WOODSTOCK ROAD DISTRICT.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of the colony of Victoria, passed in the sixteenth year of Her present Majesty's Reign, intitled, "An Act for making and improving Roads in the colony of Victoria," it was amongst other things enacted, that it should be lawful for the Lieutenant Governor, from time to time, by notice in the Government Gazette, to proclaim and declare any such portion of the said colony as to him should seem meet, as and to be a road district for the purposes in the said Act contained, and also to define the boundaries of every road district thereby proclaimed and declared, and to give a specific name or designation to every such road district: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim and declare that the district hereinafter defined shall be a road district for the purposes in the said Act contained, that is to say:—

Commencing at the south-eastern angle of section 1, parish of Yan Yean, thence north by the western boundaries of sections 2, 7, 10, 15 and 18, in the said parish of Yan Yean, and the western boundaries of sections 2, 7 and 10, in the parish of Toorourrong to the north-eastern angle of section 9 in the said parish of Toorourrong; thence by the northern boundary of the said section 9 to the parish of Merriang; thence by part of the eastern and northern boundaries of the said parish of Merriang to the north-western angle of section 28; thence by the eastern boundaries of sections 27, 22, 15 and 10, to the south-western angle of section 9, all in the parish of Merriang aforesaid; thence by the southern boundary of the said section 9 to the Merri Creek; thence south-westerly by the Merri Creek and a line west to a point on the northern boundary of the parish of Kalkallo, one mile west of the north-eastern angle of section 27 in the said parish of Kalkallo; thence by a line bearing south and by the western boundary of section 15, in the parish of Kalkallo aforesaid, to the northern boundary of section 10; thence by part of the northern boundary of section 10 and the western boundaries of sections 9 and 4 to the southern boundary of the parish of Kalkallo; and thence by the southern boundary of the parish of Kalkallo to section 1, parish of Yan Yean; and thence by the southern boundary of the said section 1 to the commencing point.

And I do hereby further proclaim and declare that the specific name or designation of such road district shall be, "The Woodstock Road District."

PRISON BOUNDARIES OF THE HULKS "PRESIDENT" AND "SUCCESS."

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by a Proclamation under the hand of the then Governor and the seal of the colony, bearing date the twenty-third day of July, in the year One thousand eight hundred and fifty-six, the positions of the several hulks or floating prisons called respectively the *President*, *Deborah*, *Success*, *Sacramento*, and *Lysander*, were specified and proclaimed: And whereas it has been deemed expedient to remove the *President* and *Success* before mentioned to new positions: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this my Proclamation proclaim and direct that the said hulks or floating prisons called the *President* and *Success* are and shall be moored one hundred yards apart in the north-west angle of Hobson's Bay, (the said hulk *Success* being distant from high-water mark at the old Jetty of Williamstown two thousand three hundred yards) with the magnetic bearings specified in the schedule hereunto annexed, and that the limits and boundaries around the said hulks or floating prisons are marked by six yellow painted buoys placed about one hundred yards apart, and moored within one hundred yards of the said hulks, between which buoys and the said hulks no person shall come.

LIGHTNING was seen on the night of the 4th, in the E.N.E., at intervals of 8' and 10', and on the night of the 31st.

SOLAR HALOS were visible on the 3rd, apparent diameter 30°, and on the 11th, apparent diameter 35°.

LUNAR HALOS were seen on the night of the 27th, about 25° in diameter—very pale; and on the night of the 28th, when the inner circle was prismatic, about 7° in diameter, and the outer a pale whitish color about 35° in diameter.

SHOOTING STARS.—On the 17th, at 9.50 p.m., a faint meteor in the E. On the 27th, at 8.15 p.m., meteor from the constellation ARA moving slowly towards the N.W.—at 8.22 p.m., meteor moving slowly from W. to E. about 35°, about the N.E. horizon. At 9.10 p.m., meteor from N.E. to S.W., about 20° above S.E. horizon—motion rapid. At 9.15 p.m., very faint meteor about 10° above E. horizon from N. to S. And at 9.52 p.m., a small bright meteor, path curved from S. to N., about 35° above E. horizon.

FOG was present at 8 a.m. on the 6th.
On the 16th when the wind was from the N.W. it was slightly warm, but it was not a "hot wind."

The observations at 9.30 p.m. are recorded by SERGEANT FORBES and CORPORAL HEADY, Royal Engineers.

MUNICIPALITY OF BELFAST.

BYE-LAW No. 9.—FOR CONDUCTING PUBLIC MEETINGS OF THE RATEPAYERS, ELECTION OF COUNCILLORS, DETERMINING THE VALIDITY OF DISPUTED ELECTIONS, AND REGULATING THE PROCEEDINGS AT ELECTION OF CHAIRMAN.

AT all public meetings of the ratepayers of the municipality convened by the council or chairman thereof, in the absence (from any cause) of the chairman of the council, then the senior councillor present shall take the chair.

2. At all such meetings, in case of equality of votes, the chairman shall have a casting vote, and his decision on all points of form and order shall be final. Any person refusing to comply with the same or creating any disturbance so as to interrupt the proceedings, shall forthwith be expelled from the meeting.

3. At all municipal elections, on a poll being taken, no person shall be allowed to remain within the polling room in addition to the chairman or deputy, the poll clerk, the town clerk, and the police under the chairman's control, except by the chairman's written authority, which shall only be given to members of council, candidates for election, and one scrutineer for each candidate duly authorised in writing by such candidate, or if absent by his agent.

4. Each ratepayer shall vote by delivering to the chairman or his deputy, in writing, the names of the candidate or candidates in full, together with his own and his place of residence.

5. No intelligible voting card shall be rejected or disallowed for mere want of form.

6. Any candidate or scrutineer may object to any vote on its being tendered, and request the presiding officer to put the following questions to the person tendering such vote:—

1st, Is this your name and residence described on this voting card?

2nd, Have you voted before at this election?

7. If a voting card be tendered bearing the name and address of a ratepayer who has already voted, or of a deceased or absent or other disqualified person, it shall be received, but the vote shall not be allowed, and a mark shall be put thereon by which to distinguish it.

8. Persons delivering voting cards in the names of deceased, absent, or other ratepayers, or guilty of voting twice at the same election, shall forfeit and pay a sum not exceeding Ten pounds on conviction before any two or more justices of the peace.

9. At all elections, in case of an equality of votes being recorded for two or more candidates, the chairman shall give the casting vote or votes.

10. For determining the validity of disputed elections, the whole council, the member or members whose election is disputed excepted, shall be a committee of elections and qualifications, four to form a quorum, at which the chairman of council, or if absent at the commencement of proceedings, the senior councillor present, shall preside, and in all cases if equality of votes, shall have a casting vote.

11. The committee shall meet in the council chamber on days not appointed for the holding of council meetings, and be attended by the town clerk, who shall record the minutes of every such meeting.

12. The chairman of his own authority may, or on the written request of three members to him to that effect shall, convene meetings of committee of elections, &c.

13. The committee shall have power to regulate their proceedings and to adjourn their meetings, which shall be held with open doors, unless during special deliberations.

14. Each member of committee shall be required to vote.

15. The ratepayers' roll shall be assumed to be correct, and the committee shall enquire into the identity of the electors, their retention of qualification, and whether the votes were *bona fide*. If it be proved to the satisfaction of the committee that persons by fraud, force, menace, or any undue influence by or on the part of any candidate or his agent, committee-men or partisan, or any of them, gave, or were prevented from giving their votes, such vote shall be struck off, or recorded, as the case may be established.

16. The acts of authorised agents shall be regarded as those of the principal, if it be proved to the satisfaction of the committee that they were performed with his knowledge, power or consent.

17. The person determined by the committee to be duly elected shall be declared so to be by the chairman.

18. All petitions complaining of an undue election must be signed by a candidate or by not less than six ratepayers, and be presented within thirty days after the election complained of.

19. Ratepayers may be admitted to defend the election or support the petition if it be abandoned by the person or persons originally presenting it.

20. Written declarations of vacancies in the council resulting from disqualification by absence or otherwise may be made by the chairman and one or more councillors, and countersigned by the town clerk.

21. Resignation of membership of council shall be made in writing, addressed to the chairman of the council, and be presented by him to the council at the next meeting thereafter for their ordering on the same.

22. The chairman of council shall be annually elected in the following manner:—Each councillor being supplied by the town clerk with a voting paper containing the names of the

whole of the members of council, shall mark that of the councillor for whom he votes, and deposit the paper in the urn or voting box. On the delivery of the whole papers (it being obligatory upon every member of council to vote), if the whole council be present, otherwise after one hour the chairman shall announce the name of each councillor voted for, the number of such votes, and declare the name of the one who has a majority of votes to be duly elected the chairman of the council for the ensuing municipal year, who shall take the chair accordingly.

23. If the result of voting for chairman should be that the highest number of votes is held equally by two or more councillors, then another voting shall take place for those councillors only holding such equality of votes until a majority is recorded.

24. Upon the resignation or disqualification of the chairman of the council, at the next meeting of council thereafter the senior councillor then present shall take the chair *pro tem.*, and immediately after the confirmation of the minutes of the preceding meeting shall proceed to the election of a chairman of council for the residue of the municipal year, in manner prescribed by this bye-law, and in the event of an equality of votes being recorded, shall have a casting vote in addition to his own.

25. In determining the seniority of councillors for the purposes of this bye-law, it shall be understood to mean those councillors holding their office for the longest period and having the greatest number of votes when elected.

26. Service of all legal notices, processes, &c., on behalf of or upon the municipal council of Belfast, shall be considered in due form where applicable, if issued in the names of or delivered to the worshipful the chairman of the council or the town clerk.

The foregoing Bye-law, No. 9, made by the municipal council of Belfast, has been approved by His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council.


