PETITION FOR MUNICIPAL INSTITUTIONS.
 BEECHWORTH.

IN pursuance of the Act of Council, 18 Victoria, No. 15, His Excellency the Officer administering the Government, with the advice of the Executive Council, has directed the publication of the substance and prayer of a Petition to His Excellency hereinafter set forth, signed by One hundred and fifty-four landowners and householders of the town of Beechworth.

The petitioners state that they are desirous of availing themselves of the Act of Council, 18 Victoria, No. 15, intitled, "An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria," being convinced of the advantages derivable from its provisions in promoting the improvement and good management of their district; and they propose the formation of a Municipal District, bounded as follows:—Commencing at a point at the north corner of the cemetery; thence by a line bearing west fifty chains; thence by a line bearing south one mile and seventy chains; thence by a line bearing east sixty chains; thence by a line bearing north forty chains; thence by a line bearing north-east forty-two chains; thence by a line bearing east fifty chains; thence by a line bearing north one mile; thence by a line bearing west one mile and ten chains, to the commencing point.

The petitioners further state that the area of the proposed district does not exceed nine square miles, and contains the full number of householders required by the said Act, and that no two points in such area are distant from each other more than six miles; and they pray as follows:—

MUNICIPALITY OF EMERALD HILL.

REPORT OF PROCEEDINGS OF THE MUNICIPAL COUNCIL OF EMERALD HILL FOR THE HALF-YEAR ENDING 30TH JUNE, 1856.
(In terms of section 43 of the 18th Victoria, No. 15)

PUBLIC WORKS.

THE Council have, during the past six months, earnestly turned their attention to the surface drainage of the district; the formation of various approaches to Emerald Hill from the Sandridge road; the construction of a road from the northern termination of Clarendon-street to the Yarra; obtaining a site for a district Cemetery, and various other requirements of the district.

The following works are in progress, or have been completed, viz.:

1. The formation of Clarendon-street, from the Sandridge road to Dorcas-street.
2. The formation of Coventry-street (between Cecil-street and Moray-street).
3. The formation of Cecil-street from the Sandridge road to Dorcas-street.
4. The formation of footpaths and water tables in portions of Bank-street, Dorcas-street, Clarendon-street, Cecil-street, Coventry-street, York-street, and Market-street.
5. The partial formation of York-street east from Clarendon-street to Moray-street.
6. Partially flagging the western footpaths in Clarendon-street, and the northern footpath in Coventry-street.
7. Kerbing and channelling of a portion of Clarendon-street.

The formation of a road from the northern termination of Clarendon-street to the Yarra is universally felt to be a matter of the highest importance. The Council have repeatedly urged the subject on the Government, and anticipate seeing the work speedily in progress by the Melbourne and Hob-on's Bay Railway Company, under direction of Government and in pursuance of the terms of the Railway Act of Incorporation.

The progress of the works in the district have been much retarded by the long continued wet weather, which has been a source of considerable inconvenience to the inhabitants.

A contract has been entered into for the formation of Coote-street; and plans have been prepared with a view to the formation of Ferrers, Montague, Bank, and Park streets, which works will speedily be in operation.

SANDRIDGE ROAD TOLL.

On the 1st of January the Council obtained from the Central Road Board the control of that portion of the Sandridge road within the Municipal boundaries, the toll on which has been leased till 31st December next for the sum of £1500. A contract has been entered into for the maintenance of the road for twelve months, and several improvements in reference thereto are also in progress. A flight of steps has been constructed near Prince's Bridge, which has been a source of great convenience to pedestrians travelling between the Hill and Melbourne.

BYE-LAWS.

Bye-laws have been assented to for the management of the toll upon the Sandridge road; the suppression of nuisances arising from a prevalent practice of burning bones and other noxious substances; and for the thorough cleansing of the footways and water channels.

SANITARY CONDITION.

The Council, as the local Board of Health, have used their best endeavours to promote the health and cleanliness of the district, for the furtherance of which a contract has been entered into for the removal, once in each week (or oftener if required), of all filth, rubbish, and other offensive matter from the streets, lanes, and unenclosed places. This work being efficiently performed, has had the effect of removing numerous serious nuisances.

FINANCE.

A grant of £7500 having been placed upon the estimates for 1856, was passed early in the year by the Legislative Council, half of which has been paid over to this Council. A donation of £50 has been received from the Local Volunteer Fire Brigade in aid of the erection of an engine-house, plans for which are at present under the consideration of the Council.

MUNICIPAL ENDOWMENT.

The Council have participated in a general movement among the newly created municipalities, initiated to secure the general endowment of Municipal Districts, the general amendment of the Municipal Act, &c.

ANNUAL ELECTION.

At the close of the municipal year three vacancies in the Council were occasioned by the retirement of Messrs. Service, Anderson, and O'Brien. Wednesday, 25th, and Thursday, 26th, were appointed as the nomination and polling days, when the following candidates presented themselves, viz., Messrs. Haig, Westall, Taylor, Anderson, and Service. The polling resulted as follows:—James Service, 358; Robert S. Anderson, 283; William F. Westall, 262; L. Taylor, 169; William Haig, 142. Messrs. Service, Anderson, and Westall were accordingly declared duly elected.
