PUBLIC HEALTH ACT (EXCEPT SECTIONS 8, 9) EXTENDED TO WARRNAMBOOL MUNICIPAL DISTRICT.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Major-General MACARTHUR, the Senior Military Officer in Command of Her Majesty's Land Forces in the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of the Colony of Victoria, passed in the eighteenth year of Her present Majesty's Reign, intitled, "An Act for promoting the Public Health in populous places in the Colony of Victoria," it was amongst other things enacted that the said Act, or any clause or section thereof, should apply to such city, town, district, or place in Victoria as the Lieutenant Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, might by Proclamation see fit to direct: Now I, Major General MacArthur, the Senior Military Officer and Officer administering the Government of the said Colony, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this my Proclamation, in pursuance of the provisions of the said Act, declare and appoint that the said Act (excepting the clauses thereof numbered VIII. and IX.) shall apply to, and be in force in, the Municipal district of Warrnambool, the boundaries whereof are set forth and defined in a Proclamation bearing date the sixth day of December, in the year One thousand eight hundred and fifty-five.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this eleventh day of August, in the year of Our Lord One thousand eight hundred and fifty-six, and in the twentieth year of Her Majesty's Reign.

APPROACH TO JOHNSTON-STREET BRIDGE, COLLINGWOOD.

NOTICE is hereby given that a map and survey plan describing the exact course and bearings of and the admeasurements required for a diversion in the western approach to Johnston street Bridge, Collingwood, proposed to be made by the Central Road Board, together with a description of the lands through which the same is proposed to pass, and the names of the owners and occupiers thereof, so far as known, and also an estimate of the expense of the said work, have been deposited in the Office of the Honorable the Surveyor General, Melbourne, the particulars of which are as follow:—

The diversion commences at a point marked A on plan, opposite the east corner of the road leading to the Study punt; thence bearing east 362 feet; and thence bearing north 64 degrees east 136 feet to the River Yarra, passing through the properties of John Dight and John Orr, Esquires.

The quantity of land required to be taken for the proposed approach is one acre twenty-seven perches, and the estimated cost of effecting the said work is five hundred and eleven pounds sterling (£511).

All persons affected by the proposed alteration are requested to set forth in writing, addressed to the President of the Central Road Board, within forty days from the first publication of this notice, any well grounded objections that they may have to the said alterations, failing which, they will be thereafter precluded from making any such objections or claiming any compensation whatsoever.

MUNICIPALITY OF EAST COLLINGWOOD.

BYE-LAW No. 3.—TO PREVENT ACCIDENTS FROM FIRES IN CHIMNEY FLUES, AND TO CAUSE WATER DRAWERS TO GIVE PROMPT AID AT FIRES.

(Regulations under 18 Victoria, No. 14.)

THE occupier of any premises within the Municipality of East Collingwood, whose chimney flue shall take fire from having become foul, shall forfeit and pay for every such offence a sum not exceeding five pounds.

If any such occupier shall plead that his chimney flue did not take fire from being foul, the proof thereof shall lie with him.

The joint Insurance Companies of the City of Melbourne, having guaranteed an ample scale of premiums for the attendance of water drawers with loads of water at fires, the Municipal Council of East Collingwood hereby enact the following by-laws to aid in the prevention and extinguishing of fires:—

1. Every licensed water drawer shall keep his cart or dray loaded with water from sunset to sunrise and on Sundays, and on neglect thereof, unless reasonable cause be proved for the same, he shall forfeit and pay for every such offence a sum not exceeding forty shillings.

2. Every licensed water drawer when called upon to attend a fire by a policeman or fireman shall, on neglect or refusal of the same, unless upon good and sufficient grounds, forfeit and pay for every such offence a sum not exceeding forty shillings.

3. Every licensed carter intending to carry water for hire regularly, shall state the same to the Town Clerk on his issuing such license, which shall be so endorsed, and every licensed carter occasionally drawing water shall register his name to that effect at the office of the Town Clerk, and on the water

drawer neglecting the same he shall forfeit and pay a sum not exceeding twenty shillings.

4. Every licensed regular or occasional water drawer shall have his designation, as such, painted in white on black ground, or in black on white ground, over his door or other conspicuous part of his dwelling, and on neglect thereof he shall forfeit and pay a sum not exceeding twenty shillings

BYE-LAW No. 4.—FOR THE REGULATION AND GOVERNMENT OF LICENSED PORTERS, PUBLIC CARRIERS OR CARTERS, WATER DRAWERS, BUTCHERS, BUILDERS AND NIGHTMEN, AND FOR THE REGISTRATION OF OWNERS OF UNLICENSED CARTS, COMMON LODGING-HOUSES, SKITTLE GROUNDS, BOWLING ALLEYS, AND PUBLIC BALL ROOMS.

(Under 18 Victoria, No. 15.)

The License and Registration Fees herein enacted shall be paid to the Town Clerk, as compensation to him for issuing, entering, and recording such Licenses and Registers.

PORTERS.

1. Porters desirous of plying for hire within the Municipality shall obtain from the Town Clerk a license for that purpose, and shall make a written application for the same, with a certificate of recommendation from three householders of good repute.

2. On approval of the applicant he shall register his name and address in the office of the Town Clerk, who shall supply him with a table of rates and fares, and a badge, upon which shall be engraved the number of his license and the letters E. C. M. (for East Collingwood Municipality.)

3. He shall produce his table of rates and fares when so required by his employer, and also his license whenever called upon by competent authority.

Fees.

4. Ten shillings for license first year, and five shillings the second year, if the license be taken during the first fourteen days of the porter's year.

7. The owner of an unlicensed cart shall have his name and address, and the number of his certificate, painted in letters not less than one inch in height, in white on a black ground, or in black on a white ground, in a conspicuous position upon the off side of his cart or dray.

8. The Council hereby resolves to recommend the under mentioned places* within the Municipality to be used as stands, on which licensed carters therein may ply with their carts and drays for hire. Due notice and subsequent alteration of such stands, when approved by His Excellency, from time to time, shall be given by advertisement in the local newspapers.

9. The Council shall frame and alter, from time to time, a table of rates, fares, and distances, and, when approved by His Excellency the Governor, advertise it in the local newspapers and affix copies of the table in one or more conspicuous places within the Municipality, and the table of rates, fares, and dis-

tances hereunto annexed shall be in force after the approval of His Excellency.

10. Every licensed carter shall produce his table of rates furnished to him by the Town Clerk, when so required by his employer.

No builder shall commence erecting or pulling down any building, or placing materials for or from the same, in or abutting on any public thoroughfare or street, lane, court, alley, &c., to which the public may have access within the Municipality of East Collingwood, without first obtaining a license from the Municipal Council to authorise him to deposit such building materials.

Before any such deposit shall be made, a good and sufficient boarding shall be placed round such materials to the satisfaction of the Council or their officer; and a light in a conspicuous position shall be kept burning from sunset to sunrise.

No such materials shall encroach more than one third of the width of any roadway, or so as to render any road impassable to vehicles, the footways and gutters must in all cases be kept free.

1. The license shall be charged five shillings, and it shall remain in force twenty-one days from the date thereof and no longer.

2. Any person producing such license, which has been in any manner altered, shall be deemed an unlicensed person.

3. Any builder refusing to show his license when required so to do by any authorised officer of the Council, shall be deemed and dealt with as an unlicensed person.

4. Any person depositing building materials without being licensed so to do, or exceeding the powers granted by such license, shall forfeit and pay a sum not exceeding twenty pounds.

5. Any person failing to remove scaffolding, &c., on being requested so to do by the local authority, shall forfeit and pay twenty shillings daily for every day it shall so continue.

NIGHTMEN.

1. Every applicant for a license to ply for hire as a nightman, shall, at the same time, submit the names and residences of his proposed sureties, and on his being approved by the Council, he shall receive a license therefrom.

2. The object of the sureties and bond shall be for the protection of the health of the Municipality from the consequences of the negligent performance of the nightman's avocations.
