A BYE-LAW TO REGULATE THE PROCEEDINGS OF THE BOARD.

ORDER OF PROCEEDING.

ORDER OF PROCEEDISO.

THAT the meetings of the board for the current year be held every Friday, at Seven p.m., at the Sir Robert Nickle Hotel, Hawthorn, during the six months from the 1st October to the 3 sts March at Seven p.m., and at Three p.m. from the 1st April to the 30th September.

1st April to the 30th September.

2. At all meetings of the board when there is not a quorum present within a quarter of an hour of the time of meeting, the board shall be counted out; such circumstance, with the names of the members then present, shall be recorded in the

minute book.

names of the members then present, shall be recorded in the minute book.

3. The minutes of every preceding meeting not previously confirmed shall be read as the first business at all meetings of the board, in order to their confirmation; and no discussion shall be permitted thereupon, except as to their accuracy as a record of the proceedings.

4. At all meetings of the board (unless otherwise provided for by law) the reading of correspondence unconnected with the orders of the day, the presentation of petitions by members of the board, and bringing up reports of committees, shall have precedence of the regular business.

5. Every communication addressed to the board shall be in proper form, and presented by one of its members, who shall be responsible for its being respectfully worded.

6. On the presentation of a petition no debate shall take place thereon, until one week's notice has been given, and the only question that shall be entertained on the occasion of its presentation shall be, that the petition be received, and (if necessary) that it be referred to a committee.

7. No report of a committee shall be considered or adopted until the meeting of the board following that upon which it is brought up, notice of which shall be given. All such reports shall be read and received pro forma, and, if ordered by the board, printed for distribution among the members.

8. If in the report of a committee there are distinct recommendations contained in such report, such report shall not be adopted until the sense of the board has been taken separately on each.

9. The orders of the day shall include all matters arising

9. The orders of the day shall include all matters arising out of the proceedings of former meetings of the board, and any business which the chairman may think fit to bring under consideration.

10. Notices of motion shall be given in writing to the secre-10. Notices of motion shall be given in writing to the secre-tary, at meetings of the board, one week previous to the dis-cussion of such motions, and all such notices of motion shall be considered in the order in which they were given. 11. No motion entered on the notice paper shall be proceeded

with, unless the member who has given such notice, or some one authorised by him, be present when the business is called in order; notices not so proceeded with shall be struck out of

the paper.

12. The mover of any motion which may be referred to a committee, shall be pro huc vice a member of such notice com-

ORDER OF DEBATE.

ORDER OF DEBATE.

13. Any member desirous of proposing a motion or amendment, or of discussing any matter under consideration, must rise, address the chairman; and no member, when speaking, shall be interrupted unless called to order, when he shall sit down; in which case the member calling to order shall be heard thereon in preference to any other speaker, and the question of order shall be disposed of before the subject is resumed

tion of order shall be disposed of before the subject is resumed or any other subject entered upon.

14. Any member making a motion or amendment shall put it in form, sign and deliver it to the secretary, who shall add thereto the name of the seconder, and no motion or amendment so made shall be withdrawn without leave of the board.

15. Any member desirous of proposing either an original motion or amendment, must state the nature of such motion or amendment before addressing the board in support thereof.

16. No motion or amendment shall be discussed unless it be

seconded.

17. Any member moving or seconding any motion or amendment shall be held to have spoken on that motion or amendment. Should two or more u-tembers rise to speak at the same time, the chairman shall decide which is entitled to preaudience.

18. No member shall speak twice on the same motion or amendment, except by way of explanation, or in reply to any original motion or amendment of which he may have been the original motion or amendment of which he may have been the mover, and the chairman shall call to order any member proceeding so to speak a second time. After the reply, the amendment or the original motion, as the case may be, shall be immediately put to the vote.

19. No member shall digress from the subject matter of the

question under discussion, or impute improper motives to others, or occupy the time of the board by speaking more than fifteen minutes.

20. The chairman, when called upon to decide a point of 20. The chairman, when called upon to decide a point of order or practice, shall state his opinion upon the subject, and, if necessary, take the sense of the meeting thereupon; the decision of a majority in such case shall be final.

21. Any member who shall use any expression capable of being applied offensively to any other member, shall, if required by the chairman, withdraw such expression, and make a satisfactory apology to the board.

22. Any member may require the secretary to take down any particular words used by a member immediately on the same being spoken.

same being spoken.

23. Any member may of right require the production of any of the documents of the board relating to the question or matter under discussion.

under discussion.

24. Upon the adoption of any amendment by the board, such amendment shall be held to have quashed the original motion, and for all purposes of subsequent discussion the amendment so carried shall be acted upon as an original motion.

25. The board shall vote by show of hands, unless a majority are in favor of the vote being taken by hallot.

26. No discussion will be allowed on any motion for adjournment of the board, but if on the question being put the motion be negatived, the subject then under consideration, or the next on the notice paper, as the case may be, shall be discussed, or any other that may be allowed precedence, before any subsequent motion for adjournment shall be entertained; but if the motion for adjournment be carried, the business then undisposed of shall have precedence at the next meeting of the posed of shall have precedence at the next meeting of the

27. Any member of the board may enter his protest against any resolution of the board, provided that such protest is not inconsistent with truth or disrespectful to the board; notice of inconsistent with truth or disrespectful to the beard; notice of intention to protest must, however, in every case be given on the adoption of the resolution protested against; and the protest, signed by the member or members protesting, and specifying the reasons for protesting, must be entered before the next regular meeting of the board by the protesting member, in a book to be kept for that purpose in the secretary's office, and duly referred to in the minutes of the board; the same to be considered also a part of such minutes.

28. No motion, the effect of which, if carried, would be to rescind any motion which has already passed the board, shall be entertained during the current year, unless a call of the whole board has been duly made for that purpose, and no such motion for rescinding any resolution of the board, which shall have been negatived by the board, shall be again entertained during the current year.

29. No elections to any office at the disposal of the board shall take place until six clear days' public notice shall have been given by advertisement in one or more of the Melbourne spapers, inviting applications from candidates properly

qualined.

30. The salary or allowance attached to all offices and places at the disposal of the board shall be fixed in all cases before proceeding to the election.

31. No member or officer of the board shall be allowed to tender for any work to be done for or in connection with this board, or be received as surety for any contractor for any board. such work.

32. All contracts shall be made by tender advertised not less than twice in two of the Melbourne papers; each tender shall be deposited in the tender box, addressed to the chairman, and such tender or tenders only be opened at the time of their consideration by the board; the respective amounts, together with the names of the parties tendering, to be entered in every case on the minutes of the board; and when tenders are accepted a contract bond shall be entered into, signed by the contractor and his surety or sureties, and by the chairman of the board, or, in his absence, by the chairman of the meeting at which such tender is accepted, the seal of the board being attached thereto, and the expense of preparing such bond shall in all cases be borne by the person or persons giving the same.
