DANDENONG ROAD DISTRICT.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Str Henry Barket, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

W HEREAS by an Act of the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of the colony of Victoria, passed in the sixteenth year of Her present Majesty's Reign, intituled, "An Act" for making and improving Houds in the colony of Victoria," it was amongst other things enacted that it should be lawful for the Lieutenant Governor, from time to time, by notice in the Government Gazette, to proclaim and declare any such portion of the said colony as to him should seem meet, as and to be a road district for the purposes in the said Act contained, and also to define the boundaries of every road district thereby proclaimed and declared, and to give a specific name or designation to every such road district: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, in pursuance of the power so vested in me by the said Act, and of every other power and authority enabling me in this behalf, do hereby proclaim and adclare that the district hereinafter defined shall be a road district for the purposes in the said Act contained, that is to say:—Commencing at a point on the Dandenong Creek, at the north-east corner of portion 101, parish of Mulgrave; thence by the Dandenong Creek southerly to the south-east corner of portion VIII., parish of Mulgrave; thence by that line cust to a distance of twenty-one miles beyond the township of Dandenong; thence due west to the north-west corner of portion VIII., parish of Mordiallor; thence south to the sea-coast; thence by the sea-coast to a line produced from the north boundary of the parish of Berwick; thence by that line west to a distance of twenty-one miles beyond the township of Dandenong; thence by a line due west to the commencing point.

And I do hereby further proclaim and declare that the specific name or designation of such road district shall be "The Dandenong

LOCAL COURT REGULATIONS.

YACKANDANDAH.

EGULATIONS made by the Local Court of the district of Yackandandah :--

IV Yackandandah:—

Ivi. Hill or surface claims.—The extent of hill or surface claims shall be five yards frontage to the creek by one hundred and sixty yards back. No claim to be granted exceeding forty yards frontage to the creek by one hundred and sixty yards back. No tailings shall be allowed to flow into the bed of the creek. Parties working hill or bank claims shall creet dams or embankments sufficiently high and strong to hold their tailings, and place a sluice gate or hox in said dam or embankment in such a manner that there shall be nine inches of dead water behind it at all times.

IVII. Petertiam for shallings daring daying failure of nature.

water behind it at all times.

XVII. Protection for sluicing claims during failure of water.—
Claim holders who may be unable to work hill sluicing claims from failure of the usual supply of water may obtain protection for their rights for any period not exceeding one month on making written application to the warden. And it shall be competent for the warden to extend such protection from time to time at his discretion, or to withdraw it on giving forty-eight hours written notice to the responsible party; provided that one man having a miner's right is daily in attendance on any claim so held in reserve.

XVIII. Permission to hold in reserve. Rooded claims—When at

any claim so held in reserve.

XVIII. Permission to hold in reserve flooded claims.—When at any time claims which are being worked shall become unworkable in consequence of floods or from excess of drainage water, it shall be competent for the warden upon written application from any claimholders affected by such flood or excess of drainage water to suspend, by written sanction, the working of such claim for a period not exceeding one month, and to extend such sanction from time to time at his discretion; provided that no injury be done to adjoining claimholders, and that one man having a miner's right is daily in attendance upon such claim. A registration of all such sanctions to be kept by the warden.

The foregoing Regulations, Nos. xvii. to xviii., have been assented to by His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Counci'.

MUNICIPALITY OF CASTLEMAINE.

BYELLAW No. 12.—For further regulating certain Proceedings of the Council, being an Amendment to Bue-

LAW No. 1.

WHEREAS by the Act of Council 48 Victoria No. 15, intituled, "In Act for the Establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria," the Council of any municipal district in are authorised to frame laws for the regulation of their own proceedings: And whereas it has been found expedient and propor at different times to alter, amend and add to Bye-law No 1 for this purpose made and provided: Be it therefore ordered and enacted by the municipal council of Castlemaine that from and after the passing of this present, the same shall have full force and effect as such, that is to say as follows:—

shall have full force and effect as such, that is to say as follows:

To form clause 4 of chap. 2.—"Every application for appointment or tender for work shall be delivered, scaled and endorsed outside 'application' or 'tender,' stating also the nature of the office applied or work tendered for, and no application nor tender shall be received after the hour specified in the advertisement, and the number received shall be declared before opening any one of them by the chairman."

To form clause 5 of chap. 3.—"All contracts, specifications, bonds, or other documents relative to works to be done by or for the municipal council shall be brought up and approved by the council before they be signed and executed."

To form clause 6 of chap. 2.—"Notices of motion to come on after the orders of the day when the member giving notice may speak only, and in explanation only of the motion."

That clause 3 chap 3 in Bye-law No. 1 be hereby repealed, and held to be of none effect, and that in the place thereof the words following be inserted, to take effect accordingly, that is to say:—"At all such elections and on all occasions of taking tenders or contracts, the voting shall be on cards or papers to be provided for the purpose, on which each councillor shall write the name of the party or candidate he supports, and the chairman shall then declare the result of such voting."

To form clause 10 of chap. 1.—"That there be regular meetings of the Finance, Public Works and Legislative Committees on Thursdays at the same hour as the general meetings take place, at all of which the chairman be ex officio a member, and may act in such capacity."

The foregoing Bye-law, made by the municipal council of Castlemaine. has been assented to by His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council.

SECOND HALL-YEARLY REPORT OF THE MUNICIPAL COUNCIL OF WARRAMBOOL, MADE PURBUANT TO THE PROVISIONS OF THIMMONITAL INSTITUTIONS ACT, 18 VICTORIA NO. 13, ADOPTED BY COUNCIL, 28TH JANUARY, 1857.

PUBLIC WORKS.

DURING the half-year now terminated, the council, on the recommendation of the town surveyor, have undertaken two very important works—one, the driving of a tunnel from the north-eastern portion of the town to the level of high water mark, near the beach; and the other, the formation of Timor and Banyan streets.

water mark, near the beach; and the other, the formation of Timor and Banyan streets.

The north-eastern portion of the town being a natural basin depressed to within a few feet of high water mark, and posessing no outlet whatever, the only means by which it could be drained was by driving a tunnel through the ridge of land on the south side in the direction of the coast. The length of the tunnel now in progress will be 27 chains, 14 chains of which have already been excavated. It is hoped that when this work is completed this part will be as healthy as the rest of the town. Had the district in question been left in its present state, from the total absence of drainage, and the lowness of the level above high water mark, senious evils would ness of the level above high water mark, serious evils would doubtless have resulted when the town came to be more thickly inhabited.

inhabited.

The second work alluded to, and which is now nearly completed, the formation of two of the principal streets, has also been undertaken partly with a view to drainage, since by levelling Timor street the storm water of nearly one quarter of the town will be carried along it. The work, from the inequalities of the land on which the town is built, is somewhat costly, the amount of cutting and embanking required being considerable. The same circumstance has also operated against private individuals, as several valuable properties have been seriously injured by the improvements, and great expense entailed upon the owners. It was deemed advisable, however, to reduce the streets at once to their permanent level before any further building should have been proceeded with.

A portion of Merri street, where it was most required, has also been partially levelled, the solid rock having been cut down and a good roadway made for vehicles.

LEGISLATIVE.

The council, on the 30th July, passed bye-laws for levying a town rate of one shilling in the pound, and for appropriating the government grant of \$4000. The bye-laws were assented to by His Excellency the Governor, and gazetted on the 30th of December.

The provisions of the Health of Towns Act (except clauses VIII. and IX., omitted on the suggestion of the council) were extended to the township by a Proclamation dated the 11th of August, and gazetted on the 12th of August.
The provisions of the Dog Act, 5 William IV. No. 4 were also, at the request of the Council, extended to the township, the notice of such extension being dated the 3rd of September, and gazetted on the 5th of September.

APPLICATIONS TO GOVERNMENT.

The Council have made the following applications to the Government, with the results mentioned.

That the footways should be proclaimed of the width of 15 feet. Granted

The laying out of a street, a chain and a half wide, through the Government Reserve, section 4; the laying out of a crescent on the south side, and the grant to the council of the castern portion of the reserve formed by the proposed street, (except the site of the New Post Office), as a site for a town hall, market and other municipal purposes.

With reference to this application, the suggestion of the council for the laying out of a street and crescent was adopted, and a tracing of the land was transmitted, showing that two roods and four perches in the eastern portion of the reserve, fronting Timor street, have been set apart for a town hall; two roods and four perches for a mechanics' institute; three

roods and thirty-six perches for a market; and ten perches for a public well; the former application of the council for a site for a town hall being considered as withdrawn.

Tracings, shewing two new streets through sections 26 and 28, laid out at the suggestion of the council, and also the laud proposed to be set apart for a pound, cattle market and slaughtering yards have also been transmitted to the council.

TRAMWAY PROM THE JETTY TO THE TOWN.

It was suggested by the council that the unexpended balance of the sum voted for public works in Warrnambool in 1856 should be appropriated towards the formation of a tramway from the jetty to the town. This suggestion has been adopted by the Commissioner of Public Works, the council undertaking to furnish the difference between the amount of the lowest tender and the unexpended balance. Roads to cemetery and punt on the River Hopkins — Granted. Provision for conveyance of mails from the jetty to the

town.—The subject will receive consideration.
