MUNICIPALITY OF CARISBROOK.

Bye-law No. 1. — A Bye-law to regulate by means of Standing Orders the Proceedings of the Council for the Municipal District of Carisbrook.

ORDER OF PROCEEDINGS

THAT the business of the council on all ordinary proceedings be conducted with open doors, but any one member of the council present may require the exclusion of strangers until it shall have been decided by the council whether the question proposed to be introduced shall be discussed with open doors.

2. The council shall meet every Thursday, at Four o'clock in the effective and shall enterpresent business at sealers the council shall meet overy thursday.

2. The council shall need overy liturally, at root o clock in the afternoon, and shall commence business at each meeting so soon as the legal quorum is present, but if at the expiration if thirty minutes after the appointed hour of meeting there is not a quorum present, the business of such meeting shall

3. The first business at each meeting of the council shall be to confirm the minutes of the preceding meeting, and no discussion shall take place thereon except as to the accuracy thereof.

4. At all meetings, the reading of correspondence unconnected with the orders of the day, the presentation of petitions, and the bringing up of reports of committees, shall have precedence of the regular business.

5. On the presentation of a petition no debate shall take place thereon until notice has been given in the usual manner, and the only questions that shall be entertained on the occasion

place thereon until notice has been given in the usual manner, and the only questions that shall be entertained on the occasion of its presentation shall be, that the petition be received, and if necessary that it be referred to a committee.

6. No motion shall be discussed or decided on at any meeting unless notice in writing, signed by the councillor proposing, shall have been given three clear days previous, nor shall any report of committee be decided on unless similar notice be given, and the town clerk shall furnish each councillor with a list of notices of motion received two days before the meeting for which the same are given, and no motion so made shall be withdrawn without the leave of the council.

7. No motion shall be proceeded with unless the councillor giving notice, or one of the council authorised by him in writing, be present to proceed with same when called upon.

8. No bye-law shall be finally passed or adopted at the meeting at which it shall have been first proposed, nor until the next meeting of the council, and every such bye-law shall in the interim remain open for the inspection of any of the rate payors in the town clerk's office at all reasonable hours, free of charge.

9. The mover of any motion which may be referred to any committee shall be a member of such committee.

ORDER OF DEBATE.

10. Any member desirous of proposing a motion or an amendment, or of discussing any matter, must rise and address the chairman, and no member shall be interrupted unless called to order, when he shall sit down; the member calling to order shall then be heard thereon, and the question of order decided before the subject is resumed or any other business entered upon.

11. Any member shall be at liberty to move an amendment to any motion, and shall put the same in form, sign and deliver the same to the town clerk, who shall add thereto the name of the seconder, and no amendment so made shall be with-drawn without the leave of the council.

12. No motion or amendment shall be entertained or discussed unless it be seconded; any member may, however, require the enforcement of any standing order of the council by simply noticing that such order is disobeyed.

13. The members in speaking shall designate each other by their respective titles of chairman or councillor, as the case

may be.

14. If two or more members rise to speak at the same time,

the chairman shall decide which is entitled to pre-audience.

15. No councillor shall speak twice on the same question onlies by way of explanation merely, or in reply, as the mover of an original motion or upon any amendment, and after such explanation or reply the question shall be forthwith put to the vote, but members merely seconding any motion shall not be held to have spoken upon it.

16. Any members who shall use any expression capable of being applied offensively to any other member shall (if required by the chairman), withdraw such expression and make satisfactory apology to the council under a penalty, in case he refuse or neglect to do so before the rising of the council, to be decided by a majority of the council, of not more than Ten pounds.

17. The chairman shall, in taking the votes on any motion or amendment, put the question first in the affirmative and then in the negative, and the votes of the members shall be entered on the minutes

The council shall vote on all motions either by show of hands or voting paper, as the chairman may direct, except in cases of elections.

19. No motion, the effect of which, if carried, would be to

19. No motion, the effect of which, if carried, would be to rescind any motion which has already passed the council, shall be entertained during the same municipal Year, unless a call of the whole council has been duly made for that purpose, and no such motion for rescinding any resolution of the council which shall have been negatived by the council shall be again entertained during the same municipal year.
20. That any committee being appointed, the town clerk shall give such notices calling the committee together as may be requisite.

21. The clerk shall not affix the common seal to any corpo-21. The clerk shall not affix the common seal to any corporate document without the express order of the council, nor unless such document bears the signature of the chairman (except in the case of powers of attorney and other legal documents not relating to the corporation, the signatures to which require to be verified by declaration before the chairman, and in any such case the said seal shall and may be affixed by the clerk to the chairman's certificate accompanying the same on receipt of a fee of Ten shillings and sixpence for each attestation?

22. No election to any office at the disposal of the council shall take place until seven clear days' notice shall have been given in one or most local newspapers, inviting applications for the same, and the salary of such office shall in all cases be fixed for the municipal year before proceeding to the election.

23. No councillor or officer belonging to the council shall be received as surety for any officer appointed by the council, or for any work to be done for the council, and in all cases in which security for the due and faithful performance of any duty or contract is required, the expense of preparing such surety shall be borne by the person or persons giving the

same.

24. At all such elections, the voting shall be, except at that of chairman of the council, on cards or paper to be provided for the purpose, on which the voter shall write the name of the candidate he supports, and sign his own: no others will be rectived, and the town clerk shall preserve the same as a record.

25. Any one or more of the standing orders of the council may be suspended pro tem in case of emergency, provided that a majority of the council shall deem such suspension necessary, always excepting No. 19 and No. 23.

The foregoing Bye-law, No. 1, made by the municipal council of Carisbrook, has been assented to by His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council.
