TROOP HORSES REQUIRED FOR INDIA.

Extracts from Despatch Dated "Council Chamber, Fort William, 20th July. 1857."

"The Right Honorable the Governor General of India will be much obliged to His Excellency the Captain General and Governor-in-Chief of Victoria, if he will cause enquiries to be made with respect to powerful horses about five years of age, suited to carry men of the Dragoon Guards, two of which corps it is understood have been ordered to India.

"An officer will be despatched by the next steamer to Sydney to select the horses, and it would be a great convenience if the parties having horses could be induced to have the horses ready for selection at that time.

"From three to four hundred horses, at least, will be required from each of the colonies of New South Wales, Victoria and Van Liemen's Land.
