PREVENTION OF INFECTIOUS DISEASE.

ORDER OF THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House, Melbourne, the 5th day of November, 1857.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Governor and Legislative Council of New South Wales, passed in the third year of the Reign of His late Majesty King William the Fourth, intituled, "*An Act for subjecting vessels coming to New South Wales from certain places to the performance of Quarantine,*" it was amongst other things enacted that it should be lawful for the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, in case of any infectious disease as therein mentioned appearing or breaking out in the colony of New South Wales, to make such order, and to give such directions, in order to cut off all communication between any persons infected with any such disease and the rest of His Majesty's subjects as should appear to the said Governor and the said Council to be necessary and expedient for that purpose: And whereas the person hereinafter named, and occupying the premises hereinafter described, has refused to allow his child, who has been attacked with small-pox, to be removed to the place appointed for the reception of persons so attacked: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present order direct that, except as hereinafter mentioned, no persons whosoever shall have access to or depart from the following tenement, that is to say, a wooden house situate at the west end of Jeffcott street, North Melbourne, being the second house west of that numbered 6, and inhabited by a man named KIRK, whose child is ill of small-pox: Provided nevertheless that a legally qualified medical practitioner may at all times have free access and egress to and from the said premises.

And the Honorable William Clark Haines, Her Majesty's Chief Secretary for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.
