 PETITION FOR MUNICIPAL INSTITUTIONS.  
 SOUTH BARWON.

IN pursuance of the Act of Council, 18 Victoria No. 15, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has directed the publication of the substance and prayer of a petition addressed to His Excellency as hereinafter set forth, signed by two hundred and eighteen householders, residing south of the River Barwon, and within the corporate boundaries of the town of Geelong, in the county of Grant.

The petitioners state that they are subjected to great loss through the state of the main line of roads leading into the town of Geelong, and have in vain applied to the corporation to render them passable.

That they have held several public meetings on this subject, and have after due consideration resolved to petition to be separated from the corporation of Geelong, and to be constituted a district municipality.

They further state that the area of the land south of the River Barwon and within the corporate boundaries of Geelong, is less than nine square miles and contains upwards of three hundred householders, and that no point in such area is distant six miles from any other point.

And the petitioners pray as follows:—

"Your petitioners therefore earnestly pray that your Excellency will be pleased to proclaim this portion of the town of Geelong to be a district municipality, in accordance with the Act 18 Victoria No. 15, under the name or title of 'The South Barwon Municipality.'"

#### MEMORIAL FOR A ROAD DISTRICT.

HAMPDEN AND HEYTESBURY.

THE substance and prayer of a memorial to His Excellency the Governor, adopted at a public meeting of the landholders of the counties of Hampden and Heytesbury, held at Camperdown on the 16th ultimo, and praying for the separa-

tion of the county of Hampden from the Warrnambool Road District and the constitution of a new road district, are published below for general information.

By His Excellency's Command,  
 C. PASLEY.

The memorialists state that their distance from Warrnambool would prevent their being fully and fairly represented at the Warrnambool District Road Board; that the principal trade of those portions of the counties of Hampden and Heytesbury that they pray to be proclaimed a road district, is transacted in Geelong, which town is their shipping port, and consequently the repair and maintenance of the roads leading thereto are of paramount importance; that the population engaged in agricultural pursuits has greatly increased, a large quantity of land having been purchased from the Crown and brought under cultivation.

The memorialists point out that no objection can be made by the Warrnambool Board on the ground of their having entered into contracts on the faith of this year's assessment being collected, as the assessment has been already paid.

They recommend the boundaries of the proposed road district to be as follow:—Commencing at a point on Mount Emu Creek, being the north-east corner of the county of Hampden; thence by a line bearing in a southerly direction to the source of the Gnarket chain of Ponds; thence by the latter to its confluence with lake Corangamite; thence by the eastern shore of Lake Corangamite to the junction of it with Perrin Yaloak Creek, being the eastern boundary of the county of Hampden; thence by the Perrin Yaloak Creek  $5\frac{1}{2}$  miles in a southerly direction; thence by a line bearing west about 32 miles; thence by a line bearing north crossing Mount Emu Creek, along the western boundaries of the parishes of Terang and Glenormiston and eastern boundary of the parish of Mortlake to its north-east angle; thence by the north boundary of the latter to the intersection of the main road leading from Camperdown and Glenormiston, &c.; thence by the proposed continuation of the said road on to Hexham; thence by the river Hopkins in a northerly direction, being the western boundary of the county of Hampden, to a point where the northern boundary of the county of Hampden intersects it; and thence by the latter to the point of commencement, allowing that portion of the county of Hampden, being the south-west corner from the parish of Terang to Hexham, which is associated with the Warrnambool District in business and traffic, to remain under the control of the Warrnambool Road Board, and allowing the north-east corner of the county of Heytesbury, being a part of the pastoral and agricultural district of Timboon, to be under the control of the board now asked for.

And the memorialists pray as follows:—  
 "Your memorialists therefore pray that your Excellency will be pleased to revoke the proclamation annexing the whole of the county of Hampden to the Warrnambool Road Board District, and that you will proclaim those portions of the counties of Hampden and Heytesbury now prayed for, a road district under the control of its own local board."

 MEMORIAL FOR A ROAD DISTRICT.  
 DUNDAS.

THE substance and prayer of a memorial addressed to His Excellency the Governor, and signed by two hundred and thirty-three freeholders and other inhabitants of the county of Dundas, praying for the separation of the said county from the Portland road district, and the constitution of a new road district, are published below for general information.

By His Excellency's Command,

The memorialists state that a large portion of the amount raised by assessment by the Portland district road board has been levied in the county of Dundas, the inhabitants of which county, in consequence of their great distance from the town of Portland (where the sittings of the district road board are held), are unable to control the application of the fund, and consequently to procure the expenditure of a fair proportion in their county.

The memorialists consider that Hamilton is the county town of Dundas (all elections being held there, as well as the courts of general and petty sessions and county courts, and the stipendiary magistrate and commissioner of Crown Lands also residing there), and that as it is situate on the verge of the counties of Dundas and Normanby, and within a few miles of the boundary of the county of Villiers, it would be inexpedient that the boundary of Dundas should form the boundary of the new road district. They therefore propose that about 150,000 acres of the county of Normanby, and 50,000 acres of the county of Villiers, should be included in the new district.

And the memorialists in substance pray as follows: That His Excellency would proclaim a new road district, of which the county of Dundas should form the principal part, and that so much of the counties of Normanby and Villiers as is comprised in the police district of Hamilton should be included therein, the boundary line of the proposed district to run "from Koroite Creek to Braxholme, from thence to Mount Napier, from thence to Penshurst, from thence to Mount Abrupt including the township of Dunkeld, and thence from the boundary of Villiers to the boundary of Dundas."

MUNICIPALITY OF WARRNAMBOOL.  
SECOND HALF-YEARLY REPORT OF THE MUNICIPAL COUNCIL OF WARRNAMBOOL, MADE PURSUANT TO THE PROVISIONS OF THE MUNICIPAL INSTITUTIONS ACT, 18 VICTORIA No. 15, ADOPTED BY COUNCIL, 28TH JANUARY, 1857.

#### PUBLIC WORKS.

DURING the half-year now terminated, the council, on the recommendation of the town surveyor, have undertaken two very important works—one, the driving of a tunnel from the north-eastern portion of the town to the level of high water mark, near the beach; and the other, the formation of Timor and Banyan streets.

The north-eastern portion of the town being a natural basin depressed to within a few feet of high water mark, and possessing no outlet whatever, the only means by which it could be drained was by driving a tunnel through the ridge of land on the south side in the direction of the coast. The length of the tunnel now in progress will be 27 chains, 14 chains of which have already been excavated. It is hoped that when this work is completed this part will be as healthy as the rest of the town. Had the district in question been left in its present state, from the total absence of drainage, and the lowness of the level above high water mark, serious evils would doubtless have resulted when the town came to be more thickly inhabited.

The second work alluded to, and which is now nearly completed, the formation of two of the principal streets, has also been undertaken partly with a view to drainage, since by levelling Timor street the storm water of nearly one quarter of the town will be carried along it. The work, from the inequalities of the land on which the town is built, is somewhat costly, the amount of cutting and embanking required being considerable. The same circumstance has also operated against private individuals, as several valuable properties have been seriously injured by the improvements, and great expense entailed upon the owners. It was deemed advisable, however, to reduce the streets at once to their permanent level before any further building should have been proceeded with.

A portion of Merri street, where it was most required, has also been partially levelled, the solid rock having been cut down and a good roadway made for vehicles.

#### LEGISLATIVE.

The council, on the 30th July, passed bye-laws for levying a town rate of one shilling in the pound, and for appropriating the government grant of £4000. The bye-laws were assented to by His Excellency the Governor, and gazetted on the 30th of December.

The provisions of the Health of Towns Act (except clauses VIII. and IX., omitted on the suggestion of the council) were extended to the township by a Proclamation dated the 11th of August, and gazetted on the 12th of August.

The provisions of the Dog Act, 6 William IV. No. 4 were also, at the request of the Council, extended to the township, the notice of such extension being dated the 3rd of September, and gazetted on the 5th of September.

#### APPLICATIONS TO GOVERNMENT.

The Council have made the following applications to the Government, with the results mentioned.

That the footways should be proclaimed of the width of 15 feet.—Granted.

The laying out of a street, a chain and a half wide, through the Government Reserve, section 4; the laying out of a crescent on the south side, and the grant to the council of the eastern portion of the reserve formed by the proposed street, (except the site of the New Post Office), as a site for a town hall, market and other municipal purposes.

With reference to this application, the suggestion of the council for the laying out of a street and crescent was adopted, and a tracing of the land was transmitted, showing that two roads and four perches in the eastern portion of the reserve, fronting Timor street, have been set apart for a town hall; two roads and four perches for a mechanics' institute; three roads and thirty-six perches for a market; and ten perches for a public well; the former application of the council for a site for a town hall being considered as withdrawn.

Tracings, shewing two new streets through sections 26 and 28, laid out at the suggestion of the council, and also the land proposed to be set apart for a pound, cattle market and slaughtering yards have also been transmitted to the council.

#### TRAMWAY FROM THE JETTY TO THE TOWN.

It was suggested by the council that the unexpended balance of the sum voted for public works in Warrnambool in 1856 should be appropriated towards the formation of a tramway from the jetty to the town. This suggestion has been adopted by the Commissioner of Public Works, the council undertaking to furnish the difference between the amount of the lowest tender and the unexpended balance.

Roads to cemetery and punt on the River Hopkins.—Granted. Provision for conveyance of mails from the jetty to the town.—The subject will receive consideration.

#### FINANCE.

The second moiety of the Government grant has been received, and the greater portion of the town rate has been collected.

#### ATTENDANCE OF MEMBERS.

The number of ordinary meetings, from the 9th of July, 1856, to the 3rd of January, 1857, has been twenty-four.

The Chairman was present at 18 meetings.
