## DANDENONG ROAD DISTRICT.

### PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir Henry Barkly, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of the colony of Victoria, passed in the sixteenth year of Her present Majesty's Reign, intituled, "An Act for making and improving Roads in the colony of Victoria," it was amongst other things enacted that it should be lawful for the Lieutenant Governor, from time to time, by notice in the *Government Gazette*, to proclaim and declare any such portion of the said colony as to him should seem meet, as and to be a road district for the purposes in the said Act contained, and also to define the boundaries of every road district thereby proclaimed and declared, and to give a specific name or designation to every such road district: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, in pursuance of the power so vested in me by the said Act, and of every other power and authority enabling me in this behalf, do hereby proclaim and declare that the district hereinafter defined shall be a road district for the purposes in the said Act contained, that is to say:—Commencing at a point on the Dandenong Creek, at the north-east corner of portion 101, parish of Mulgrave; thence by the Dandenong Creek southerly to the south-east corner of portion IV., parish of Dandenong; thence due west to the north-west corner of portion VIII., parish of Mordialloc; thence south to the sea-coast; thence by the sea-coast to a line produced from the south boundary of the parish of Lyndhurst; thence by that line east to a distance of twenty-one miles beyond the township of Dandenong; thence by a line north to a line produced from the north boundary of the parish of Berwick; thence by that line west to the north-east boundary of portion V., parish of Eumemmerring; thence by a line north to a point seven miles north of the township of Dandenong; thence by a line due west to the commencing point.

And I do hereby further proclaim and declare that the specific name or designation of such road district shall be "The Dandenong Road District."

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this fifth day of February, in the year of Our Lord One thousand eight hundred and fifty-seven, and in the twentieth year of Her Majesty's Reign.

MUNICIPALITY OF WARRNAMBOOL.

BYE-LAW No. 4.—TO ENFORCE THE CLEANING OF CHIMNEY FLUES.  
 THE occupier of any premises within the said district whereof any chimney flue shall take fire from having been suffered to become foul, shall for every such offence, on conviction before any two or more justices of the peace, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding five pounds: Provided that if any defendant shall plead that such chimney flue did not take fire in consequence of being foul, the proof thereof shall lie with such defendant.

MUNICIPALITY OF WARRNAMBOOL.

BYE-LAW No. 5.—TO PREVENT THE STACKING OF HAY IN LARGE QUANTITIES IN THE TOWN.  
 THE occupier of any premises within the town of Warrnambool whereon a larger quantity of hay than one ton shall be stacked at any one time shall, for every such offence, on conviction before any two or more justices of the peace, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding ten pounds for a first offence, or not exceeding twenty pounds for a second or subsequent offence: Provided that if any defendant shall plead that the quantity of hay so stacked as aforesaid was less than a ton, the proof thereof shall lie with such defendant.

PETITION FOR MUNICIPAL INSTITUTIONS.  
 SOUTH BARWON.

IN pursuance of the Act of Council, 18 Victoria No. 15, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has directed the publication of the substance and prayer of a petition addressed to His Excellency as hereinafter set forth, signed by two hundred and eighteen householders, residing south of the River Barwon, and within the corporate boundaries of the town of Geelong, in the county of Grant.

The petitioners state that they are subjected to great loss through the state of the main line of roads leading into the town of Geelong, and have in vain applied to the corporation to render them passable.  
 That they have held several public meetings on this subject, and have after due consideration resolved to petition to be separated from the corporation of Geelong, and to be constituted a district municipality.

They further state that the area of the land south of the River Barwon and within the corporate boundaries of Geelong, is less than nine square miles and contains upwards of three hundred householders, and that no point in such area is distant six miles from any other point.

And the petitioners pray as follows:—

“Your petitioners therefore earnestly pray that your Excellency will be pleased to proclaim this portion of the town of Geelong to be a district municipality, in accordance with the Act 18 Victoria No. 15, under the name or title of ‘The South Barwon Municipality.’”

**PUBLIC WORKS.**

DURING the half-year now terminated, the council, on the recommendation of the town surveyor, have undertaken two very important works—one, the driving of a tunnel from the north-eastern portion of the town to the level of high water mark, near the beach; and the other, the formation of Timor and Banyan streets.

The north-eastern portion of the town being a natural basin depressed to within a few feet of high water mark, and possessing no outlet whatever, the only means by which it could be drained was by driving a tunnel through the ridge of land on the south side in the direction of the coast. The length of the tunnel now in progress will be 27 chains, 14 chains of which have already been excavated. It is hoped that when this work is completed this part will be as healthy as the rest of the town. Had the district in question been left in its present state, from the total absence of drainage, and the lowness of the level above high water mark, serious evils would doubtless have resulted when the town came to be more thickly inhabited.

The second work alluded to, and which is now nearly completed, the formation of two of the principal streets, has also been undertaken partly with a view to drainage, since by levelling Timor street the storm water of nearly one quarter of the town will be carried along it. The work, from the inequalities of the land on which the town is built, is somewhat costly, the amount of cutting and embanking required being considerable. The same circumstance has also operated against private individuals, as several valuable properties have been seriously injured by the improvements, and great expense entailed upon the owners. It was deemed advisable, however, to reduce the streets at once to their permanent level before any further building should have been proceeded with.

A portion of Merri street, where it was most required, has also been partially levelled, the solid rock having been cut down and a good roadway made for vehicles.

**LEGISLATIVE.**

The council, on the 30th July, passed bye-laws for levying a town rate of one shilling in the pound, and for appropriating the government grant of £4000. The bye-laws were assented to by His Excellency the Governor, and gazetted on the 30th of December.

The provisions of the Health of Towns Act (except clauses VIII. and IX., omitted on the suggestion of the council) were extended to the township by a Proclamation dated the 11th of August, and gazetted on the 12th of August.

The provisions of the Dog Act, 6 William IV. No. 4 were also, at the request of the Council, extended to the township, the notice of such extension being dated the 3rd of September, and gazetted on the 5th of September.

**APPLICATIONS TO GOVERNMENT.**

The Council have made the following applications to the Government, with the results mentioned.

That the footways should be proclaimed of the width of 15 feet.—Granted.

The laying out of a street, a chain and a half wide, through the Government Reserve, section 4; the laying out of a crescent on the south side, and the grant to the council of the eastern portion of the reserve formed by the proposed street, (except the site of the New Post Office), as a site for a town hall, market and other municipal purposes.

With reference to this application, the suggestion of the council for the laying out of a street and crescent was adopted, and a tracing of the land was transmitted, showing that two roads and four perches in the eastern portion of the reserve, fronting Timor street, have been set apart for a town hall; two roads and four perches for a mechanics' institute; three

roads and thirty-six perches for a market; and ten perches for a public well; the former application of the council for a site for a town hall being considered as withdrawn.

Tracings, shewing two new streets through sections 26 and 28, laid out at the suggestion of the council, and also the land proposed to be set apart for a pound, cattle market and slaughtering yards have also been transmitted to the council.

TRAMWAY FROM THE JETTY TO THE TOWN.

It was suggested by the council that the unexpended balance of the sum voted for public works in Warrnambool in 1856 should be appropriated towards the formation of a tramway from the jetty to the town. This suggestion has been adopted by the Commissioner of Public Works, the council undertaking to furnish the difference between the amount of the lowest tender and the unexpended balance.

Roads to cemetery and punt on the River Hopkins.—Granted. Provision for conveyance of mails from the jetty to the town.—The subject will receive consideration.

FINANCE.

The second moiety of the Government grant has been received, and the greater portion of the town rate has been collected.

ATTENDANCE OF MEMBERS.

The number of ordinary meetings, from the 9th of July, 1856, to the 3rd of January, 1857, has been twenty-four.
