WHEREAS by a Proclamation bearing date the second day of February, in the present year, it was amongst other things declared and appointed that a Court of General Sessions of the Peace should be holden in and for the district of Buninyong and Ballaarat, including counties and parts of counties therein described: And whereas it is expedient to alter the said district and the limits thereof, and to appoint that the Court of General Sessions for Buninyong and Ballaarat shall be holden in and for the places and districts hereinafter described and defined: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, by virtue of the powers vested in me in that behalf,

do alter the said district, and I do hereby appoint the portions of the said colony in and for which the said Court of General Sessions of Buninyong and Ballaarat shall have jurisdiction, and the limits thereof, as hereinafter mentioned, that is to say:—

WHEREAS the 30th section of 18 Victoria No. 15 empowers municipal councils to impose a rate not to exceed two shillings in the pound upon all houses and lands within their respective municipalities, according to the fair average annual value: Be it, and it is hereby therefore enacted by the municipal council of Beechworth, that a rate for the current municipal year of One shilling in the pound on the revised annual value of all rateable property within the limits of the Beechworth municipal district be imposed and levied, and be due and payable, in equal portions, upon the 10th day of April and the 10th day of July respectively, in 1857.

MUNICIPALITY OF EMERALD HILL.

BYE-LAW No. 12.—A BYE-LAW FOR THE REGULATION OF WATER CARRIERS WITHIN THE MUNICIPAL DISTRICT OF EMERALD HILL.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of Victoria, 18 Victoria No. 15, intitled, "An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria," it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be competent for the council of any municipal district established under the provisions of the said Act to make bye-laws for the regulation and licensing of carters, water drawers and public vehicles; and whereas by a Proclamation of His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, dated the 26th day of May, 1855, the district of Emerald Hill was duly established a municipal district under the provisions and within the meaning of the said Act; and whereas it is expedient to make a bye-law for the regulation of water carriers within the municipal district of Emerald Hill: Be it therefore ordered and directed by the municipal council for the district of Emerald Hill that from and after the date of this bye-law receiving the assent of His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, as required by the provisions of the said Act, every water drawer for hire shall keep his cart or dray loaded with water from sunset to sunrise, and on neglect thereof he shall forfeit and pay for every such offence a sum not exceeding Forty shillings.

Every water drawer for hire, when called upon to attend a fire by a constable or fireman, shall, on neglect or refusal of the same, forfeit and pay for every such offence a sum not exceeding Forty shillings.

Every regular or occasional water drawer for hire shall have his designation as such painted in white on black ground, or in black on white ground, over his door or other conspicuous part of his dwelling, and his name and address legibly painted and affixed to each water cart in some conspicuous part thereof, and on neglect thereof he shall forfeit and pay a sum not exceeding Twenty shillings.

The foregoing Bye-law, No. 12, made by the municipal council of Emerald Hill, has been assented to by His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council. Gazetted on the 9th day of April, 1857, pursuant to 18 Victoria No. 15, sec. 33.

MUNICIPALITY OF ST. KILDA.

BYE-LAW No. 1.—TO REGULATE, BY MEANS OF STANDING ORDERS, THE PROCEEDINGS OF THE MUNICIPAL COUNCIL OF ST. KILDA.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of Victoria, 18 Victoria No. 15, intitled "An Act for the Establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria," section 26, it is enacted that it shall be competent for the Council of any municipal district to make bye-laws for the regulation of their own proceedings, such

bye-laws to have force and effect under the thirty-third section of the said Act, provided the assent of the Governor of the said colony having been obtained thereto under his hand: And whereas by a Proclamation of His Excellency the Governor in chief of the said colony, dated the 12th day of February, 1857, the district of St. Kilda was duly established a municipal district: Be it therefore ordered and directed by the municipal council of St. Kilda that from and after the date of this bye-law receiving the assent of His Excellency the Governor in Chief of Victoria, the proceedings and business of the said council shall be conducted according to the following regulations only, which shall be called the Standing Orders of the said council, that is to say:—

CHAP. I.—Order of Proceedings.

1. The sittings of the council shall be open to the public, but a majority of the council may require the expulsion of strangers during the discussion of any particular question.

2. The chairman or any three councillors shall have power to call a special meeting of the council by written instructions to the town clerk, provided that the notice be given two clear days before such meeting shall be held, and at all meetings of the council the business shall commence as soon as the legal quorum is present; but if at the expiration of thirty minutes after the appointed hour of meeting there should not be a quorum present, no business shall be transacted at such meeting, but a note of the circumstance (with the names of the members present) shall be entered in the minute book.

3. The first business at each meeting of the council shall be to confirm the minutes of the preceding meeting, and no discussion shall take place thereupon except as to the accuracy thereof.

4. At all meetings of the council, the reading of correspondence unconnected with the orders of the day, the presentation of petitions and bringing up of reports of committees shall have precedence of all motions.

5. Every communication addressed to the council shall be in proper form, and presented by one of its members, who shall be responsible for its being respectfully worded.

6. On the presentation of a petition, memorial, or other similar communication, no debate shall take place thereon until notice has been given in the usual manner, and the only questions that shall be entertained on the occasion of its presentation shall be that it be received, and if necessary that it be referred to a committee.

7. The orders of the day shall include all matters arising out of the proceedings of former meetings of the council, and any business which the chairman may think fit to bring under consideration; any member may however, bring forward such business as he may consider advisable in the form of a notice of motion, such notice to be given at the meeting previous to that at which the same is to be taken into consideration—all such notices of motion to be considered in the order in which they shall have been given.

8. No report of a committee shall be considered or adopted on its presentation, unless notice thereof shall have been sent to each councillor, and posted in the town clerk's office at least three clear days previously.

9. No motion entered on the notice paper shall be proceeded with unless the member who has given such notice, or some one authorised by him, be present when the business is called in order. Notices not so proceeded with shall be struck out of the paper.

10. No bye-law shall be finally adopted at the meeting at which it shall be first proposed, nor until the next meeting of council, and every such bye-law shall, in the interim, remain open for the inspection of any of the ratepayers, in the town clerk's office, free of charge.

CHAP. II.—Order of Debate.

11. Any member, when proposing a motion or amendment, or discussing any matter, must rise and address the chairman, and no member shall be interrupted, unless by a call to order, when he shall sit down; the member calling to order shall then be heard upon such point of order, and the question decided before the subject is resumed or any other business entered upon.

12. Any member desirous of proposing either an original motion or an amendment, must state the nature of such motion or amendment before addressing the council in support thereof.

13. No question once brought before the council shall be withdrawn without leave of the council, nor shall any motion be entertained by the council until the same be seconded.

14. If more than one councillor rise at the same time, the chairman for the time being shall decide which is entitled to pre-audience.

15. No councillor shall speak twice on the same question, unless by way of explanation merely, or in reply as the mover of an original motion, or upon any amendment; and after such explanation or reply the question shall be forthwith put to the vote, but councillors merely seconding any motion shall not be held to have spoken upon it.

16. No councillor shall digress from the subject under discussion or impute motives, and all personal reflections shall be considered highly disorderly.

17. The presiding chairman's decision shall be final in all questions of order or practice, and he shall state the same without comment or argument.

18. The presiding chairman shall rise when addressing the council.

19. Any councillor who shall use expressions capable of being offensively applied to any other councillor, shall, if required by the chairman, withdraw such expressions to the satisfaction of the council, under a penalty of not more than Ten pounds.

20. Any councillor may require the clerk to the council to take down any particular expressions immediately on their being used.

21. Any councillor may of right demand the production of any documents of the council bearing on the question under discussion.

22. Only one amendment shall be discussed at one time, and upon the adoption of any amendment the original motion shall be deemed rejected, and the amendment so carried shall be acted upon as an original motion.

23. The chairman shall, in taking the sense of the council, put the question first in the affirmative, then in the negative, and the votes of all councillors (if a division be called for) shall be entered in the minutes.

24. The council shall vote by show of hands, except in cases of elections. (See Chap. 4, par. 2.)

25. No discussion shall be allowed on any motion for adjournment, but if the question be decided in the negative, the motion then under discussion, or the next motion or order of the day shall be considered before the question of adjournment shall be again entertained; but if the motion of adjournment be carried, any business left undisposed of shall have precedence at the next meeting of the council.

26. Any councillor may record his protest against any decision of the council, provided the same be made before the next meeting of the council (in writing), and be couched in respectful language; notice of such intention, however, must be given on the adoption of the resolution.

27. No motion, the effect of which would be to rescind any previous resolution of the council, shall be entertained during the same municipal year, unless a call of the whole council be duly made for the purpose.

CHAP. III.—Committees.

28. There shall be three permanent committees of the council, to be called the public works committee, the finance and rate committee, and the legislative committee, which shall be chosen annually at the meeting of council next after the annual election of chairman. The public works committee shall consist of four members, the other committees shall consist of three members each; three to be a quorum at the public works committee, and two to form a quorum at the other committees, provided, nevertheless, that the council shall be at liberty at any time to fill up occasional vacancies.

29. The town clerk shall convene every committee within seven days of its first appointment, and at any time by order of the council, or the written order of the chairman, or of any two members of such committee.

30. The chairman, if appointed a member of any of the permanent committees, shall be chairman thereof; in committees of which the chairman is not a member, the committee shall elect a chairman. When special committees are appointed, the member proposing such committee shall be the chairman thereof.

31. The standing orders of the council shall be observed in committees of the whole council, except the rule limiting the number of times of speaking.

32. The finance committee shall be at liberty, without the express authority of the council, to authorize disbursements for current expenses to an amount not exceeding Twenty pounds in any one week, and shall report the same to the council at its next sitting.

33. The chairmen of committees shall have their reports fairly written out by the clerk to the council on paper of uniform size provided by the council, so as to admit of their being bound up at convenient intervals.

CHAP. IV.—Elections.

34. No election to any office at the disposal of the council shall take place until four clear days notice shall have been given in at least two or more newspapers published in Melbourne or the vicinity, inviting applications for the same; and the salary of such office shall in all cases be fixed before proceeding to the election.

35. At all such elections the voting shall be (except at that of chairman of the council) on cards or paper, to be provided for the purpose, on which the voter shall write the name of the candidate he supports.

36. No councillor shall have any direct pecuniary interest (except as shareholder of any public company) in any contract or other work in connection with the council, nor shall be received as surety for any officer; nor shall any auditor or other officer become security for any other employé of the council, or for any work to be done for the council, and in all cases where security shall be required, the expense of preparing the same shall be borne by the party giving the same.

CHAP. V.—Miscellaneous Regulations.

37. For the consideration of any bye-law or for the raising or appropriating of money, or for the objects contemplated in Standing Order No. 27, it shall be competent for any member, without previous notice, to move for a call of the whole council for the consideration of any such subject at the next or any

subsequent meeting; and upon such motion being carried, due notice thereof shall be given in the notice paper for the day when the order of the day or notice of motion for which such call is made is set down for consideration, and any member not in attendance when such order of the day or notice of motion comes under consideration, or not in attendance at the voting upon such question or any amendment thereof, whether of adjournment or otherwise, shall be liable to a penalty of not more than One pound, unless reasonable cause for such absence be shown to the satisfaction of the council.

38. The clerk to the council shall have charge of the common seal of the corporation and shall be responsible for the same, and shall verify each impression by his signature, and shall not affix the same to any document without the order of a majority of the council.

39. All plans and specifications for the formation of any street or portion thereof shall be laid before the council at least six days prior to the same being considered and ordered upon, and be open for inspection by any ratepayer during that time.

40. Any one or more of the Standing Orders may be suspended *pro tem.* in case of emergency, with the consent of a majority of the council.
