MUNICIPALITY OF WILLIAMSTOWN.

BYE-LAW No. 2.—A BYE-LAW PROHIBITING DAMAGE TO PUBLIC FOOTPATHS AND WATERCOURSES WITHIN THE MUNICIPAL DISTRICT OF WILLIAMSTOWN, AND AUTHORISING AND REGULATING THE FORMATION OF CROSSINGS OVER THE SAME TO PRIVATE GATEWAYS, YARDS, LANES, &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of Victoria, 18th Victoria, No. 15, intituled, "An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria," it is amongst other things enacted, that the Council of any Municipal District established under the provisions of the said Act, shall have the care and management of the roads, public streets, paths, public thoroughfares, &c., lying within such Municipal District; and that it shall be competent for the Council of any Municipal District to make such Bye-laws for carrying out these objects as shall to such Council seem fit: And whereas by a Proclamation of His Excellency the Officer administering the Government, dated 14th March, A.D. 1856, the District of Williamstown was duly established a Municipal District, under the provisions and within the meaning of the said Act: And whereas it is expedient to make a Bye-law for the better preservation of the public footpaths and watercourses of the said Municipal District of Williamstown, and to prohibit damage that might arise to the same from sundry causes as hereinafter specified; and to authorise and regulate the formation and maintaining of crossings over the said public footpaths and watercourses to private gateways, yards, lanes, &c.: Be it therefore ordered and directed by the authority aforesaid, that from and after the date of this Bye-law receiving the assent of His Excellency the Officer administering the Government, as required by the provisions of the said Act—

1. That any person or persons who shall wilfully ride or drive, or cause to be ridden or driven, any beast of burthen, or who shall wilfully drive or wheel, or cause to be driven or wheeled, any carriage, cart, barrow, or other vehicle, upon, along, or across any of the public footpaths or watercourses of the Municipal District of Williamstown, or who shall in any way wilfully cause damage to the said public footpaths or watercourses, or any of them, shall, upon conviction thereof before any one or more Justices of the Peace, forfeit and pay for every such offence a sum or penalty not exceeding fifty pounds.

2. And be it further ordered and directed, that every owner or occupier of any private gateway, yard, lane, &c., to which access or approach by beasts of burthen, carriages, carts, or other vehicles can be obtained only by riding, driving, or wheeling, or by causing the same or any of them to be ridden, driven, or wheeled upon or across any of the said public footpaths or watercourses, is hereby authorised, required, and directed by the Municipal Council for the said District of Williamstown, to make and maintain such crossing or crossings over the said public footpaths or watercourses, or any of them, as may be necessary for the approach and access to any such private gateway, yard, lane, &c., at the expense of such owner or occupier, and under the superintendence of such officer or officers as the said Municipal Council may appoint for that purpose, and that every such crossing or crossings shall be made and maintained in the form, manner, and of the materials described in the Schedule A. unto this Bye-law annexed.

SCHEDULE A. REFERRED TO IN BYE-LAW No. 2.

The crossings shall be paved with pitchers or sets from the outside of the watertable or channel of the street to the gate or other entrance to the premises to which the crossing leads, or to and in line with the fence or boundary of the premises, the width of the crossing not to be less than eight feet six inches, but where the gateway or other entrance is of greater width than eight feet six inches, then the crossing shall be the full width of such gateway or other entrance, and the sides of such crossing shall be formed with a circle of not less radius than one-third the width of the path, nor more than one-half of the same. The pitchers forming the watertable or channel shall be in accordance with those used by the Municipal Council in paving the adjacent watertables or channels, and the courses laid to range with them; the pitchers or sets within the range of the path shall be in courses of not less than six inches nor more than nine inches wide on the surface, and not less than six inches deep, laid to range with the courses of the watertable or channel, and with an inclination or fall towards the latter of not less than half an inch of height to one foot horizontal, the whole laid in sand or gravel and firmly rammed down with a pavior's rammer of not less than forty pounds weight. Where the adjoining path is kerbed the crossing shall be bounded on both sides with a kerb corresponding in every respect with that of the path, and all the stones used in the crossing shall be of the same description as those used by the Council in the adjacent path, watertable, or channel.

BYE-LAW No. 3.—A BYE-LAW PROHIBITING THE DISCHARGE OF WATER FROM THE ROOFS OF HOUSES, OR OTHER BUILDINGS, ON TO OR OVER THE PUBLIC FOOTPATHS AND HIGHWAYS OF THE MUNICIPAL DISTRICT OF WILLIAMSTOWN, AND FOR PREVENTING THE ACCUMULATION OF WATER ON ANY PRIVATE PREMISES, SO AS TO OVERFLOW OR OTHERWISE DAMAGE THE SAID PUBLIC FOOTPATHS AND HIGHWAYS.

Whereas by an Act of the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of Victoria, 18th Victoria, No. 15, intituled, "An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria,"

it is amongst other things enacted, that the Council of any Municipal District established under the provisions of the said Act, shall have the care and management of the roads, public streets, paths, public thoroughfares, &c., lying within such Municipal District, and that it shall be competent for the Council of any Municipal District to make such Bye-laws for carrying out these objects as shall to each such Council seem fit: And whereas by a Proclamation of His Excellency the Officer administering the Government, dated the 14th day of March, A.D. 1856, the District of Williamstown was duly established a Municipal District, under the provisions and within the meaning of the said Act: And whereas it is expedient to make a Bye-law for the better preservation of the public footpaths and highways of the said Municipal District of Williamstown, and to prohibit damage arising to the same by reason of any water discharged from the roofs of houses or other buildings being discharged on to or over any of the footpaths and highways of the district, or by reason of water being allowed to accumulate on any private premises, so as to overflow, undermine, or otherwise damage any of the said footpaths and highways, or any of the roads, public streets, public thoroughfares, &c., of the said district: Be it therefore ordered and directed by the authority aforesaid, that from and after the date of this Bye-law receiving the assent of His Excellency the Officer administering the Government, as required by the provisions of the said Act—

1. That the owner or occupier of any house, building, or premises, who shall wilfully or negligently cause or suffer any water discharged from the roof or roofs of any such house, building, or premises, to pass on to or over any public footpath or highway within the said district, or who shall suffer any water to accumulate on the premises of such owner or occupier, so as the same shall overflow, undermine, or otherwise damage any of the said public footpaths, highways, roads, streets, thoroughfares, &c., of the said district, shall, upon conviction thereof before any one or more Justices of the Peace, forfeit and pay for every such offence a sum or penalty not exceeding twenty pounds.

2. And be it further ordered and directed, that the owner or occupier of any house, building, or other premises, within the said district, shall, where no other suitable, proper, and convenient means exist for carrying off and discharging the water from such house, building, or other premises, be at liberty, and such owner or occupier is hereby authorised, required, and directed by the said Council, to make and maintain such drains or trunks leading through and under the adjoining path, as shall be necessary to discharge the water from such house, building, or premises, into the public watertables, channels, or gutters, at the expense of such owner or occupier, and under the superintendence of such officer or officers as the said Council may appoint for that purpose, and that all such drains or trunks shall be made and maintained in the form and manner and of one or other of the materials described in the Schedule B. to this Bye-law annexed.

SCHEDULE B. REFERRED TO IN BYE-LAW No. 3.

The drains or trunks shall be of such dimensions as the Municipal Surveyor shall deem necessary, not being less than four inches nor more than twelve inches diameter in the clear, and may be of cast iron, soundly-burnt earthenware, or red or blue gum plank of not less than one inch thick, firmly nailed together, and laid and bedded in clay puddle, the bottom on a level with the bottom of the watertable or channel in the street, and rising towards the house or premises equally with the inclination of the path. The length to be from the outside of the kerb of the path to the house or premises and so far within the latter as to prevent any damage to the path.

BYE-LAW No. 6.—A BYE-LAW TO IMPOSE A RATE OF ONE SHILLING IN THE POUND ON AN ASSESSMENT OF ALL PROPERTY IN HOUSES AND LANDS WITHIN THE LIMITS OF THE MUNICIPAL DISTRICT OF WILLIAMSTOWN, FOR THE CURRENT YEAR, ENDING THE 7TH APRIL, 1857.

Whereas by an Act of the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of Victoria, 18th Victoria, No. 15, intituled, "An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria," it is amongst other things enacted, that the Municipal Council of any such Municipal District shall annually, within three months after the election of the Chairman of such Council, cause an estimate to be made of the probable amount which will be required for the then current year, in addition to any tolls, rates, or dues which may have been levied or authorised to be levied within the said district, to carry on the fencing, making, and repairing of any roads, wharves, piers, or other public works within the said district, and any other expenses necessary in carrying into effect the provisions of this Act, and shall raise the amount so estimated by an assessment of all property in houses and lands within the limits of such Municipal District according to its fair average annual value, whether occupied or not, provided that no such rate shall exceed the sum of two shillings in the pound: And whereas by a Proclamation of His Excellency the Officer administering the Government, dated 14th March, A.D. 1856, the District of Williamstown was duly established a Municipal District under the provisions and within the meaning of the said Act: And whereas in accordance with the provisions of the said Act the Municipal Council for the District of Williamstown have caused to be made an estimate of the probable amount which will be required for the current year,

ending 7th April, 1857, in addition to any tolls, rates, or dues which may have been levied or authorised to be levied within the said district, to carry on the fencing, making, and repairing of any roads, wharves, piers, or other public works within the said district, and any other expenses necessary in carrying into effect the provisions of this Act: And whereas in accordance with the provisions of the said Act the Municipal Council for the District of Williamstown have duly assessed all the property in houses and lands within the limits of such Municipal District according to its fair average annual value, whether occupied or not, and have ordered on such assessment a rate of one shilling in the pound for the current year, ending 7th April, 1857: And whereas by an Act of His Excellency the Governor of Victoria and the Legislative Council thereof, the 19th Victoria, No. 16, intituled, "An Act to amend an Act intituled 'An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria,'" it is amongst other things enacted, that no toll, rate, or due shall be imposed by the Council of any Municipal District save by Bye-law, subject to the assent of the Governor, as in the said recited Act mentioned: Be it therefore ordered and directed by the Municipal Council for the District of Williamstown, that from and after the date of this Bye-law receiving the assent of His Excellency the Officer administering the Government as required by the provisions of the said Act, the hereinmentioned rate of one shilling in the pound shall be and be taken to be the rate on the assessment of all property in houses and lands within the limits of the Municipal District of Williamstown for the current year, ending April 7th, 1857, to be and remain in force until a new rate be made by the Municipal Council for the District of Williamstown, as required by the provisions of the 18th Victoria, No. 15, sec. 53.

The foregoing Bye-laws, Nos. 2, 3, and 6, made by the Municipal Council of Williamstown, have been assented to by His Excellency the Officer administering the Government, with the advice of the Executive Council.

MUNICIPALITY OF SANDHURST.

BYE-LAW, No. 6.—A BYE-LAW FOR REGULATING THE FORMATION OF CROSSINGS FOR WHEELED VEHICLES OVER FOOTPATHS, AND FOR PROTECTING THE FOOTPATH AND WATER CHANNELS.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of Victoria, 18th Victoria, No. 15, intituled, "An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria," it is amongst other things enacted, that the Council of any Municipal District established under the provisions of the said Act, "shall have the care and management of the roads, public streets, and public thoroughfares, and shall and may make such Bye-laws for carrying out their objects as shall to such Council seem fit." And whereas by a Proclamation of His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, dated the 23rd day of April, 1855, the District of Sandhurst was duly established a Municipal District under the provisions and within the meaning of the said Act: Be it therefore ordered and directed by the Municipal Council for the District of Sandhurst, from and after this Bye-law receiving the assent of His Excellency the Officer administering the Government of Victoria, as required by the provisions of the said Act—

That all persons having, or that may hereafter have, roadways for carts and other wheeled vehicles across the footpaths now formed, or that may hereafter be formed by the Council, in the Municipality of Sandhurst, shall, at their own cost, provide, construct, and maintain a crossing place over the water channel and footpath in the manner following:—

In streets where a stone or wood curb is now or hereafter may be laid, the crossing shall be paved with stone or wood pavement, the whole width of the footpath from the interior edge thereof to the pavement of the water channel, and the pavement shall be enclosed on both sides with a stone or wood curb of the same size and description as the street curbing, which it must join closely at the angles; the water channel must not in any way be altered or obstructed, and it must be maintained at all times in as good repair, at the cost of the persons having the crossings, as the other portions of the water channel immediately adjoining.

In streets where a footpath and side channel is or may hereafter be formed, and where no curbing is laid, suitable wood planks or scantlings shall be provided and fixed over the water channel so as to have a free passage for the water underneath, to project into the public roadway not less than five feet from the outer edge of the footpath, and the crossing place over the footpath shall be paved, metalled, or gravelled in such manner that it shall at all times be as clean and dry as the footpath itself is immediately adjoining such crossing place.

The materials used for such crossing places and curbing, and the manner of laying the same, shall be subject to the approval of the Municipal Council, or the duly appointed Town Surveyor; and in cases where the material or manner of laying the same, or forming the crossing places, shall, on the report of the Town Surveyor, be deemed objectionable by the said Council, it shall be lawful for the said Council (after the expiration of seven days from any day on which such Council shall give notice of objection to the persons forming or causing to be formed such crossing place) to proceed in the manner hereinafter stated
No. 89.—JULY 25TH, 1856.—4.

as against parties refusing or neglecting to comply with the provisions of this Bye-law.

All persons about forming crossing places over footpaths shall give notice in writing of their intention, and submit a specification of the manner in which the work is to be performed to the Town Surveyor, who shall give permission for the same to be proceeded with as specified, provided the specified manner is not objectionable, and shall charge and receive a fee of five shillings for each examination and permission.

All persons crossing any formed water channel or footpath, or causing such to be crossed with or by any cart, dray, or other wheeled vehicle, excepting the channels in the carriage ways at the intersections of the public streets, unless over and by means of a crossing place formed in one or other of the manners hereinafter stated, and any persons neglecting or refusing to comply with any other provisions of this Bye-law, on conviction before two or more Justices of the Peace, shall forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding fifty pounds, as enacted by the 35th section of the 18th Victoria, No. 15.

It shall be lawful for the said Municipal Council also, whenever it appears that carts or other wheeled vehicles habitually and frequently cross any formed channel and footpath to any right-of-way, yard, or other premises, without a crossing place having been made as hereinbefore stated, to form such a crossing place, and recover the expense and cost of its construction, from the owner or occupier of the premises entered by its use; and in cases of common rights-of-way, from the several owners and occupiers of the premises forming the boundaries thereof, or to which it is appurtenant, and any person refusing or neglecting to pay the amount owing for such construction in the manner aforesaid, shall be liable to the penalty hereinbefore stated for a breach of this Bye-law.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of Victoria, 18th Victoria, No. 15, intituled, "An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria," it is amongst other things enacted, that every Municipal Council shall have the care and management of the roads, public streets, paths and public thoroughfares: And whereas by a Proclamation of His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, dated the seventeenth day of December, in the year of Our Lord One thousand eight hundred and fifty-five, the township of Ballaarat was duly established a Municipal District under the provisions of and within the meaning of the said Act: And whereas it is indispensable to the comfort and health of the inhabitants that the footways and water channels be kept clean and free from all obstructions: Be it therefore ordered and directed by the Municipal Council for the District of Ballaarat, that from and after the date of this Bye-law receiving the assent of His Excellency the Officer administering the Government of Victoria, as required by the provisions of the said Act, the occupiers, or in cases where there are no occupiers the owners, of buildings and lands within and adjoining the streets, lanes, or other thoroughfares of the said Municipality, shall cause to be regularly cleansed and kept free from all filth, rubbish, or obstruction of any sort, the footpaths and water channels in front or at the side of their respective buildings and lands, and in those streets or thoroughfares where the footpaths have not yet been formed this regulation shall apply to a distance of twelve feet from the front or side of the buildings and land as aforesaid; and every such occupier or owner failing to comply with this regulation, or allowing any filth or rubbish to accumulate or remain in or upon such footways or water channels as aforesaid, shall, upon conviction thereof before two or more Justices of the Peace, forfeit and pay for every such offence any sum not exceeding five pounds; and for the purpose of this Bye-law, when any house shall be let in separate apartments the person letting such apartments shall be deemed the occupier.

PRISON BOUNDARIES OF PENAL HULKS.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Major-General MACARTHUR, the Senior Military Officer in Command of Her Majesty's Land Forces in the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act passed by the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of the Colony of Victoria, in the sixteenth year of Her present Majesty's Reign, intituled, "An Act to make provision for the better control and disposal of 'Offenders,'" it was amongst other things enacted, that it should be lawful for the Lieutenant Governor of the said Colony to proclaim any Hulk or Floating Prison to be used as a public prison for the reception and safe keeping of all prisoners convicted and sentenced for any offences by any Court of the said Colony, and to define the limits and boundaries in and around such hulk within which no person shall come, and the place of embarking and landing prisoners to and from such hulk, and such Proclamation and the said limits and boundaries from time to time to vary, alter, new assign, and revoke: And whereas by divers Proclamations bearing date the first day of February, and the twenty-seventh day of June, in the year One thousand eight hundred and fifty-three, and the fifteenth and twentieth days of March, in the year One thousand eight hundred and fifty-four, the hulks or floating prisons called respectively the *President*, *Deborah*, *Success*, *Sacramento*, and *Lysander*, were proclaimed to be used as public prisons within the meaning of the said Act: And whereas as well by the said Proclamations as by certain other Proclamations bearing date the seventeenth day of July, One thousand eight hundred and fifty-four, and the thirtieth day of March, One thousand eight hundred and fifty-five, the limits and boundaries around the said hulks or floating prisons were defined: And whereas the said hulks or floating prisons have been removed into new positions, and it is expedient to new assign the boundaries around the same: Now therefore I, Major General Macarthur, the Senior Military Officer and Officer administering the Government of the said Colony, do hereby revoke so much of all former Proclamations as defines the limits and boundaries around the said hulks or floating prisons, called respectively the *President*, *Deborah*, *Success*, *Sacramento*, and *Lysander*: And I do hereby proclaim and define the positions of the said hulks or floating prisons to be the positions specified in the Schedule hereunto annexed, and the limits and boundaries around the said hulks or floating prisons to be marked by a black-painted buoy placed one hundred yards north-east from each of the said hulks, and a yellow-painted buoy placed one hundred yards south-west from

each of the said hulks, between which buoys and the said hulks no person shall come: And I hereby further proclaim that the place of embarking and landing prisoners to and from the said hulks shall be the point of and called and known as "Gellibrand's Point."
