REGULATIONS UNDER WHICH THE ABOVEMENTIONED REWARD OF ONE THOUSAND POUNDS IS OFFERED FOR THE DISCOVERY OF A FIRST-CLASS BUILDING STONE.

1st. The stone must be, to obtain the full reward, a limestone. It must be situated in a locality easy of access, and affording such facilities that the material can be brought into Melbourne at a moderate cost.

2nd. The quarries must be capable of yielding large quantities, and in large blocks.

3rd. Although a limestone would be greatly preferred, a very superior sandstone would be admissible for a reward.

4th. The Board appointed to adjudicate will be empowered to apportion the reward into two or more sums, should it be considered that none of the samples submitted were fully adequate for the requirements of the Government, but were yet capable of being usefully employed.

5th. The Board will be the sole judges of all matters connected with this proposal, and will make their award, taking into account the quality of the material, its color, its fitness for superior building purposes, and its cost.

6th. Sample blocks, containing not less than eight cubic feet, to be forwarded to the office of the Architect to the Houses of Parliament, on or before 1st December, 1857.

7th. All sample blocks sent in will be the property of the Government.

THE attention of wine and spirit merchants is called to the fifth clause of the Act 20 Victoria No. 4, by which the meaning of "spirit merchant" is defined as being "any vendor of duty-paid spirituous liquors, or of duty-paid wine, or of fermented malt liquors, in quantities respectively not less than two gallons."

All persons to whom the notice applies are hereby cautioned that unless they forthwith register themselves as spirit merchants, and pay the fee as required by the above recited Act, they will be proceeded against as the law directs.

RICHMOND GAOL.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by a Proclamation under the hand of the then Lieutenant Governor and the seal of the colony, bearing date the twenty-sixth day of August, in the year One thousand eight hundred and fifty-four, certain buildings, consisting of ten separate cells, situate in the Richmond police barracks, near Melbourne, were proclaimed to be a prison for members of the police force undergoing sentences: And whereas it is deemed expedient to extend the use of the said buildings for the confinement of prisoners generally, whether members of the police force or others: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, do by this my proclamation declare the said buildings hereinbefore described to be a gaol and house of correction, within the meaning of an Act of the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of Victoria, passed in the sixteenth year of Her present Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to make provision for the better control and disposal of Offenders," for the reception and safe keeping as well of members of the police force as of other offenders undergoing sentences.

EXTRACTS FROM DESPATCH DATED "COUNCIL CHAMBER, FORT WILLIAM, 20TH JULY, 1857."

"The Right Honorable the Governor General of India will be much obliged to His Excellency the Captain General and Governor-in-Chief of Victoria, if he will cause enquiries to be made with respect to powerful horses about five years of age, suited to carry men of the Dragoon Guards, two of which corps it is understood have been ordered to India.

"An officer will be despatched by the next steamer to Sydney to select the horses, and it would be a great convenience if the parties having horses could be induced to have the horses ready for selection at that time.

"From three to four hundred horses, at least, will be required from each of the colonies of New South Wales, Victoria and Van Diemen's Land.

MUNICIPALITY OF BALLAARAT.

BYE-LAW No. 13.—TO PREVENT FIRES IN CHIMNEY FLUES AND TO CAUSE WATER DRAWERS TO GIVE PROMPT AID AT FIRES. (Regulations under the 18th Vic. No. 15).

THE occupier of any premises within the Municipality of Ballarat whose chimney-flue shall take fire from having become foul, shall, upon conviction before two or more justices of the peace, forfeit and pay for every such offence a sum not exceeding Five pounds.

1. Every licensed water drawer shall keep his cart or dray loaded with water from sunset to sunrise and on Sundays, and on neglect thereof, unless reasonable cause can be proved for the same, he shall forfeit and pay for every such offence a sum not exceeding Forty shillings.

2. Every licensed water drawer when called upon to attend a fire by a policeman or fireman, shall on neglect or refusal of the same, unless upon good and sufficient grounds, forfeit and pay for every such offence a sum not exceeding Forty shillings.

3. Every licensed carter intending to carry water for hire regularly, shall state the same to the town clerk on his issuing such license, which shall be so endorsed, and every licensed carter occasionally drawing water shall register his name to that effect at the office of the town clerk, and on the water drawer neglecting the same he shall forfeit and pay a sum not exceeding Twenty shillings.

4. Every licensed regular or occasional water drawer shall have his designation as such painted in white on black ground, or in black on white ground, over his door or other conspicuous part of his dwelling, and on neglect thereof he shall forfeit and pay a sum not exceeding Twenty shillings.

The foregoing Bye-law, No. 13, made by the municipal council of Ballarat, has been assented to by His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council.

PETITION FOR MUNICIPAL INSTITUTIONS.

NEWTOWN AND CHILWELL (GEELONG).

IN pursuance of the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has directed the publication of the substance and prayer of a Petition addressed to His Excellency, as hereinafter set forth, signed by three hundred and thirty-six ratepayers and householders of the districts of Newtown and Chilwell, within the corporate limits of the town of Geelong, in the county of Grant.

The petitioners state that they are desirous of having the districts of Newtown and Chilwell separated from the corporation of Geelong, and formed into a municipality, bounded as shown on a plan, viz.:—"Commencing at the junction of Aberdeen street with La Trobe terrace, and bounded on the north by the centre of Aberdeen street, bearing west 1 mile 23 chains; on the east by the centre of the Great Western road, bearing north 20 chains; on the north, again by the centre of the Great Western road, bearing west 51 chains; on the west by the centre of the Government road in front of the Orphan Asylum, bearing south to the River Barwon 24 chains 50 links; on the west again and south, by the centre of the River Barwon as far as La Trobe terrace; and on the east by the centre of La Trobe terrace, bearing north 1 mile 12 chains, back to the commencing point."

They further state that the area defined is less than nine square miles, that no one point therein is distant more than six miles from any other point, and that the population far exceeds three hundred.

And the petitioners pray as follows:—

"Your petitioners therefore humbly pray that the said districts of Newtown and Chilwell may be declared a municipal district."
