SPIRIT MERCHANTS.

THE attention of wine and spirit merchants is called to the fifth clause of the Act 20 Victoria No. 4, by which the meaning of "spirit merchant" is defined as being "any vendor of duty-paid spirituous liquors, or of duty-paid wine, or of fermented malt liquors, in quantities respectively not less than two gallons."

All persons to whom the notice applies are hereby cautioned that unless they forthwith register themselves as spirit merchants, and pay the fee as required by the above recited Act, they will be proceeded against as the law directs.

BREWERS' LICENSES.

ALL persons, vendors of duty-paid wine or of fermented malt liquors in quantities respectively not less than two gallons, who have taken out "Brewers'" licenses under the impression that the "Spirit Merchant's" license was not requisite for their carrying on the trade in question, are hereby cautioned against their error, and are informed that they are liable to the penalties of the Act for selling such wine, &c., without taking out a license as a spirit merchant.

MUNICIPAL DISTRICT OF BRUNSWICK.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of the colony of Victoria, passed in the eighteenth year of the Reign of Her present Majesty, intituled, "*An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria*," it was amongst other things enacted, That any district of the colony of Victoria, the area whereof should not exceed nine square miles, and which should contain a population of householders not less than three hundred, might, subject to the provisions of the said Act, be constituted a municipal district as thereafter mentioned, provided that no one point in any such area should be distant more than six miles from any other point; And it was further enacted that it

should be lawful for the Lieutenant Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, on the receipt of a petition signed by not less than one hundred and fifty householders resident within any such district, praying that such district might be declared a municipal district under the said Act, to cause the substance and prayer of such petition to be published in the *Government Gazette*, and (if no counter petition, signed by an equal or greater number of householders resident within such locality, should have been delivered at the office of the Colonial Secretary within one month from the date of such publication) the Lieutenant Governor, with the advice aforesaid, might, if he should think fit, declare by Proclamation such locality a municipal district by a name to be mentioned in such Proclamation, and also by the same or any other Proclamation might define the limits and boundaries of such municipal district, and such limits and boundaries at any time thereafter in the same manner, on receipt of a similar petition, might vary and alter, but so as in no case save as thereafter mentioned to include within the limits or boundaries of such municipal district an area of more than nine square miles, and upon the publication of any such Proclamation in the *Government Gazette*, such locality so defined should be deemed and taken to be a municipal district within the meaning of the said Act; And whereas a petition has been presented to His Excellency the Governor by the householders residing within the locality called and known as the district of Brunswick, in the county of Bourke, the substance and prayer of which petition have been published as directed by the said Act, and no counter-petition, signed as aforesaid, has been delivered in opposition thereto; And whereas it is deemed expedient to annex a portion of land comprised within the corporate limits of the city of Melbourne to the municipal district petitioned for, and the mayor and council of the said city have declared their intention not to advance any claim in respect to the portion of land proposed to be severed from the said city on account of the loan secured on the corporate revenues of the said city: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, do by this my Proclamation, in pursuance of the provisions of the said Act, with the advice of the Executive Council, declare that the district hereinafter described and named shall be a municipal district within the meaning of the said Act, that is to say:—

THE MUNICIPAL DISTRICT OF BRUNSWICK.—Commencing at the north-western angle of the Royal Park, on the eastern banks of the Moonee Ponds; thence east by the northern boundary of the Royal Park, and by a line bearing east crossing the main road to Sydney, to the Merri Creek; thence northwards by the Merri Creek to the north-eastern angle of portion 127, parish of Jika-jika; thence west by the northern boundaries of portions 127 and 126, crossing the Sydney road, in the same parish, to the Moonee Ponds aforesaid; and thence southwards by the Moonee Ponds to the north-western angle of the Royal Park, the commencing point.

And I do hereby, with the advice aforesaid, direct that the council of the said municipal district shall be called by the name and style of "The Municipal Council of Brunswick."

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this twenty-ninth day of September, in the year of Our Lord One thousand eight hundred and fifty-seven, and in the twenty-first year of Her Majesty's Reign.
