PUBLIC HOLIDAY.

THE announcement that a definite Treaty for the restoration of Peace was signed at Paris on the 30th of March, having been received in this Colony on the evening of the 24th instant, and which announcement was at once celebrated in this City by a salvo of 101 guns, His Excellency the Officer administering the Government, in order to afford the inhabitants an opportunity of further commemorating so propitious an event, has been pleased to direct that Wednesday, the 2nd proximo, should be observed as a Public Holiday throughout this territory.
