EXEMPTED BUILDINGS, ETC., AT BEECHWORTH.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of the Colony of Victoria, passed in the eighteenth year of the Reign of Her present Majesty, intituled, "An Act for the Establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria," it was amongst other things enacted that nothing in the said Act contained should authorize the interference, by any municipal council constituted under the said Act, with any public place or building, of what description soever, not erected or constructed by such municipal council, that might be excepted from the jurisdiction of such municipal council by any Proclamation made or to be made by the Lieutenant Governor: And whereas it is deemed expedient to exempt certain places and buildings from the jurisdiction of the council of the municipal district of Beechworth: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, do, with the advice of the Executive Council, by this my Proclamation, except from the jurisdiction of the municipal council of Beechworth the following public places and buildings, situate and being within the said municipal district, that is to say:—

The land reserved for the use of the Wesleyan Church, and all erections and buildings thereon.

The land reserved for the use of the Roman Catholic Church, and all erections and buildings thereon.

The land reserved for the use of the Hospital, and all erections and buildings thereon.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this twenty-third day of March, in the year of Our Lord One thousand eight hundred and fifty-seven, and in the twentieth year of Her Majesty's Reign.

LOCAL COURT REGULATIONS.
MALDON.

REGULATIONS made by the Local Court of the District of Maldon:—

xviii. Water privileges.—Water privileges will only be granted under a written sanction of the chairman of the local court, in order to guard against conferring such privileges in places where the permanent supply of water may be injured or the natural water-courses be obstructed.

xix. Water-holes for domestic purposes.—Any party wishing to set apart a water-hole for domestic purposes, must make application to the warden, and, if deemed by him expedient, an authority in writing will be given to set apart the same.

On obtaining such authority, the applicant must erect an upright post over the hole, crossed by a bar of wood, thus: †.

xx. Water-hole, race, or dam.—Any person or persons desirous of making or holding any water-hole, race, or dam to contain water, shall make application to the chairman of the local court, and post a notice of such application on the site applied for for one week, when, if it come to be satisfactorily proved that no injury will result to the public by conferring such privilege, a written authority may be given to such applicant by the chairman of the local court.

xxi. Water from dams.—No person or persons shall, without the consent of the owner or owners thereof (except it be for domestic purposes), take away from, make use of, or defile any water which may be in private well, water-hole, or dam, held by him or them by authority; nor shall any person or persons damage or take away any covering, or portion of any covering, which may have been placed over any well, nor dig into, cut through, or undermine the bank or side, in such a manner as might cause any well, water-hole, or dam to lose water.

xxii. Dams to be commenced within a given time.—If any person or persons who have received authority from the chairman of the local court to make a water-hole or dam in any place, shall not within eight days from the day on which such authority was granted, have commenced in a *bona fide* manner to make such water-hole or dam, it shall be competent to the chairman of the local court, unless good cause for such neglect be shewn, to assign such site to any other person or persons who may have applied for it.

xxiii. Puddling and other machines.—No party in possession of a machine shall allow their sludge, tailings, or refuse water to run into the drains, dams, or premises belonging to any other party, but shall provide sufficient drainage to carry the same into the main drain of the locality, or construct sufficient ditches to receive and hold all such sludge, tailings, or refuse water.

When no main drain exists in a locality occupied by machines, it shall be competent to the chairman of the local court, with (when practicable) the assistance of the surveyor, to examine the ground and form plans for the construction of a main drain; and it shall be lawful for the chairman of the local court to order all parties having machines in that locality to assist in making such main drain, by furnishing labor or money, in proportion to the use that may be made of such drain by each party.

xxiv. No sludge or tailings to run on roads.—No person or persons shall, on any pretence whatever, allow any sludge, tailings, or refuse water to run upon or across any public road or footpath in common use, and any person or persons who may be in possession of any drain crossing any public road or footpath or who shall in future, for his or their own convenience or advantage, make any drain of any kind across any public road or footpath, shall immediately bridge such drain in a solid and substantial manner, and in no case shall the slope of the roadway over any such drain bridge exceed an inclination of 12 measured horizontally to 1 perpendicularity.

ALLUVIAL MINING.

xxv. Extent of claim on new ground.—The extent of ground or claim shall be for one miner 20 x 20 feet, for two miners 30 x 30 feet, beyond which no greater area shall be granted in one claim.

xxvi. Extent of claim in old ground.—On ground previously worked and abandoned the extent of claim shall be for one miner 36 x 36 feet, for two miners 50 x 50 feet, beyond which no greater area shall be granted in one claim, except in cases of leases and prospectors' claims.

xxvii. Marking claims.—Persons marking out claims shall do so by firmly fixing in the ground four stakes at least 2 feet 6 inches high, one at each corner of the claim, and which must be kept visible during the working of the same.

xxviii. Wall between claims.—In marking out claims a wall of 2 feet in thickness shall be left between adjoining claims, and if the owners of said claims think proper they may divide this wall equally between them.

xxix. Leases on old ground, prospectors' claims, &c.—1. Ground previously worked or abandoned may be leased in square or rectangular blocks, not exceeding in length twice their breadth; the areas of which shall in all cases be in proportion to the number of licensed miners, and the description of machinery to be employed in working the ground, but in no case to exceed 5 acres. Applications for such leases to be made to the clerk of the local court, and a notice of such application to be posted on some conspicuous portion of the ground applied for, and also on the Court House, at least fourteen days previous to the hearing of the case by the court.

2. Any party discovering a lead or deposit of gold shall have allotted to him or them, by the chairman of the local court, an area of ground 50 feet square, provided that such lead or deposit be not within one-fourth of a mile of any established alluvial workings: 100 feet square shall be allowed to any party making a like discovery, provided it be beyond one mile of any alluvial workings: 50 feet square shall be allowed to any party discovering a lost lead or working, provided the same had been abandoned: and also provided these several discoveries have been without delay made public through the chairman of the local court.

3. When any miner or miners shall, in alluvial ground, sink and then drive in search of gold, and discover any deposit or lead, he or they shall, if the ground be unoccupied immediately over the place where such deposit or lead is situated, be entitled to mark off and hold his or their claim over, or in advance of the termination of the drive; and should such discovery of gold be a discovery within the meaning of section 2 of this rule, he or they may also occupy and shall have allotted to him or them the area for a prospecting claim mentioned in said section, and in all cases the miner or miners exploring in such manner shall enjoy the use of the drive and shaft from which such exploration shall have been made, and such a thickness of wall around both shaft and drive as shall be necessary for their preservation.

xxx. Alluvial land leased not to be mined for quartz.—When any portion of alluvial land is leased to any person or persons for the purpose of mining in, or extracting gold from, any earth or soil lying over the bed-rock or alluvial bottom, or for the erection of machinery upon such land, or for other purposes, such lease shall not be understood to convey to the lessee or lessees any right to, nor shall he or they mine into, any quartz-reef which may run through or under any part of such leased land: Provided that if any excavation shall be necessary for some purpose in connexion with the legitimate occupation of the land, such excavation may be authorized by the warden.

The foregoing Regulations, Nos. xviii. to xxx., have been assented to by His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council.

BYE-LAWS OF THE COMMISSIONERS OF SEWERS AND WATER SUPPLY.

WHEREAS by an Act of Council passed in the sixteenth year of the reign of Her Majesty Queen Victoria, No. 39, intituled, "An Act to establish a Board of Commissioners for the better sewerage and drainage of the City of Melbourne and for supplying water thereto and to the suburbs thereof," the said commissioners are authorized (section 13) from time to time to make, alter and repeal bye-laws, for the following amongst other purposes, viz, for regulating the amount of assessment, and collection of rates, charges and contributions, the forms of rates, and the mode and period of and for appeals from rates and charges for default, and to impose such penalties as they may think fit, not exceeding twenty pounds for each breach thereof: Provided that no bye-law shall be of any force or effect until the same be submitted to and approved of by His Excellency the Lieutenant Governor, and published in three consecutive numbers of the *Government Gazette*:

Now, in execution of the said powers, the said commissioners do make the bye-laws following:—

1. A valuation shall be made from time to time, if the commissioners think fit, of the annual value of all houses and tenements opposite or convenient to which pipes for the conveyance of water shall have been laid by the said commissioners.

2. Notice of the amount of such valuation shall be given to the person liable to pay water rate for the same.

3. Such persons may appeal to the commissioners against such valuation on giving notice in writing of such appeal to the secretary of the commissioners within fourteen days of the service of such notice.

4. The commissioners may either confirm the valuation or make a new one, and in the event of the parties not acquiescing in the award of the commissioners, they may appeal to two justices of the peace, by whom the same shall be determined.

5. All persons applying for or receiving water from the said commissioners shall pay for the same until the 25th December, 1857, or until further notice be given by the said commissioners of any alteration in their rates, at the following rates, viz:—

1. On houses of £50 annual value and under, a rate of five pounds per centum on the valuation.
2. On houses above £50 and under £300 annual value, a rate of four pounds ten shillings per centum on the valuation.
3. On houses at £300 annual value and upwards, a rate of four pounds per centum on the valuation.
4. Houses, stores, manufactories, or premises in which the quantity of water consumed, or likely so to be, would be greater or less than the average consumption of private houses of equal value, shall be subject to such special rate on the annual value as the said commissioners may think fit to impose, and as may be agreed to by the owners, in addition to or in deduction from the abovenamed rating at their annual value.

6. All such rates shall be paid in advance, by equal quarterly payments, at Christmas day, Lady day, Midsummer day, and Michaelmas day, in every year, and the first payment shall be made at the time when the pipe by which water is supplied is made to communicate with the pipes of the commissioners, or at the time when the agreement to take water from the commissioners is made.

7. Any person receiving water from the commissioners who shall supply any other house or premises with water than that for which he is himself liable, or who shall allow any person not subject to water rate to be supplied, or who shall allow water to be taken from his premises to be consumed elsewhere, shall be liable to a rate in respect of the premises so supplied, or to a penalty of five pounds for each case in which water shall be so supplied by him, as to the said commissioners may seem most fit.

8. Any person supplied with water by the commissioners, or liable to the water rate, who shall neglect to pay such rate at any of the times of payment thereof, shall be liable to pay a charge for default not exceeding four pounds for each quarter's rate, and the commissioners may stop the water from flowing into the premises in respect of which such rate is payable, by cutting off the pipe to such premises, or by such means as the commissioners shall think fit, and shall recover such charge for default, together with the expenses of cutting off the water and the costs of recovering the rate, from every such person.

9. Any person who shall open any ground so as to uncover a pipe of the commissioners, or who shall lay any leaden or other pipe to communicate with any such pipe, without giving to the commissioners fourteen days' notice of his intention so to do, or who shall make any pipe to communicate with the pipes of the commissioners without giving to them two days' notice of the day and hour when such pipe is intended to be made to communicate with the pipes of the commissioners, or who shall make such communication without the superintendence or contrary to the directions of the officer appointed by the commissioners, unless he shall fail to attend at the time mentioned in such notice, or who shall lay any leaden or other pipe to communicate with the pipes of the commissioners of a strength and material not approved of by the commissioners, or in case of dispute settled by two justices, shall forfeit for each offence a sum not exceeding twenty pounds.

10. In all cases where a stand pipe is erected for the supply of the houses and tenements in any right-of-way, lane, or other place, any person not occupying a house in any such right-of-way, lane, or other place, who shall take water from such stand pipe, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding four pounds, unless he or she have received a written permission from the commissioners to take water from any such stand pipe.

11. Any person supplied with water who shall wilfully or negligently allow the same to run to waste, shall be liable for each offence to a penalty not exceeding five pounds.

The foregoing Bye-laws, Nos. 1 to 11, made by the Commissioners of Sewers and Water Supply, have been submitted to and approved of by His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council.

MUNICIPALITY OF CASTLEMAINE.

BYE-LAW No. 15.—FOR THE BETTER PREVENTION OF FIRES, AND THE DANGERS TO LIFE AND PROPERTY ARISING THEREFROM.

WHEREAS by the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, intitled, "An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria," the council of any municipal district is empowered to make bye-laws for the prevention and extinguishing of fires, and for the general good rule, &c., &c.: Be it therefore ordered and enacted by the municipal council of Castlemaine, That it shall not be lawful for any roof or other exterior covering of canvas, duck, drill, calico, or any such material to be placed upon, or on the outside of, any building to be erected within the boundaries as hereinafter set forth and specially declared, nor shall it be lawful for any such now in use to be repaired or renewed with like material, unless such building or erection shall stand and be twenty clear feet apart from any dwelling house, store, or other building whatsoever.

That no person shall be permitted to keep any stack or stacks of hay, corn, or straw of any description on premises within the said boundaries, unless the same be under cover of a shed or building of which no exterior part or covering shall be of canvas, calico, or any other like textile fabric whatever.

That no person shall be permitted to erect or put up any bush or brush fence, either as side or partition fence, for any purpose.

That it shall be lawful for the said council or their inspector, or any other officer, upon complaint, in writing, of any ratepayer that any chimney, flue, or vent is constructed of improper materials; or that the top of such chimney or flue is not sufficiently elevated or removed from any inflammable materials of which the roof or other portion of the building, or of any adjoining building, is constructed; or that any such chimney or flue is not so constructed as properly to carry up the smoke so that it becomes a nuisance or dangerous to the neighbours; or if it shall appear to the council or their inspector, or other duly authorised officer, necessary at any time, he shall and may, at any reasonable time, proceed to inspect any such chimney or flue, and if he shall find that there is proper ground of complaint, or reasonable cause of danger or nuisance, he or they shall forthwith serve a notice upon the owner or occupier of such premises, calling on him to alter such chimney, vent, or flue, so as to abate and remedy any such danger or nuisance; and it shall not be permitted hereafter to alter, or repair, or to erect any chimney, vent, or flue of any dangerous or inflammable material, nor of any other than brick, or stone, or earthwork of sufficient solidity and proper construction.

That it be prohibited to light or have any fire burning in any street, lane, road, or public place, nor within or upon any yard or premises, whether fenced or enclosed or not, for any purpose whatsoever, without having first obtained license or permission from the said council, or their duly authorised officer, except such fire be made in a properly constructed fire-place or chimney as above described.

And be it further enacted, That this bye-law, and all the provisions thereof as aforesaid, shall henceforth extend and take effect within the following boundaries, that is to say—from Forest street south to Parker street north, and from Fletcher street east to Kennedy street west, said streets inclusive; and that it shall be lawful for the said council, at any time hereafter, to extend the boundaries for the operation of this bye-law, in any such manner as to them may seem fit and proper so to do by a bye-law to that purpose: And upon any infringement or breach of the provisions of this bye-law, or any one of them, or upon any neglect or refusal to attend to any notice given by the said council, their inspector, or other officer, any person so infringing, neglecting, or refusing to comply with the same, shall be liable and subject to forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding twenty pounds (£20).
