QUARANTINE.

NOTICE TO MASTERS OF VESSELS PROCEEDING TO SYDNEY.

N intimation having been received from the Government of New South Wales that it has been deemed expedient, until it shall have been officially reported to them that Melbourne is free from Small-Pox, to subject all vessels arriving from this port to the Quarantine Laws, and to make an Order that the Passengers and Crews shall not be permitted to be landed until they shall have received pratique in the usual way; and also suggesting that it would facilitate the early release of vessels arriving at Sydney, subject to the abovementioned regulation, if the Government of Victoria would adopt measures for furnishing the commanders with Bills of Health during the prevalence of Small-Pox in Melbourne: It is hereby notified that masters of vessels will be furnished with such Bills of Health on clearing outwards at the Custom House.
