SPIRIT MERCHANTS.

THE attention of wine and spirit merchants is called to the fifth clause of the Act 20 Victoria No. 4, by which the meaning of "spirit merchant" is defined as being "any vendor of duty-paid spirituous liquors, or of duty-paid wine, or of fermented malt liquors, in quantities respectively not less than two gallons."

All persons to whom the notice applies are hereby cautioned that unless they forthwith register themselves as spirit merchants, and pay the fee as required by the above recited Act, they will be proceeded against as the law directs.

TRANSFERABLE DEBENTURES.—PRINCIPAL AND INTEREST PAYABLE ONLY IN MELBOURNE.

HIS Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has been pleased to direct that sealed tenders be invited, to be received at the Treasury, Melbourne, until Noon of the 28th instant, from persons desirous to advance the whole or any portion of the sum of Thirty-three thousand pounds sterling, secured by debentures to be issued by the Treasurer, under authority of the Act of Council 15 Victoria No. 40, as follows:—

200 due 1st January, 1867.
133 due 1st January, 1868.

These debentures were originally redeemable in 1857 and 1858 respectively, but as they had remained unsold, and had for the most part lapsed through effluxion of time, the dates have been extended to 1867 and 1868, and the debentures now form the final issue of the Water Works Loan.

1st. Each tender must be for an even sum of hundreds of pounds, and must state the year in which the tenderer wishes the debentures he tenders for to be payable.

2nd. The tenders must be sealed, and endorsed, "Tender for Government Debentures," and addressed to the Treasurer.

3rd. Should the tender be accepted, debentures in the form set forth in the schedule A to the said Act will be issued for One hundred pounds (£100) each, secured upon the revenue of the colony of Victoria, and made a first charge thereon, and will bear interest from the 1st July, 1857, at the rate of Six pounds (£6) per centum per annum, payable half-yearly, on the 1st January and the 1st July, the first payment of such interest being due on the 1st January, 1858.

4th. The debentures will be made payable to the holders, and will pass by delivery without assignment or endorsement.

5th. The amount tendered, if accepted, together with the accrued interest from the 1st July, 1857, must be paid in cash within forty-eight hours after acceptance shall have been notified to the tenderers.

6th. No tender below par will be entertained, and the Government will not necessarily accept the highest nor indeed any tender.

7th. The tenders will be opened publicly at the time and place above specified, before the Chief Secretary, the Treasurer, and such members of the Legislature as may desire to attend.

TROOP HORSES REQUIRED FOR INDIA.

EXTRACTS FROM DESPATCH DATED "COUNCIL CHAMBER, FORT WILLIAM, 20TH JULY, 1857."

"The Right Honorable the Governor General of India will be much obliged to His Excellency the Captain General and Governor-in-Chief of Victoria, if he will cause enquiries to be made with respect to powerful horses about five years of age, suited to carry men of the Dragoon Guards, two of which corps it is understood have been ordered to India.

"An officer will be despatched by the next steamer to Sydney to select the horses, and it would be a great convenience if the parties having horses could be induced to have the horses ready for selection at that time.

"From three to four hundred horses, at least, will be required from each of the colonies of New South Wales, Victoria and Van Diemen's Land.

COUNTY COURT DISTRICT OF BUNINYONG.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by a Proclamation under the hand of the Lieutenant Governor and the seal of the colony, bearing date the third day of January, in the year One thousand eight hundred and fifty-three, it was amongst other things declared and appointed that a County Court should be holden for the district of Buninyong therein defined: And whereas the said district has been altered from time to time, and it is expedient again to alter the same and the limits thereof, and to appoint that the said County Court of Buninyong shall be holden in and for the places and districts hereinafter described and defined: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, by virtue of the powers vested in me in that behalf, do alter the said district, and I do hereby appoint the portions of the said colony in and for which the said County Court of Buninyong shall have jurisdiction, and the limits thereof, to be the same as are hereinafter mentioned, that is to say:—

Commencing at a point on the northern shore of Lake Boloke; thence by a line bearing north and by the range dividing the Fiery Creek and the River Hopkins to the main dividing range; thence eastward by the main dividing range to the source of the Deep Creek; thence by the Deep Creek to the Bullarook Creek; thence by the Bullarook Creek to its source; thence by the main dividing range to the source of the Moorabool River; thence southward by the Moorabool River to its junction with the Lal-lal Rivulet; thence by a line south-westerly to the junction of William-on's Creek with the River Yarrowee; thence by a line north-westerly to the village reserve of Carngaham; thence by the boundary of that reserve and Bailie's Creek to the Emu Creek; thence by the Emu Creek and by the southern boundaries of the county of Ripon to Lake Boloke aforesaid; and thence by the eastern shore of Lake Boloke to the commencing point.

COUNTY COURT DISTRICT OF ARARAT.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of the colony of Victoria, passed in the sixteenth year of the Reign of Her present Majesty, intitled, "*An Act to make provision for the better administration of justice in County Courts in the Colony of Victoria*," it was amongst other things enacted, that local courts, to be called County Courts, should be established and holden in and for such cities, towns, counties, and other portions of the said colony of Victoria as the Lieutenant Governor should appoint; and that it should be lawful for the Lieutenant Governor of the said colony from time to time to define by proclamation the limits and boundaries of such cities, towns, counties, and portions of the said colony, and the times and places at which such courts should be holden, and such limits, boundaries, places and times to vary, alter and repeal, as the said Lieutenant Governor should think fit: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of the said colony, in pursuance of the said Act, and under and by virtue of the powers in me vested, do hereby declare and appoint that a county court, to be called the County Court of Ararat, shall be established and holden in and for the portion of the said colony, the boundaries of which are hereby defined to be as follow, that is to say:—

Commencing at a point on the northern shore of Lake Boloke; thence by a line bearing north and by the range dividing the waters of Fiery Creek and the River Hopkins to the main dividing range; thence by the main dividing range to the source of the River Avoca; thence northwards by the River Avoca to a point five miles north of Nate Yallock; thence by a line bearing west to the River Wimmera; thence by a line bearing south-westerly to Briggs' Bluff on the Grampians; thence by the Grampians range to the northern boundary of the county of Ripon; thence by the western and southern boundaries of that county to Lake Boloke; and thence by the southern and eastern shores of Lake Boloke to the commencing point.

And I do hereby direct and appoint that the said County Court of Ararat shall, until otherwise ordered, be holden at the place and time following, that is to say, at Canton Lead, on the sixteenth day of November in the present year.

And I do further declare and appoint that if the judge of the said court should not arrive at the place aforesaid in time to open such court on the day hereinbefore appointed, the same may be opened and held on any day or days following such day so appointed as aforesaid.

ARARAT JURY SPECIAL DISTRICT.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of the colony of Victoria, passed in the sixteenth year of the Reign of Her present Majesty, intitled, "*An Act to alter the Laws relative to Jurors and Juries in certain Districts*," it was amongst other things enacted that the Lieutenant Governor of the said colony, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, might, by proclamation, declare and appoint certain portions of the said colony to be districts for the purposes in the said Act mentioned, to be called "Special Districts," and might define the limits of such districts, and every such Special District should be the Jurors' District for the town and place within the limits of such "Special District" at which any court for the trial by jury of any civil or criminal issues or the assessment of damages should be holden; and it was also enacted that the said Lieutenant Governor might, in his discretion, once in every three months direct the Court of Petty Sessions at any town or place where any court for the trial by jury of civil or criminal issues or assessment of damages had been or should thereafter be appointed to be holden, such town or place being within the limits of any of the said Special Districts, to cause jury lists for such Special District to be prepared, and might limit as occasion required the times within which such lists should be prepared, published, corrected, revised, and recorded, and the jurors' book made therefrom, and might appoint the day from and after which such jurors' book should be brought into use and should be used: And whereas by a Proclamation bearing even date herewith a certain district has been appointed and defined in and for which the County Court of Ararat is to be holden: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, by virtue of the power vested in me in that behalf, do hereby declare and appoint the district of Ararat aforesaid to be a "Special District," under the provisions of the said Act; And I do hereby direct, limit, and appoint, that the Jury List for the said Special District shall be prepared and published by the Court of Petty Sessions at Canton Lead, on or before the twentieth day of October now next ensuing, and shall be corrected, revised, and recorded on or before the thirtieth day of the said month of October, and that the jurors' book shall be made therefrom on or before the sixth day of the month of November, in the present year, and that such jurors' book shall be brought into use and be used in and for the said district from and after the sixth day of November aforesaid.

EAST COLLINGWOOD MUNICIPALITY.

THE THIRD HALF-YEARLY REPORT OF THE MUNICIPAL COUNCIL OF EAST COLLINGWOOD.

(Made pursuant to the provisions of the Municipal Institutions Act, 18 Victoria No. 15, sec. 43.)

EXTENSION OF MUNICIPAL BOUNDARIES.

THE boundaries of East Collingwood were extended by proclamation, dated the 8th of January, 1857, from the line of houses therein to the centre of the following streets or roads, namely, Smith street, Heidelberg road, and Victoria

street, thirty-three feet from the said line of houses of Victoria parade.

The petition of the municipal council, and that from about six hundred ratepayers, the latter presented by a deputation from the council to His Excellency General Macarthur, have not been complied with. The prayer of this petition solicited the extension of the municipal boundaries of East Collingwood, so as to include therein the Studley Park reserve, in trust to the council for the purposes of health and recreation to the inhabitants of East Collingwood in particular, and the people of Victoria in general.

The petition referred to the duty which would, in compliance with its prayer, devolve upon the municipal council to preserve the fine timber of the park, and efficiently to maintain it as a public reserve.

A counter-petition was subsequently presented, signed by one hundred and twenty landholders, &c., of Kew, Boroondara and Hawthorn, against the petitions from East Collingwood. The council, by resolution, stated that "this petition contained gross misrepresentations, altogether at variance with the substance and prayer of the petition from East Collingwood."

The municipal district of East Collingwood was on the 23rd December, 1856, appointed by His Excellency the officer administering the government, "to be a district for the inspection of slaughter-houses and of cattle intended for slaughter within the meaning of the 4th clause of the Act of Council 3 William IV. No. 1.

MUNICIPAL CONFERENCE.

The changes in the Government and the adjournments of Parliament consequent thereupon, with other causes, have prevented the introduction into the Legislative Assembly this session of a Bill to amend the Municipal Institutions Act; but the necessity for such Bill becomes more urgent from increased experience of the working of the present Act. The council have supplied Captain Clarke, R.E., M.I.A., with an analytical and alphabetical list of the subjects discussed by the municipal conference, with their decisions respectively thereon, and also with a supplemental list of suggestive amendments of the Act not considered by such conference. Captain Clarke has announced his intention of availing himself of all these suggestions, when practicable and desirable, in the Bill he proposes to introduce during the ensuing session of the Legislative Assembly.

BYE-LAWS.

The following bye-laws have been adopted by council, with the exception of No. 11, under re-consideration, from suggestions by Law Officers of the Crown:—

No. 11.—To enforce compulsory payment of municipal rates.

No. 12.—To impose a rate of One shilling in the pound on the rateable property of the municipal district of East Collingwood for the year 1857.

No. 13.—To amend bye-law No. 4, for the regulation and government of nightmen plying for hire within the municipal limits of East Collingwood.

EAST COLLINGWOOD STREETS.

Proclaimed. See *Government Gazette*, 27th April and 11th May, 1857.

EAST COLLINGWOOD IMPROVEMENT BILL.

A select committee has been appointed, and held numerous meetings, for the purpose of preparing an Improvement Bill, based on the Fitz Roy Ward Improvement Act, to be introduced into Parliament, to empower the council to form new and extend present streets, with a view to the more efficient drainage of the district, and the further promotion of public convenience. The erection of public baths is also part of these proposed improvements.

The municipal district comprises an area of 1065 acres, with 25 miles of streets laid out thereon. It is the recipient of the surface drainage of a large portion of Fitz Roy Ward, and of about 800 acres of Crown lands; yet, exclusive of Reilly street drain, it contains but two main drainage lines to the Yarra, namely, Johnston street, requiring alteration of level in part, and Gipps street, the latter about to be formed on its permanent level.

The necessity to open up new streets through narrow lanes and thoroughfares, as well as by intersecting other lines of communication, the council deem urgent as respects public health, interest, and convenience. To effect the projected improvements, a legislative grant in aid would be requisite.

VALUATION OF THE MUNICIPALITY.

The rateable property of East Collingwood was valued by Mr. C. Le Cren, and the appeals against such valuation were heard and decided on by non-resident magistrates, who made a considerable reduction in the valuation, chiefly of unoccupied lands. The nett amount of value of the rateable property of the said municipality is £76,943 10s., producing, at 1s. in the pound, the sum of £3847 3s. 6d. for 1857.

PUBLIC WORKS IN THE MUNICIPALITY COMPLETED OR IN PROGRESS

BY THE GOVERNMENT.

REILLY STREET DRAIN.

This drain is just on the eve of completion. It commences at the intersection of Smith and Reilly streets, and continues along the latter street to the Yarra.

COLLINGWOOD BRIDGE.

The foundation stone of this bridge was laid by the Honorable Captain Andrew Clarke, R.E., M.L.A., Provincial Grand Master of Freemasons for Victoria, under the Grand Lodge of England, assisted by a numerous assemblage of the brethren, under the English, Irish and Scottish Grand Lodges. The ceremony was attended by sectional divisions of the Independent Order of Odd Fellows, the East Collingwood Company of the Volunteer Artillery Regiment, the Collingwood Volunteer Fire Brigade, the pupils of the schools in the district, and several thousands of spectators. The bridge is now rapidly approaching to completion.

LOCK-UP.

This building is now completed, and will be open for the reception of prisoners, on arrangements being made for daily adjudication on such cases by the magistrates.

PUBLIC WORKS BY THE MUNICIPAL COUNCIL, COMPLETED, IN PROGRESS AND PROJECTED.

Metalling Sackville, Easy, Budd, Oxford and Cambridge streets.

Forming Hotham, Gold, Alexander, Ballarat, Bendigo and Forest streets.

Kerbing footways, pitching water channels, and forming and metalling, on improved level, Victoria street.

Contingent on obtaining a loan to effect the same, works are proposed to be executed throughout the whole district.

SANATORY CONDITION OF EAST COLLINGWOOD.

The health officer, Dr. Livingston, reports the municipality to be more healthy than the preceding half-year.

The Inspector, Sergeant Nimon, is instructed to remove all nuisances, and complaints thereof meet with the prompt attention of council.

The council have carefully considered each petition, and complied with its prayer whenever practicable.

THE CENSUS OF EAST COLLINGWOOD, TAKEN 28TH MARCH, 1857.

MISCELLANEOUS.

The repeated applications of council have at last led to a sum being put on the public estimates for additional letter-carriers below Hoddle street to the Yarra, the eastern municipal boundary. This arrangement is expected to come into operation the 1st July, 1857, ensuing.

The sum of two thousand pounds, for the erection of a Police Court, is also to be placed upon the public estimates of the year.*

The council have held their meetings since 10th March last at Seven o'clock in the evening; and the large attendance of ratepayers thereat evince the interest they take in the public affairs of East Collingwood.

Gas mains have been laid on some of the principal streets of East Collingwood, and the shops of which were first lighted with gas on

* Granted.

At the request of the council, additional local magistrates are to be put in commission, with the view to a more regular despatch of bench business, and the convenience of suitors.

FINANCE.

The council have intimation of moiety of legislative grant of £66,000 to eleven municipalities, including that of East Collingwood, whose first portion of such moiety will be £3000. The second moiety will be regulated in amount by that of rates collected the first municipal year.

The numerous public works required render the ordinary income totally inadequate thereto, and the necessity of adequate endowment of the municipality with Crown lands becomes constantly more urgent.

To prevent continued misapprehensions, the council hereby intimate to ratepayers that all tenants, unless by written agreement to the contrary, can deduct half the amount of municipal rates which they may have paid, from rent payable by them thereafter; that all unpaid rates remain as a lien on the property, and must be paid by the then owner thereof or the next occupier.
