PUBLIC HIGHWAY BETWEEN THE MUNICIPAL DISTRICT OF BALLAARAT AND GOLDEN POINT.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir Henry Barkly, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS it is expedient that a common and public highway should be created between the municipal district of Ballaarat, and Golden Point, eastward of the said municipal district, in the direction hereinafter described: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, do hereby proclaim and order that Eyre-street, in the said municipal district, shall be continued in a line easterly and south-easterly across the River Yarrowee to Golden Point aforesaid; and that the said continuation shall be of the width of ninety-nine feet, and that there shall at all times hereafter be a common and public highway for all the liege subjects of Her Majesty, to go, return, pass and repass, on foot and on horseback, and with horses, carts, and carriages, every year, at all times of the year, at their free will and pleasure.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this thirty-first day of December, in the year of Our Lord One thousand eight hundred and fifty-six; and in the twentieth year of Her Majesty's Reign.

**REVISED REGULATIONS AND SCALE OF CHARGES
FOR TRANSMISSION OF MESSAGES BY ELECTRIC
TELEGRAPH.**

His Excellency, with the advice of the Executive Council,
has been pleased to approve of the following revised
regulations and scale of charges for transmission of messages
by Electric Telegraph, which will take effect from 1st January,
1857, in lieu of all former rules and regulations, fees and rates,
under the provisions of the Act of Council 17 Victoria No. 22.

RULES AND REGULATIONS.

1. No charge will be made for the date, address, or signature to any message.
2. Messages must be written with ink, in a clear and legible manner, and bear a proper date, address, and genuine signature.
3. Messages will be delivered free of charge within one mile of the office; over that distance, portorage will be charged;

and for messages to be delivered on shipboard, an extra charge to cover boat expenses will be made.

4. Messages will be transmitted in the order of their reception, and no precedence will be allowed in transmission, except for Government Despatches, the Police Service, and in cases of sickness or death.
5. All messages will be held strictly confidential.
6. Payment of charges in advance will be required, except for replies to interrogatory messages on which may have been written the words "Reply paid for."
7. To lessen as much as possible any liability to error in the transmission of messages from defective manuscript, it is desirable that the use of figures should be avoided, and that words at length be substituted; and the public, in using the Electric Telegraph, are requested to be particular in giving a full and correct address to every message, so that no delay in delivery may occur.
8. The offices will be kept open for the transmission of messages by the public generally between the hours of 8:30 a.m. and 8 p.m.

PETITION FOR MUNICIPAL INSTITUTIONS.
Brunswick.

IN pursuance of the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, His Excellency the Officer administering the Government of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, has directed the publication of the substance and prayer of the petition to His Excellency, hereinafter set forth, signed by two hundred and eleven householders resident within the district of Brunswick, in the county of Bourke, as defined in the said petition.

The petitioners state that the inhabitants of the district of Brunswick, as hereinafter defined, will be greatly benefited by its being constituted a municipal district, and propose the following boundaries for the same, viz.—Commencing at the bridge on the Merri Creek, at the village of Northcote, and bounded on the south by a line bearing west to the eastern boundary of the Prince's Park reserve; by the said reserve northerly and westerly to the Sydney-road; thence westerly along the northern boundary of the Royal Park reserve to the Moonee Ponds; by the said ponds north-westerly to the north-western corner of Section 126, parish of Jika Jika; thence easterly along the northern boundary of the said section and northern boundary of Section 127, parish of Jika Jika, to the Merri Creek, and by the said creek south-easterly to the point of commencement.

They further state the area of such proposed district does not exceed nine square miles, and contains a population of householders exceeding five hundred, and that no one point in the area of such district is distant more than six miles from any other point.

And the petitioners pray as follows:—
"Your petitioners therefore pray that the said district may be declared by your Excellency's Proclamation a municipal district, pursuant to the provisions of the said Act, by the name of 'The Municipal District of Brunswick,' and that the limits and boundaries of such district may be declared by such Proclamation."

PETITION FOR MUNICIPAL INSTITUTIONS, VICINITY
OF EMERALD HILL.

THE substance and prayer of a Petition addressed to His Excellency the Officer administering the Government, and signed by forty-seven householders (purporting to be the majority resident in the portion of Macarthur Ward, in the city of Melbourne, comprised within boundaries described below, and adjoining to the municipal district of Emerald Hill), are hereby published in accordance with the 3rd clause of the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15.

The petitioners state that they constitute the majority of the householders resident in a certain area, being the portion of Macarthur Ward, of the city of Melbourne, lying within the boundaries hereinafter specified, and are desirous that such area may be united with and form part of the municipal district of Emerald Hill, that is to say: Commencing from a point at the junction of the southern fence of the Melbourne and Hobson's Bay Railway Company with the River Yarra, along the said fence to the post marking the north-western angle of the boundary of the municipal district of Emerald Hill, thence in a right line to that point on the left bank of the River Yarra forming the limits of the boundary of the city of Melbourne, thence along the left bank of the River Yarra to the commencing point:

That there are on an average over thirty-six resident householders to each square mile of the said area:

That their interests and wants have been completely neglected by the Council of the city of Melbourne:

That their district is separated from the city on the north by the Yarra, and from the other portions of Macarthur Ward by a large and swampish tract of unalienated Crown Land, and that it has no community of interest or communication with the other inhabited portions of Macarthur Ward, whereas the petitioners are in close connection and constant communication

with the municipal district of Emerald Hill with which they have a common boundary line:

MUNICIPALITY OF PRAHRAN.

FIRST HALF YEARLY REPORT OF THE MUNICIPAL COUNCIL OF PRAHRAN, MADE UNDER CLAUSE 43 OF THE ACT OF 18 VICTORIA No. 15, ENDING 23RD AUGUST, 1856.

FORMATION.

THE municipal district of Prahran was gazetted 24th April, 1855, and the first meeting was held on the 23rd May, 1855, Claud Parie, Esq., in the chair, which meeting was adjourned for nine months. The adjourned meeting was held on the 21st February, 1856, the Hon. Charles Pasley, chairman, Messrs. Alexander Walker and Josh. Parker were elected assessors, and it was moved by F. J. Sargood, Esq., M.L.C., seconded by Mr. Mason, that the number of councillors be seven. An amendment was moved by J. Goodman, Esq., M.L.C., seconded by Dr. Thompson, that it was expedient to adjourn for six months. The original motion was carried by a large majority; it was also carried unanimously that the services of the council should be gratuitous. Twenty candidates were proposed, and a poll being demanded, was consented to by the Chairman. The poll was taken on the 22nd February, and conducted according to the provisions of the Act, when F. J. Sargood, Esq., M.L.C., was elected for three years, Messrs. James Mason, William Robinson Pye, and John Branscombe Crews for two years. Mr. Andrew Izett, Peter Snodgrass, Esq., M.L.C., and Mr. William Oliver for one year.

At the first meeting of the Council, 25th February, F. J. Sargood, Esq., M.L.C., was elected Chairman, and on application to the trustees and committee of the Mechanics' Institute, the temporary use of their rooms was granted for holding the council meetings.

Finance committee, 7 meetings. The chairman and councillor Mason attended all, councillor Snodgrass 4.

Market committee, 8 meetings. Councillor Mason attended 8, councillor Crews 5, councillor Pye 4, councillor Snodgrass 2.

Loam ground.—Granted.

Reductions of tolls on drays at the St. Kilda toll-gate.—Declined; but offering to remove the gate, provided the council would take charge of the Gardiner's Creek road, which the council agreed to; subsequently the Road Board have informed the council that the object cannot be carried out.

Manure depot, pound, and depasturing land.—Deferred.

Forming and draining Chapel road.—The Road Board have promised to place on the estimates a sufficient sum to effect this permanent improvement, and the Board see no objection to the council carrying it out in anticipation of the grant.

For a portion of land opposite to Fitz Roy street, St. Kilda.—Not sufficient time elapsed to receive a reply.

PUBLIC WORKS COMPLETED AND IN PROGRESS.

Williams road culvert put down and road repaired.
Removal of stumps from the roads and streets.
Chapel road repaired above the High Holborn road.
Water channels formed in Peel street, Albert street and Nelson street, Windsor, High Holborn road and Commercial road.

Commercial road repaired at Spring hill.
Contract entered into, and work commenced, to form and drain Chapel road from High Holborn road to Gardiner's Creek road.

The council, by deputations to the Road Board, have obtained leave to open out Commercial road, High Holborn road, and Nelson and Peel streets, Windsor, to the Brighton road, the Road Board contributing £300 to each of the roads, and £50 to the streets at Windsor. The remainder of the funds necessary for carrying out these objects have been raised by voluntary contributions, the council not having power to expend money out of the municipality. These projects are now being carried out by private committees, chosen by the subscribers for that purpose.

COURT HOUSE AND LOCK-UP.

This building is in course of erection, the expenses being defrayed by vote of the Legislative Council, except the sum of £150 paid for the land by the municipal council, being half the amount of the purchase money. The cost of erection is over £1300.

BYE-LAWS.

Bye-laws have been passed for the regulation of the proceedings of the council, laying a rate of One shilling in the pound; for the appropriation of £5000 voted by the Legislative Council for forming, draining and repairing the roads; the regulation of crossing over the footpaths, and the stopping of streets and thoroughfares during repairs.

RATE ROLL.

The list of names eligible to vote at the election of councillors was prepared by the town clerk, in May, and it is intended to revise it so soon as the rate collector shall have completed the delivery of the notices of assessment, as his check book will furnish a very correct list of ratepayers.

BOARD OF HEALTH.

The council, as the local board of health, have obtained from Government the appointment of sergeant Dowling as inspector of nuisances, several of which have been removed, and preliminary steps have been taken to carry out the power invested in them to the fullest extent, necessary to a well ordered and increasing community.
