Without first obtaining a license, in form set forth in schedule A hereunto annexed, from the said council, to authorise him to deposit such building materials. Before any such deposit shall be made, a good and sufficient boarding shall be erected to be placed round such materials, to the satisfaction of the council, their surveyor, or other officer, and a light shall be kept in a conspicuous place thereon burning from sunset to sunrise, and no such material shall encroach more than one-third on the width of any roadway, or so as to render any road impassable to vehicles, and the footpaths and gutters or drains shall in all cases be kept free.

The license shall be charged for at five shillings (5s.), and shall remain in force 21 days from the date thereof and no longer, but may be renewed on application to the council, shall be deemed and dealt with as an unlicensed person.

Any person depositing building materials without being licensed so to do, or exceeding the powers granted by such license shall be deemed and unlicensed person.

Any person depositing building materials without being licensed so to do, or exceeding the powers granted by such license shall forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding twenty pounds (£20), and any person failing to remove any senfolding or boarding, &c., as aforesaid, on being called on to d

CINCE the last half-yearly report was presented the council have proceeded with the formation and metalling of such portions of the principal streets as were most needed, and portions of Julia street, Gawler street and Percy street have been formed and metalled in the centre so as to ensure a good carriage-way for the future at all seasons of the year; the northern end of Hurd street is also in the course of formation, being the principal entrance to that side of the town. The timber in portions of Olway street and Percy street has been cleared away. The public wells having been placed under the control of the council, have been put in thorough repair, and a contract has been entered into for repairing the bridge over the Saltwater Creek. The council have been in constant communication with the Government as to the expenditure of the sum of £12,000 voted last year for public works in Portland. The proposed addition to the lock-up has been made, the new jetty and post office are in course of erection, and tenders for the enlargement of the gool have been called for. It is contemplated to appropriate any balance that may remain in extending the project of the such as the addition to the real project and project a the enlargement of the gaol have been called for. It is contemplated to appropriate any balance that may remain in extending the new jetty and putting the old jetty in thorough repair. The vacancy in the office of surveyor, caused by the resignation of Mr. Ross, late of the Survey department. The attention of the council having been directed by the Central Board of Health to the propriety of extending the Public Health Act to 'vortland, they, after consideration, recommended that this should be done, and the Act was consequently extended to Portland by procla-mation. A proclamation has also been issued at the instance of the council extending to Portland the clause in the Polica Act against the use of chimneys built of wood or other inflammable material. A bye-law has also been passed prohibiting the driving of cattle through the town during the day, but it has not yet received the sanction of the Governor. An application to the Government to have the labor of prisoners confined in the gaol rendered available for the public works in the district, on the council defraying any extra expenses thereby incurred, has, after considerable delay, been complied with. The Government has also, on the recommendation of the council, exempted the several buildings used for public worship and other public institutions from the payment of municipal rates. The council have supported the road board in their application for a grant for the formation of a trammad, although not within the limits of the municipal district; they have also, through Mr. Hughes, one of the members for the town, forwarded a memorial to the Governor, praying for the restoration of the efficiency of the harbor master's crew, but the result is not yet known. The proposed bill for the amendment of the Municipal Act has been under the consideration of the council, and they have forwarded some suggestions to the Surveyor General for his consideration in forming the proposed measure.

As the end of the year approached it became necessary to decide which three of the seven members of council should retire at the expiration of the year, which was decided by ballot, and Messrs. Browning. Finn and Smith were the three members on whom the lot fell for retiring at the end of the first year; Messrs. Crouch, Learmonth and Fitzgerald at the end of the second year, and Mr. Must at the end of the third year; but some of the members of the council doubting the legality of this arrangement, the opinion of the Attorney General was taken, who advised that the course taken by the council was correct; Messrs. Browning, Finn and Smith accordingly retired, and Mes-rs. Richardson Bell, Francis Henty and James Smith, one of the retiring members, were duly elected to fill the yearnedies in the council. vacancies in the council.

During this, the first year of the existence of the council, they have been careful not to advance too fast in introducing new regulations for the government of the municipality, rather wishing to lead public opinion to a conviction of the advantages of local government, but the council now feel that the time has arrived for enforcing more strict discipline by carrying out the provisions of the Town and Country Police Act and Public Health Act, and by the enactment of bye-laws where the beforenamed Acts prove deficient, and thereby promoting the health, cleanliness and good order of the municipality.

The meeting elected Messrs. William Spurling and Thomas John Hyan to act as assessors. It was decided that the council should consist of seven members, who should not receive any pecuniary remuneration. The nomination of candidates was then proceeded with, and twenty-five having been duly proposed and seconded, it was decided that it was fit and proper that a poll should be taken, the election to be by voting page 18.

The ratepayers' roll was prepared as soon as circumstances would permit; and notice having been previously given, a special general meeting of the council was held on the 22nd October, for the purpose of hearing any objections that might be made to it. Persons whose names do not appear on the ratepayers' roll, and who lave since its compilation become ratepayers of the district, may have their cames placed thereon on their qualifications being made to appear to the satisfaction of the council. of the council.

FIXANCE.

The council caused an estimate to be made of the probable The council caused an estimate to be made of the probable amount of money which would be required to carry cut the necessary public works for the year; and on the 5th of November struck a rate of one shilling in the pound on all property assessed, one moiety thereof to become due and payable on and after twenty days from the issue of the notices, and the other moiety thereof to become due and payable on and after 5th March, 1857. Assented to by His Excellency the Officer administering the Government on the 5th December, 1856.

Two courts of appeal against the valuation assessments were held by the magistrates in petty sessions, on the 20th and 27th January respectively; the appeals were few, and the reductions made inconsiderable.
