, and also an estimate of the expense of the said work, have been deposited in the Office of the Honorable the Surveyor General, Melbourne, the particulars of which are as follow:—

The road commences at the south-west corner of allotment No. 1 section 17, in the parish of Korkuperrimul; thence due north for a distance of 19 chains 20 links to the south boundary of Gregor Robertson's farm, passing through the property of Violet Hunter, Esq.

The quantity of land required to be taken for the proposed road is three roods and thirty-three and a half perches, and the estimated cost of effecting the said work is Thirty-three pounds eleven shillings and eleven pence.

All persons affected by the proposed alteration are requested to set forth in writing, addressed to the President of the Central Road Board, Melbourne, within forty days of the first publication of this notice, any well-grounded objections that they may have to the said road, failing which they will be thereafter precluded from making any such objections or claiming any compensation whatsoever.
