RELEASE OF INTERDICTED PREMISES.

ORDER OF THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

*At the Government House, Melbourne, the 26th day of October, 1857.*

**W**HEREAS by an Order of the Governor in Council, bearing date the 19th day of October instant, it was directed that, except as hereinafter mentioned, no persons whatsoever should have access to, or depart from, a certain wooden house situate at the west end of Jeffcott street, North Melbourne, being the second house west of that numbered 6, and inhabited by a man named Kirk, whose child was ill of small-pox, provided nevertheless that a legally qualified medical practitioner might at all times have free access and egress to and from the said premises: And whereas the said child has been removed from the said premises, and it is expedient to rescind such Order: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth hereby revoke the said Order.

And the Honorable William Clark Haines, Her Majesty's Chief Secretary for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.
