MURDER OF LOMBARDINO PIETRO.

FIFTY POUNDS REWARD.

Gorio left in company with two persons named Carlos and Alessandro, mates of the deceased, and returned with them to the tent about Eight o'clock on the same morning. Gorio, Carlos, and Alessandro soon after went to a store on the race-course, where Gorio left Carlos and Alessandro, and went to Sailor's Gully, about five miles distant. Gorio, on his return to the tent, about Seven o'clock in the evening, found the murdered man with his throat cut in three places, and his head beaten in.

#### ASSESSMENT.

Messrs. Billings and Lawson were appointed assessors of the municipality, and the council having held several special general meetings, finally adopted a valuation representing 1491 rateable properties, amounting in the aggregate to £64,774 10s.; a rate of 1s. in the pound was struck, and the first moiety of it became due on the 1st September, 1857.

#### APPEALS.

Courts of appeal were held at the police office, when the total number of appeals made were twenty-four, and the amount of reductions from the entire assessment was £750, leaving an assessment balance of £64,024 10s., a result which the council consider highly satisfactory.

#### ALTERATION OF TIME OF MEETING.

The time at which the council met having been considered inconvenient, inasmuch as it did not allow of the ratepayers being present, it was resolved, on the 16th of April last, that the council should thereafter meet every Wednesday evening, at seven o'clock.
